### Reading II: 1 Thessalonians 5: 1-6

Thessalonica was a thriving port city. St. Paul reflects on the implications of the Day of the Lord for those alive at that time.

### The Gospel: Matthew 25: 14-30, or 25:14-15, 19-21

The lesson here is the lifestyle a Christian should lead in this interim before Christ returns in glory, which includes a responsible use of the world's goods.







Sanctuary candle: A sanctuary candle burns in our church to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to have the sanctuary candle in the church burn for a full week in memory of a loved one, please contact the parish office. Suggested offering: \$10.

Bread and Wine: In the early Church it was customary for the People of God to provide the bread and wine to be used at the Celebration of the Eucharist. The suggested offering: \$25.
