Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time September 10, 2017

Our readings today challenge us about sin, about how we are to help our brothers and sisters confront the sins they have in their lives, about how we are to help them through a process of reconciliation. In seminary, we were encouraged to help our brother seminarians deal with any problems or issues with which they were struggling. Well, I remember once when a fellow seminarian started skipping mass for no apparent reason; I spoke to him about this. Boy, did he get angry - really angry. He barked back at me: "How dare you talk to me that way. Who do you think you are? My guardian? My watchdog? Mind your own business." I responded to him that as a brother seminarian, I felt that it was my duty and responsibility to point this out to him, to help him along his journey of faith in that way. I told him that I wasn't doing this to be mean or judgmental; I was trying to help along on his journey in trying to discern his vocation to the priesthood. Obviously, he did not have the same perspective. It's interesting that this seminarian asked me if I thought I was his watchdog, because in a way I was. We hear the Lord tells the prophet Ezekiel that he is a watchman, a lookout, and a sentinel, that he is to warn the people of the ways they've strayed, to call them out for their wickedness and to bring them back to the faith. The Lord tells Ezekiel that it is his responsibility to give them warning. And Ezekiel will be held responsible if he does not fulfill this role. Yet, we are not to be a watchman out of arrogance or self-righteousness. We do not do this out of a desire to make ourselves look good or to boost our own egos like the Pharisees did. We are to do so out of love and compassion. No doubt, this is a difficult task, a tough aspect of our journey of faith. Yet, if we truly proclaim God's kingdom here on earth, this is what we're called to do.





TREASURES FROM OUR TRADI-**TION**

On Good Friday, at the heart of the Triduum, the commemoration of the Lord's Passion HOLY CROSS is colored by sobriety and deco-© J. S. Paluch Co., Inc. rum, but this Thursday the mystery comes in a luminous celebration of

Christ's victory. In its deepest origins, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is the feast of a dedication of a church, since in the year 335 the Church of the Holy Sepulchre was dedicated on September 13, and on the following day the "true cross" discovered by St. Helena was brought outside to the faithful for veneration. It is a great feast of the Eastern Church, which often marks it by having the whole assembly prostrate themselves on the floor honoring the life-giving cross.

At the core of the tradition is the guest of Helena, mother of the Emperor Constantine, to acquire the cross and the nails of the Crucifixion from the ruins of Jerusalem. When she was satisfied that she had found them. thanks to the healing of a sick man whose body was placed on the cross, she had her son fund the building of the great basilica. The history of the relic is complicated, especially because it was carried off by invading Persians in the year 614 and "went missing" for fifteen years. Thursday's feast does not celebrate the relic, but rather the life-giving cross from which salvation flows. It's a good day to look around your house or office: Don't those walls look bare without a cross? What better day to remedy that?






