Feast of the Epiphany January 7, 2018

Reflection for the Feast of the Epiphany

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany, one of the high points of our Christmas season. Our English word "epiphany" comes from the Greek word "epiphaneia", which means "appearing" or "revealing" or "manifesting." Today, on Epiphany, and during the entire Christmas season, we focus on how God manifested himself in Jesus, his divine Son.

We celebrate Epiphany in the visit of the kings or the Magi as they traveled from afar to honor the Christ child and to bring him gifts. I have always loved the story of the three kings. I guess I've always dreamed about going to faraway lands and I had a great sense of adventure as a child, so the story of the three kings really appealed to my imagination and my adventurous spirit. There is that wonderful image of the star of Bethlehem leading the Magi to the place where they can find the baby Jesus. As we think about the star of Bethlehem that guided them to their destination, we realize that we all follow something in life, don't we? We might not even be aware of what is pointing us in the direction we are going.

The other thing that strikes me about today's Gospel is that the chief priests and the scribes close their hearts to the surprising ways God's revelation can show up in our lives. Sometimes we expect to see God in a certain way, sometimes we expect our journey of faith to go down a certain road, but oftenGod leads us down a road less traveled or down a road with struggles and challenges. God can speak to us in the human world and in the non-human world, too. I know a lot of us see God in nature. Remember, God spoke to the Magi through a dream and through a star. There are many ways God is speaking to us today, but sometimes we don't pay attention or listen to him.



Course Description: This course uses the highly engaging and understandable text *An Introduction to Christology In the Gospels and Early Church* by Gerard H. Luttenberger, a religious priest. The author's unique approach reflects his conviction that Christology is not a topic to be studied but rather a process in which to be involved personally. Specifically, he defines Christology as "the process of interpreting one's faithexperience of God, alive for us in and through Jesus, the Christ." This process develops through consideration of two questions: "Who do people say that I am?" and then the ultimate question facing each individual, "Who do you say that I am?"

Course Text: An Introduction to Christology In the Gospels and Early Church by Gerard H. Luttenberger (can be purchase – new, used, or Kindle edition – from Amazon)

This course can be taken by catechists for credit towards Level II Diocesan Certification or can be taken by persons simply wanting to grow in their knowledge of the Catholic faith. All are welcome to join!



ers to attend this event, as we pray together with many people throughout our state. Our youth and their families are especially encouraged to attend, as our youth group will be attending as one of their activities.




BOOK DISCUSSION GROUPS

Register for Catholic Day at the Capitol 2018 Today!

The 2018 Mississippi Legislative Session will get underway on January 2, and Catholic Charities Jackson's Office of Parish Social Ministry's Catholic Faith In Action Team is collaborating with Catholic Charities in the Diocese of Biloxi in preparation for the Annual Catholic Day at the Capitol on Wednesday, January 17, 2018. The day will begin at the St. Peter Cathedral Center.

This year we will focus on the broken Mental Health Care system in Mississippi and the urgent need to enact legislation that will bring about needed change. Mississippi is currently facing a lawsuit for its lack of compliance with the 2009 Olmstead Supreme Court ruling which required states "to provide community-based treatment for persons with mental disabilities when... such placement is appropriate."



Angela Ladner is the Executive Director of the Mississippi Psychiatric
Association, a statewide medical specialty organization whose physician
members specialize in the diagnosis, treatment and prevention of mental illnesses, including substance use disorders. Angela has persistently lobbied Mississippi lawmakers
to make the necessary changes that will allow for more community-based treatment options

Angela will give the keynote address and moderate a panel of speakers on various topics related to mental

health, its diagnosis and treatment, and the current mental health care crisis the State of Mississippi is facing.



Dr. Joy Hogge is the Executive Director of Mississippi Families as Allies, the only statewide organization run by and for families of children with mental health challenges in Mississippi. Along with Angela, Joy has been an energetic advocate of the importance of a responsive and consumer and family driven system of care for mental health. Joy will speak after lunch about practical ways we can advocate with consumers of services and their families to ensure our system is responsive to them and the needs they identify.

After lunch participants will walk to the Mississippi Capitol Building's South

Afterwards there will be an opportunity to observe the session in the House of Representatives, to tour the Capitol Building, or to meet with individual Legislators.
