Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time—October 21, 2018

Reflection for the month of October - Respect Life Month

In 1519, when Hernan Cortés invades Mexico and conquered the Aztec Empire. Christianity arrived there around the same time. Not many years later, in 1531, the Mother of God appeared to St. Juan Diego as a pregnant native woman, now known to the faithful as Our Lady of Guadalupe. As a sign of her identity as the Mother of our Lord, Mary gave Juan Diego roses in his cloak, with the message for the bishop to build a church where people could receive her Son. The bishop was skeptical of Juan Diego and his message. When Juan Diego's unfurled his cloak to deliver the roses to the Bishop, an image of our Lord miraculously appear on the cloak, one that has survived throughout the centuries. The Bishop obeyed the instructions to build a chapel. In the successive years, millions of indigenous people would embrace the Christian faith. They also developed a profound devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Today, even though we claim to be a Christian people, we see the dignity of human life being degraded and disrespected. The unborn are destroyed by abortion. Our society is embracing recreational drug use as a way to escape reality. Income equality is leaving many people in poverty. Adequate health care and a quality education are beyond the means of many. Euthanasia and assisted suicide are seen a way to escape suffering. Many of the elderly are forgotten by society. How do we respond to this reality? We Christians believe that we are created in God's image. Nothing can take away the dignity of each human being, the way each person is cherished by God.

God creates us for union with him, for a loving relationship with him. Rather than being messengers of hatred and division, we are called to be messengers of God's love, of the Gospel of Life. Just as Our Lady of Guadalupe introduced many people in Mexico and the rest of the Americas to her son, to the culture of the Christian faith, we also are called to rebuild a culture in our society that respects all human life. Our Lady of Guadalupe has become a symbol for Respect Life Month and for the message of the Gospel of Life that is intrinsic to our Catholic faith. Like St Juan Diego, let us respond to the mission to which we are called: to bring the Gospel of life to our little corner of the world.
