November 10, 2019**

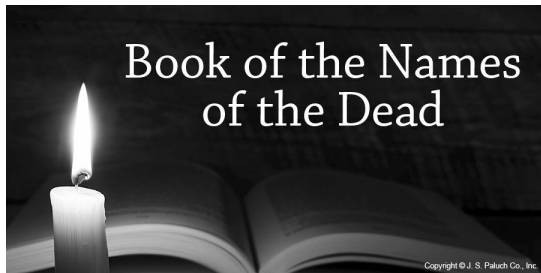
