





**Feast of the Baptism of the Lord
Sunday, January 9, 2022**

It has been two weeks since we celebrated Christmas day, commemorating the birth of our Savior. Today, our Christmas season officially comes to an end with the celebration of the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the waters of the Jordan River. Our Christmas season has included different celebrations that has made Christ manifest in different ways in the world. We celebrated the Holy Family the first Sunday after Christmas. Then, we celebrated Mary, the Mother of God, as the Blessed Virgin pointed us to her Son and helped us understand his identity as fully human and fully divine. Last week, we celebrated the visit of the Magi to the Baby Jesus, as Gentiles from the East recognized the salvation that the light of Christ was bringing to all.

Today, as we focus on the Baptism of Jesus, as he begins his public ministry and his proclamation of God's kingdom. 

The number of Covid-19 cases and hospitalizations are on a steep rise again! The Omnicrom variant has proven to be a formidable opponent. The Centers for Disease Control and the Mississippi State Department of Health have recommended that all people (vaccinated and unvaccinated) wear masks when in public indoor spaces. They also recommend that

those over the age of 65 and with serious underlying health conditions avoid large indoor gatherings.

Due to these recent recommendation changes and the tremendous strain on our healthcare system, **Fr. Lincoln strongly encourages all parishioners (vaccinated and unvaccinated) to prayerfully consider wearing masks during the weekend Masses for a few weeks until the case and hospitalization numbers begin to fall again.** This is not a mandate and parishioners without masks will not be turned away from Mass. It is, however, a way to mitigate the risk for all parishioners.

Those not comfortable coming to the weekend Masses due to the size of the crowds can come to the daily Masses, which have fewer people in attendance. The dispensation that allows attending a daily Mass to meet the Sunday Mass obligation remains in place.

Also, please remember that receiving communion in the hand is still the norm. If you feel that you need to receive communion directly on the tongue, please wait until everyone on your side has received in the hand and then come at the very end at the line. The Eucharistic minister will sanitize afterwards. This is done to keep everyone safe.

Please remember in your prayers all that are affected by Covid --- those that are now sick, those that have died, the healthcare professionals, and those that suffer from the long-term effects. Pray, also, for protection, wisdom, and guidance for all.
