"The days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Luke 21: 5-19

#### A lasting gift from a 'terrific club'

In the immediate aftermath of 9/11, no place outside of New York City itself endured greater loss than the small town of Hoboken, New Jersey. Fifty-three people from Hoboken – a town of about a square mile – perished in the attack on the World Trade Towers. The smell of black smoke from the city filled Hoboken for days; from the Pier A Park, people could see the devastation across the river. Everyone knew someone who had lost a husband or wife, a son or daughter, a brother or sister in the towers.

One place where people sought refuge was the lovely old Trinity Church. The small Episcopal Church stayed open day and night. There were prayers offered every evening until the final death toll was known. Trinity became a place for families struggling with their grief to come together. A small chapel off the main sanctuary became their gathering space, where they displayed photos of their dead, lighted candles in their memory, and talked. At first it was a mix of pain and practicality – how to cope with their grief, who could babysit. Soon it evolved into a delicate exploration of hopelessness and hope, of faith and spirit. They supported and helped one another deal with the dark days, the grief that would dissipate and the tentative beginning of new lives and relationships. It was, they said, a terrific club with a horrible admission charge.

Three years after 9/11, as to be expected, the members of the "club" moved on. But they wanted to do something for the little church that had been their refuge. The old stone church has a small bell tower that has been without a bell for years — an empty space in the church, as intimate as their grief had been vast. At the suggestion of the rector, the group of families donated \$14,000 to cast a small bronze bell, 24 inches wide and 240 pounds.

On September 11, 2005, the bell was rung from the Trinity tower for the first time. It tolls every September 11, and in between it tolls for worship, weddings and funerals, to announce times of great joy and great sorrow. The group's gift will last beyond their grief and the church's gift to them.

In the horrible aftermath of 9/11, the Trinity Church families have a special appreciation for the fragileness of life. In their painful loss, they have come to treasure the lasting and most precious thing of life, represented by their gift of a bell. Their experience and their bell teach us that the time we are given in this life is precious, that God gives us this gift of life to embrace and be embraced by the love that is uniquely of God. Jesus calls us not to be obsessed with the "stones" that will one day collapse and become dust but to

seek instead the lasting things of the soul, the things of God. May love that never ends, compassion that never fades, forgiveness that never falters be the focus of our journey to the eternal dwelling place of God.
