Jesus was transfigured before Peter, James and John; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light... From the cloud came a voice that said: "this is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." Matthew 17: 1-9

Father and Sons

The nurse escorted a tired, anxious young man to the bedside of an elderly patient. "Your son is here," the nurse whispered into the ear of the dying man. She had to repeat the words several times before his tired eyes opened. He was heavily sedated and he struggled to breathe through the oxygen clip. He could barely see the young man standing beside his bed; he simply reached out his hand and the young man tightly wrapped his fingers around it, squeezing it with tenderness and assurance. The nurse brought a chair for the young man. For the rest of the night he sat by the old man's bed, holding his hand and gently stroking his forehead. The old man said nothing.

As dawn broke, the old man died. The young man gently released the lifeless hand he had been holding all night and went to notify the nurse. The young man waited until the nurse

completed the necessary tasks. The nurse began to offer the young man her condolences, but he interrupted her.

"Who was that man?" he asked the nurse. The startled nurse said, "I thought he was your father." "No, he wasn't. I never saw him before." "Then why didn't you say something when I took you to him?" The young man said quietly, "I knew he needed his son, and obviously his son wasn't

here. My own father just died, and I understand what he and his son must have been going through. When I realized he was too sick to tell whether or not I was his son, I knew how much he needed me."

The lesson of the Transfiguration is that there exists within each one of us the spirit of God to become the person God calls us to be. It is the same spirit, that same "divinity," that Peter, James and John behold in Jesus on the mount of the Transfiguration. That presence of the sacred that exists within Jesus can shine through us, as well, even when we do not notice.

To be "born in the Spirit" is to see things with the eyes of God, to honor what God honors, to love as God loves us. The kingdom of God that Jesus speaks of in the Gospel transcends boundaries and labels, stereotypes and traditions, the color of flags and the color of skin. In God's eyes, we are all his children; in God's heart, we are all brothers and sisters to one another. The young man has embraced that vision of God, a vision that enables him to be a "son" to the dying man. This Lent may the eyes of our own hearts be refocused not on the things of ourselves but on the things of God: may we be "reborn" in the "spirit" of God that moves us to transform pain, despair and injustice into healing hope and compassion.
