

### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF THE PROPHET ISAIAH

this way, what sort of persons ought  
you to be, conducting yourselves in

elements melted by fire. But accord-  
ing to his promise we await new heav-  
ens and a new earth in which right-  
eousness dwells. Therefore, beloved,

since you await these things, be eager  
to be found without spot or blemish  
before him, at peace. **The Word of the


Please, continue on
