

FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

"Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits...' Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them.' So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them."

We can picture Jesus calling then sending His chosen ones to begin their mission. They listened to His instruction and then acted upon it. preaching, healing, continuing the work and mission of Jesus. They responded to His call and accepted their responsibility.

The Synod is similar to this scene. Delegates called to listening sessions, invoking the Holy Spirit, leading the church where the Lord wants us to go. Are we willing today to welcome this work of the Lord and listen to what the Spirit is calling us to do? The role of the prophet Amos or as Paul describes we who have been chosen 'so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who have hoped in Christ.

A BRIEF SYNOPSIS OF THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Amos 7:12-15

Amaziah (priest of Bethel) ordered Amos to leave Bethel and never prophesy there again. Amos replied that he had not been a prophet, but was a shepherd until he was called by God.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:3-14 or 1:3-10 Paul exults God's immeasurable generosity as he recounts all the blessings that have been bestowed upon all God's people. We all became adopted children of God when we heard the message of truth Christ brought to us, and because of it, believed in him.

Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

Jesus gave the twelve disciples authority over unclean spirits and sent them out to preach and heal the sick. He advised them to bring nothing with them and to shake the dust from their feet of any town where they had not been welcomed. Jesus wanted them to understand what they would need to do in his place after his death.




What is so unique about this group? The Hopatcong's group is <u>42 years old</u> and was started at Saint Jude Church when Father Ryan was the Pastor.

Using NFP Effectively

Session One of NFP 2.0 offers specific ways a married couple can achieve high efficacy using Natural Family Planning. It includes a discussion about important technical considerations when using a method as well as how our marital partnership impacts efficacy.





NFP Doesn't Work For My Body

Session Two focuses on the hormonal imbalances charting with Natural Family Planning can reveal. A description of several types of imbalances are discussed along with possible lifestyle and medical options to help. The session wraps up by considering ways to approach challenges as a mutually supportive, loving partnership.





Managing Different Desires

Natural Family Planning intensifies the challenge of differing levels of desire between a husband and wife. The conversation in this session is wide-ranging and includes basic physiological differences between the spouses, medical obstacles, disillusionment about sexual ideals when love demands sacrifice, and suggestions to consider to create more unity and joy.





Unplanned Pregnancies + Growing Attachment

Session Four lays out suggested groundwork for couples who want to develop the strength to weather any challeng well, including an unplanned pregnancy. Expanding on the Marriage Castle analogy from Session Three, listeners can reflect on attachment, the marital friendship, and rightly ordered sexual union. The challenge of an unplanned pregnancy is discussed, including both best practices and things to avoid.






News around the Diocese



- 1. Anyone baptized in the Roman Catholic faith who wishes to become a Member of Saint Jude in Hopatcong is asked to come to the parish office for registration.
- 2. Certificate of Good Standing for Godparents or Confirmation Witnesses stating that a given person is a believer and practicing Catholic will be issued at the parish office after three months of belonging to the parish community and fulfilling the obligations towards the parish.
- 3. All Catholics in our parish are obliged to participate in Sunday and holiday Masses and support our parish by making donations to the church using the envelopes received by mail.
- 4. Any person 25 years old and older need to be registered under their own name to get the status of a parishioner of Saint Jude regardless of whether he lives with his parents or alone.
- 5. Families who have changed their address are asked to inform the parish office in order to update their address details.


