2025 Annual Stewardship Report

As we continue our “Maintaining Our Dream” appeal, my heart is filled with gratitude for the spirit of generosity and commitment that defines our parish community. The transition to ParishSOFT Giving represents more than just a change in how we give; it’s a reflection of our willingness to embrace innovation and strengthen our shared faith.

I often reflect on what it truly means to be Catholic – and it always returns to the Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith. How we celebrate the Mass, with its reverence for the Holy Eucharist, speaks volumes about who we are as a Church, echoing the wisdom of the Second Vatican Council. It’s a beautiful tradition, one that deserves our full attention and joyful participation.

We recognize that parish operating expenses are rising, requiring us to seek continued support. Even a modest increase of \$10 or \$20 per week – a simple offering – would make a profound difference as we work to sustain our beloved buildings, invest in our future, and, most importantly, nurture the incredible array of ministries that bring Christ to life within our community.

Consider the joy of our Children’s Religious Formation program, reaching nearly 200 young hearts and minds. Or the growth and reflection fostered within “Living the Mystery,” our class for teens seeking to deepen their relationship with Christ. The commitment of the Children’s Liturgy of the Word, providing a level-appropriate entry into faith for our children. The transformative journey offered through the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, welcoming new members to the Church. The compassionate support provided by the St. Vincent de Paul Society, addressing the needs of our neighbors. The brotherhood and service offered by the Knights of Columbus, fostering charity and fraternity. The spiritual growth nurtured within “Walking with Purpose,” empowering women to live out their faith. The insightful reflection of “Fulfilled in Your Hearing Bible Study,” opening the word of God for all to hear. The vibrant connection fostered within the Young Adult Ministry, building community and spiritual growth. The uplifting beauty of our Music Ministry, led by our dedicated choir. And the countless other efforts, like our Sacristy Linen Team and Candle Team, which contribute to the daily rhythm of our faith.

Thank you for your continued partnership as we strive to “Maintain Our Dream” – a dream rooted in Catholic tradition, focused on Christ, and fueled by the generous hearts of our parishioners. May the Lord give you His peace.

In our first reading, the prophet Habakkuk cries out in distress, seeing violence and injustice, yet God answers: “Write the vision; make it plain on tablets... the righteous shall live by their faith.” The passage reminds us that even when God seems silent, the vision has its time, fulfillment will come, and that faith, not sight, sustains the believer. St. Paul exhorts Timothy to rekindle the gift of God, reminding him that the Spirit gives power, love, and self-discipline, not cowardice. He urges steadfastness in sound teaching and faithful guarding of the treasure entrusted to him, with the Holy Spirit’s help. In the Gospel, the apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith; He answers that even a mustard seed of faith can move mountains. He then illustrates that the servant who does his duty without seeking thanks is the model of true discipleship, emphasizing humility and faithful obedience. We are all called to a deep, humble faith that trusts God’s promises, worships Him with sincere gratitude, nurtures the gifts of the Spirit, and serves without seeking reward. May we all seek to be humble servants in the Lord’s vineyard.

2025 Annual Stewardship Report

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is with deep gratitude that I share our Annual Report for the 2025 Fiscal Year. We are continually blessed by your unwavering faith and generous support, which are the bedrock of our parish's thriving spirit.

This year, your **Offertory Donations** formed the cornerstone of our success, totaling \$779,703. We are also deeply thankful for the thoughtful contributions of \$51,825 through **Qualified Charitable Distributions**, which provide a lasting legacy for our parish's ministry. Additionally, we appreciate income from our **Investments** (\$50,992) and vital contributions from **Religious Education Tuition** (\$34,563) and ministry-led **Fundraising Efforts** (\$24,107). Together, your generosity generated **\$991,177** in income for the 2025 fiscal year.

We've made strategic investments to support our parish's mission. A significant portion of our income has been dedicated to our dedicated **Parish Staff** (\$385,166) and the ongoing care of our spiritual home – our buildings – through **Building Maintenance** (\$163,994). We are particularly pleased to announce the completion of a much-needed renovation of the parish office, an **Operational Investment** of \$117,894, designed to improve efficiency and better serve our community. This investment was completely paid through the sale of 3 Lord Place. We also recognize our responsibilities, including **Diocesan Assessments** (\$146,876), **Utilities** (\$95,683), and **Loan Interest Fees** (\$76,711).

While our total income for the year was **\$991,177**, our total expenses came to **\$1,064,858**. This reflects our commitment to long-term investment in our parish's future, ensuring we can continue to fulfill our mission.

Regarding our outstanding debts, we want to be transparent:

- The total amount owed to the Diocese of Trenton is \$1,412,239.00.
- The total amount owed to parishes is \$2,235,193.00.
- This brings the total loan debt to \$3,647,432.00.

We are actively working to reduce this debt through continued generosity and responsible stewardship. We also have \$623,354.00 in investment accounts, which generated \$50,992.00 in interest.

We invite you to partner with us in this endeavor through the **Maintaining Our Dream** appeal. Every contribution, big or small, helps us strengthen our financial foundation and move closer to our goal of sustainable stewardship.

To make giving easier and more secure, we are excited to launch a new online giving platform, **Parish Soft Giving**.

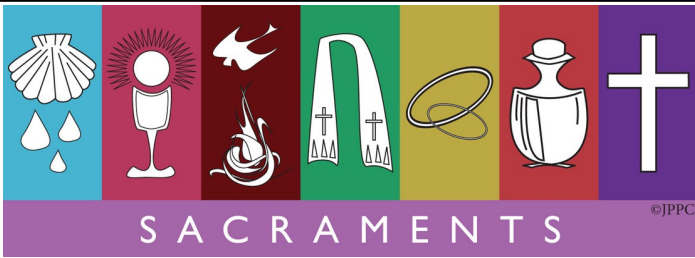

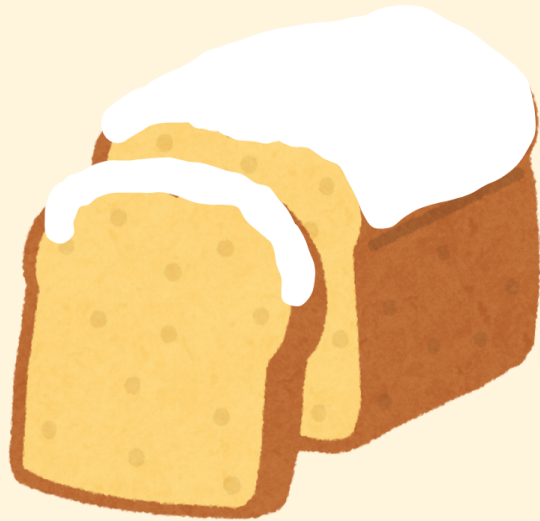
