# Maintaining Our Dream ~ Pastor's Letter

Wonderful news for the Church of St. Isaac Jogues! We've made incredible progress with our Maintaining Our Dream appeal, and we're excited to share the latest updates. Nearly 100 parishioners have already signed up for our new online giving platform, **ParishSOFT Giving!** We've made the transition incredibly simple: to cancel your old account, please visit [givesij.org/cancel](http://givesij.org/cancel). To sign up for the new system, visit [givesij.org](http://givesij.org). This streamlined system not only helps us manage our finances more efficiently – ensuring accurate reporting for annual statements – but also allows us to build a stronger financial foundation for the future. As you know, our appeal is also aimed at increasing weekly donations to help us meet rising costs, due to increased utility bills and building maintenance needs. **Even a small increase of \$10 or \$20 per week would make a significant difference in supporting our parish's ongoing needs.**

As we continue our **Maintaining Our Dream** appeal, it's crucial to understand the heart of our parish's mission. As you know, we've transitioned from a three-priest parish to a single-priest one. While this presented significant challenges, it's also fostered a remarkable spirit of unity and resilience. We've leveraged this opportunity to strengthen our administrative team, secure our buildings against the elements – literally fixing roofs and ensuring safety – and, most importantly, launch new ministries that reflect the diverse needs of our community. As the psalmist reminds us, "Unless the LORD build the house, they labor in vain who build" (Ps. 127). This isn't just a theological statement; it's a call to action – a recognition that our strength lies in God's grace and the collaborative efforts of our parishioners.

Last week, I met with Mrs. Terry Ginther, the Chancellor of our Diocese, to discuss revisioning our Parish Pastoral Council. Mrs. Ginther has decades of experience in this area and has agreed to help us strengthen and grow our Pastoral Council. The Pastoral Council plays a vital role in translating God's call to mission into concrete action. Members of the Pastoral Council represent a broad spectrum of our parish's demographics and experiences – ask the big questions: 'What does it mean to be a member of the Marlton community?' 'What is it like to raise a family here?' 'What are people saying about the Church of St. Isaac Jogues in schools or the workplace?' 'Where are the poor in our area?' 'Where are the Catholics in Marlton?' 'How many Catholics are coming to church?' 'How many non-Catholics are interested in becoming Catholic?' These questions aren't simply academic exercises. They are a commitment to understanding the needs of our neighbors, shaping our outreach efforts, and ensuring that our parish remains a beacon of hope and service in Marlton. The Council's work is a cornerstone of our mission, and we encourage you to prayerfully consider how you might contribute your time and talents to this important ministry.

And speaking of outreach, let's turn our attention to a practical resource that's making a tangible difference: our new clothing and shoe center, located in the rear parking lot next to Lord Place. Through the partnership with Clothing Bins USA, we're not just diverting textiles from landfills; we're actively supporting local charities. 50% of the monthly donation helps us to continue our work, while the other 50% will go to support the St. Vincent de Paul Society. As the weather turns cooler, we invite you to consider donating gently used clothing and shoes – a simple act that can have a profound impact on the lives of those in need. Remembering Jesus' invitation to 'clothe the naked and serve the poor' (Matthew 25:35), this initiative embodies the very heart of our faith.

Finally, I want to express my heartfelt gratitude for your support as I embark on a pilgrimage to Italy with approximately 50 parishioners, beginning Saturday, October 18 and returning on Monday, October 27. This journey will allow us to immerse ourselves in the heart of the Church – visiting historic sites and participating in Mass. Please join me in praying for our safe travels and for the continued strength of our parish as we seek inspiration and connection. Fr. Kevin Hrycenko from St. Mary of the Lakes Parish, and Fr. JM Patilla, from St. Joan of Arc Parish will be celebrating the weekend Masses during our absence. There will be no weekday Masses; Deacon John Scanlon will offer communion services instead. I will be celebrating Masses in various churches throughout the pilgrimage in Italy. These will be offered for our daily Mass intentions and parishioners. Thanks for your prayers. May the Lord give you His peace.

# 2025 Annual Stewardship Report

## Dear Friends in Christ,

It is with deep gratitude that I share our Annual Report for the 2025 Fiscal Year. We are continually blessed by your unwavering faith and generous support, which are the bedrock of our parish's thriving spirit.

This year, your **Offertory Donations** formed the cornerstone of our success, totaling \$779,703. We are also deeply thankful for the thoughtful contributions of \$51,825 through **Qualified Charitable Distributions**, which provide a lasting legacy for our parish's ministry. Additionally, we appreciate income from our **Investments** (\$50,992) and vital contributions from **Religious Education Tuition** (\$34,563) and ministry-led **Fundraising Efforts** (\$24,107). Together, your generosity generated **\$991,177** in income for the 2025 fiscal year.

We've made strategic investments to support our parish's mission. A significant portion of our income has been dedicated to our dedicated **Parish Staff** (\$385,166) and the ongoing care of our spiritual home – our buildings – through **Building Maintenance** (\$163,994). We are particularly pleased to announce the completion of a much-needed renovation of the parish office, an **Operational Investment** of \$117,894, designed to improve efficiency and better serve our community. This investment was completely paid through the sale of 3 Lord Place. We also recognize our responsibilities, including **Diocesan Assessments** (\$146,876), **Utilities** (\$95,683), and **Loan Interest Fees** (\$76,711).

While our total income for the year was **\$991,177**, our total expenses came to **\$1,064,858**. This reflects our commitment to long-term investment in our parish's future, ensuring we can continue to fulfill our mission.

### Regarding our outstanding debts, we want to be transparent:

- The total amount owed to the Diocese of Trenton is \$1,412,239.00.
- The total amount owed to parishes is \$2,235,193.00.
- This brings the total loan debt to \$3,647,432.00.

**We are actively working to reduce this debt through continued generosity and responsible stewardship.** We also have \$623,354.00 in investment accounts, which generated \$50,992.00 in interest.

**We invite you to partner with us in this endeavor through the *Maintaining Our Dream* appeal.** Every contribution, big or small, helps us strengthen our financial foundation and move closer to our goal of sustainable stewardship.

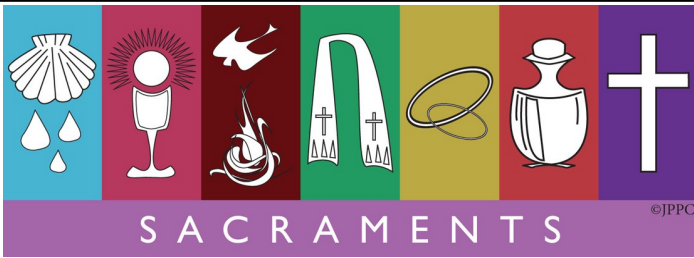

All are welcome to attend this weekly reflection on Sacred Scripture, led by Fr. Jim. Meetings are held in the Workroom (next to the Sacristy).



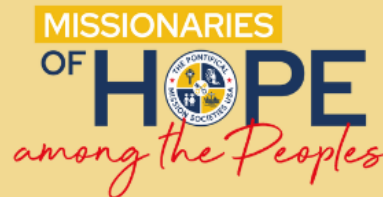
## St. Vincent de Paul Corner
