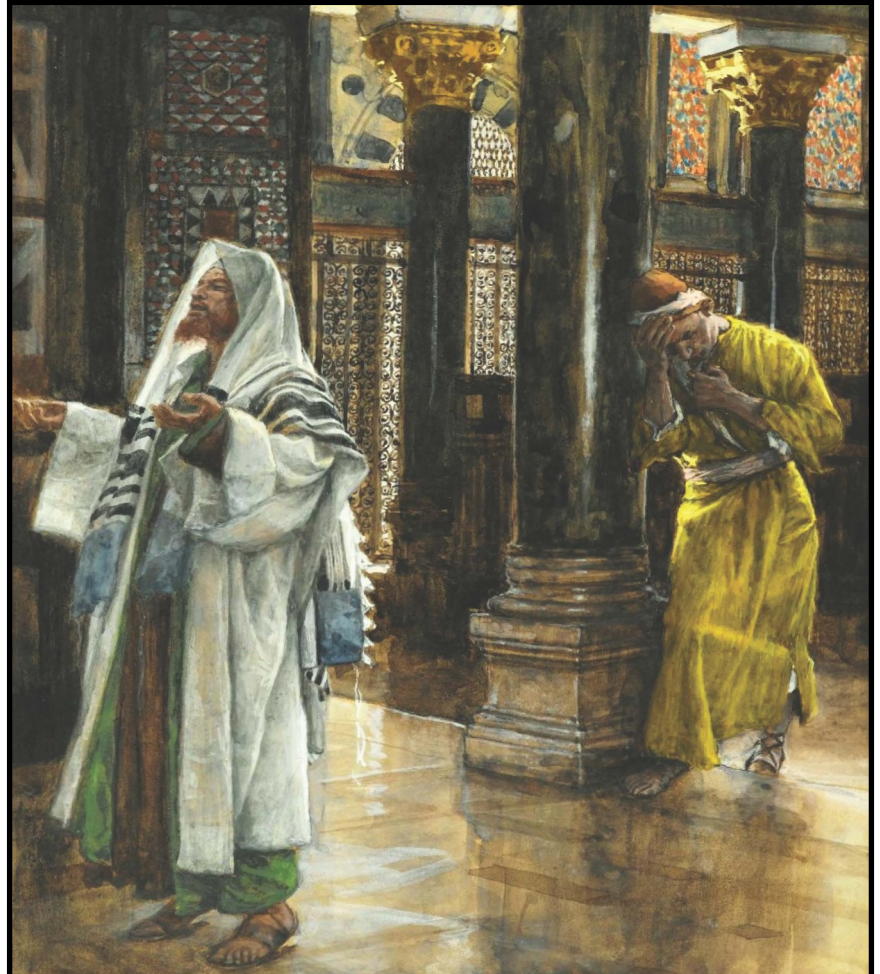

POWERFUL PRAYER TO SAINT MICHAEL

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host - by the Divine Power of God - cast into hell, satan and all the evil spirits, who roam throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.



May the Lord give you His peace. By now you probably know that I have enough “tech savvy” to produce my pastor’s letter while in Italy. All I would have to do is bring a laptop, right? Alas, I have decided to travel as light as possible and left my laptop home. We are on the road practically every day, arriving at a new hotel every other day. So, I hope you will forgive me for having prepared this letter in advance. I will, however, ask for your continued prayers for our group as we prepare to depart from Rome on Sunday. We should be arriving in Philadelphia sometime after 6PM. I intend to share all the wonderful details from our trip next week.

I want to thank our parish office staff for “holding down the fort” while we have been away. We are truly blessed to have some of the best people helping us carry out the mission of Jesus Christ at St. Isaac’s. This includes our many wonderful parishioners serving as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, and Ushers, as well as those serving in our many ministries.

Speaking of ministries, I mentioned previously that I met with Terry Ginther, the Chancellor of the Diocese of Trenton, to discuss how we might re-envision our Parish Pastoral Council. The Parish Pastoral Council is a consultative body established at the level of the parish to assist the pastor in discerning and planning pastoral activity. Its purpose is to foster genuine collaboration, promote the missionary zeal of the parish, and embody the Church’s spirituality of communion in which every member contributes to the building up of the Body of Christ. To that end, I will be inviting more people to get involved with our Parish Pastoral Council.

Years ago, we had several priests serving the parish; today, there is only one. I need help not only providing for the needs of our parishioners, but learning and discovering **how** we as a parish can best serve the community. The Pastoral Council is a way for the parish to better communicate with the pastor. I am reminded of the movie Short Circuit, where the robot, Johnny-5, was constantly saying, “Input! Input! Input! I need input!” We will hold a seminar for all those interested to learn more about the role of the Parish Pastoral Council in January, but I am planting the seeds now so that we might all pray together for an increase in members to be voices for the parish.

I always try to make myself as available as possible, especially after Masses, whether during the week or on Sundays. And I also welcome the opportunity to meet by appointment. I have already visited multiple homes to break bread in an effort to get to know everyone better. I like to bake my own bread, so I try to never come empty handed. The last family I gave bread to enjoyed it so much they said I should sell it. Who would have thought four ingredients (flour, water, yeast, and salt) would make people so happy? Wait a minute...it was Jesus! Why else would he have chosen bread and wine for the Eucharist? He knew that no two substances nourished people more throughout the ages than bread and wine. And meal times are some of the most important times we can share with one another.

Speaking of the Eucharist, our greatest prayer, today’s readings assure us that the Lord always hears our prayers. The Book of Sirach says, “The LORD is a God of justice, who knows no favorites.” In other words, the Lord does not ignore anyone. And our psalm says, “The Lord hears the cry of the poor.” St. Paul attests to the many trials he has undergone throughout his ministry and how the Lord was with him every step of the way. He says, “The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat and will bring me safe to his heavenly kingdom.” But, we ought to have the right disposition in prayer, which is humility, not hubris. Hubris is extreme or excessive pride or dangerous overconfidence and complacency. The Pharisee in the Gospel displays this hubris as he says, “O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity—greedy, dishonest, adulterous—or even like this tax collector.” He may of thought himself sinless, but was blinded by his own pride. Meanwhile, the tax collector, aware of his sinfulness was striking his own breast praying, “O God, be merciful to me a sinner.” St. Paul speaks of having run the race and competed well, but he did so in all humility, acknowledging his own faults before God and boasting of his own weaknesses. We are called to do the same. Jesus invites us, “Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves” (Mt. 11:29). Let us always approach the Lord with all humility so that as He hears our prayers He will fill us with His peace.

2025 Annual Stewardship Report

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is with deep gratitude that I share our Annual Report for the 2025 Fiscal Year. We are continually blessed by your unwavering faith and generous support, which are the bedrock of our parish's thriving spirit.

This year, your **Offertory Donations** formed the cornerstone of our success, totaling \$779,703. We are also deeply thankful for the thoughtful contributions of \$51,825 through **Qualified Charitable Distributions**, which provide a lasting legacy for our parish's ministry. Additionally, we appreciate income from our **Investments** (\$50,992) and vital contributions from **Religious Education Tuition** (\$34,563) and ministry-led **Fundraising Efforts** (\$24,107). Together, your generosity generated **\$991,177** in income for the 2025 fiscal year.

We've made strategic investments to support our parish's mission. A significant portion of our income has been dedicated to our dedicated **Parish Staff** (\$385,166) and the ongoing care of our spiritual home – our buildings – through **Building Maintenance** (\$163,994). We are particularly pleased to announce the completion of a much-needed renovation of the parish office, an **Operational Investment** of \$117,894, designed to improve efficiency and better serve our community. This investment was completely paid through the sale of 3 Lord Place. We also recognize our responsibilities, including **Diocesan Assessments** (\$146,876), **Utilities** (\$95,683), and **Loan Interest Fees** (\$76,711).

While our total income for the year was **\$991,177**, our total expenses came to **\$1,064,858**. This reflects our commitment to long-term investment in our parish's future, ensuring we can continue to fulfill our mission.

Regarding our outstanding debts, we want to be transparent:

- The total amount owed to the Diocese of Trenton is \$1,412,239.00.
- The total amount owed to parishes is \$2,235,193.00.
- This brings the total loan debt to \$3,647,432.00.

We are actively working to reduce this debt through continued generosity and responsible stewardship. We also have \$623,354.00 in investment accounts, which generated \$50,992.00 in interest.

We invite you to partner with us in this endeavor through the **Maintaining Our Dream** appeal. Every contribution, big or small, helps us strengthen our financial foundation and move closer to our goal of sustainable stewardship.

To make giving easier and more secure, we are excited to launch a new online giving platform, **Parish Soft Giving**.

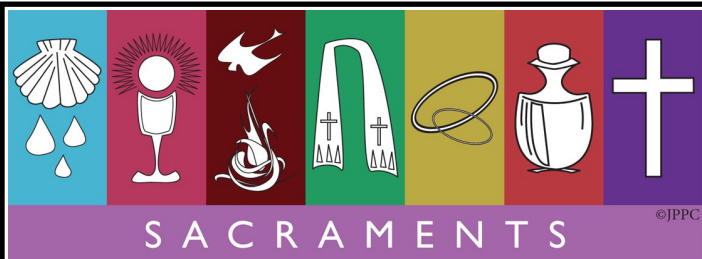

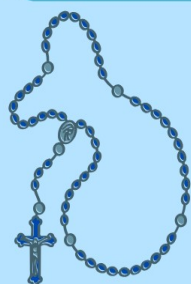
