POWERFUL PRAYER TO SAINT MICHAEL

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host - by the Divine Power of God - cast into hell, satan and all the evil spirits, who roam throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.



May the Lord give you His peace. This weekend we celebrate the Commemoration of All The Faithful Departed (All Souls Day). From the earliest days of the Church, people have remembered the souls of the faithful departed. Beginning with the early martyrs and extending to all the faithful, the Church developed an Office of the Dead, often prayed in early communities and monasteries. By the 12th century, the practice had spread throughout the Church, but it was not until the late 1800s when Pope Leo XIII decreed the last Sunday in September be a special commemoration of all Souls. After the revised Roman calendar was introduced in 1970, the date of November 2 was established as the official date for the Commemoration of All Souls. Since this Sunday is November 2, we celebrate the commemoration with added solemnity.

At the 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass, we are acknowledging the Souls of the faithful departed whose funerals were celebrated at St. Isaac's throughout the last year. Many of our parishioners have lost loved ones and we want them to know that we are there for them as part of their extended Christian family. To show our support, we are presenting the families with a handmade cross as a reminder of our regular prayers for the souls of the faithful departed. These crosses are engraved with the names of the deceased and hang in our Gathering Space where they are remembered by the members of our parish throughout the year. We hope that these crosses, along with our prayers, will bring consolation and support to all those who continue to grieve. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.

As you know, I recently returned from a pilgrimage to Italy. We visited Venice, Bologna, Firenze (Florence), Assisi, Orvieto, Rome, and the Vatican. There were 45 pilgrims on this journey and we visited some beautiful churches. Some of the highlights include the Basilica of San Marco in Venice, where we celebrated the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in the crypt below the relics of St. Mark. It was the first Mass we celebrated in Italy, and one of the most memorable. After Venice, we made our way to Bologna, where we visited a replica of the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher. The basilica was built to the exact specifications as the original in Jerusalem as a way to make it easier for pilgrims to visit the tomb of Jesus without having to make the trip all the way to the Holy Land—a trip that would have taken anywhere between 3 to 7 years to accomplish. I could feel Jesus' presence there in a most intimate way. There were several relics from the Holy Land in the church, including what is believed to be the actual pillar stone where Jesus was scourged.

We departed Bologna and made our way to Firenze (Florence). This was one of my favorite times in Italy. The food was amazing and the streets a little easier to navigate than Venice (I still managed to get lost though, haha). We celebrated Mass in the Capella della Pura inside the Basilica of Santa Maria Novella. This basilica was built atop the first chapel in Florence, a truly historic and remarkable site. After Florence, we made our way to Assisi and Orvieto. Visiting these two towns is practically like walking 800 years into the past. Much of the original architecture, walls, and roads remain. There is nothing like walking down the same road as St. Francis. While in Assisi, we visited the tomb of our first millennial Saint, Carlo Acutis, at the Church of Santa Maria Maggiore. Again, there was a powerful presence of the Spirit as people venerated his remains. It was a simple glass casket revealing him dressed like a teenager, but you had to bow down to see inside—a truly humbling experience.

In Orvieto, we visited the Duomo (in Italian "house") or Cathedral of Santa Maria Assunta. I felt particularly connected to this Church because the Trenton cathedral shares the same name: Cathedral of Saint Mary of the Assumption. In Orvieto, the Chapel of the Corporal was built to preserve the relic of the Sacred Altar Linen of the Miracle of Bolsena. According to Saint Carlo Acutis' website, "A German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at Bolsena while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He was pious, but he found it difficult to accept that Christ was actually present in the consecrated Host. While celebrating Holy Mass above the tomb of St. Christina (located in the church named for this martyr), he spoke the words of consecration and immediately Blood started to seep from the consecrated Host and trickle over his hands and onto the altar" (www.miracolieucaristici.org). This Precious Blood of Christ landed on the corporal (square linen the priest places on the altar before celebrating the Eucharist), which has been preserved ever since. It is paraded through the streets of Orvieto for adoration, particularly on the Feast of Corpus Christi. **cont. >>**

Lastly, we visited Rome and the Vatican. What can I say? After seeing all the beautiful architecture, paintings, and mosaics, I did not expect them to get any better until we entered the Vatican Museum and the Sistine Chapel, then St. Peter's Basilica. We were overwhelmed by the beauty and the majesty of such amazing works of art all in honor of our Blessed Lord and the Saints. All of it is an expression of the faith of the people who lived in these regions and they ways in which their faith inspired them to give glory to God.

Many of the churches and buildings we visited were undergoing extensive restorations, which helped me to better appreciate the work we are doing at St. Isaac's. Would you believe the outdoor water faucet broke this week? My first day back and the faucet was gushing water from the side of the building. I can't help but think this is the Lord's way of encouraging us to continue the work of building (and maintaining) His Church. Whether the building is adorned with mosaics inside and out, or a simple brick structure, each brick is a sign of how we are all connected—from Rome throughout the world.

Of course, no trip to Italy is complete without indulging in the local cuisine! The food was simply amazing – rich pasta dishes, fresh ingredients, and, let's be honest, we sampled our fair share of gelato. The Dubai Chocolate gelato was a particular favorite among many, and a strong espresso was a welcome treat after each day's exploration.

It was a truly blessed journey, a chance to connect with our shared faith and to appreciate the profound legacy of the Church throughout history. I felt a deep sense of connection with our Lord, the saints and with those who have come before us. May the Lord continue to bless us all on our own spiritual journeys.

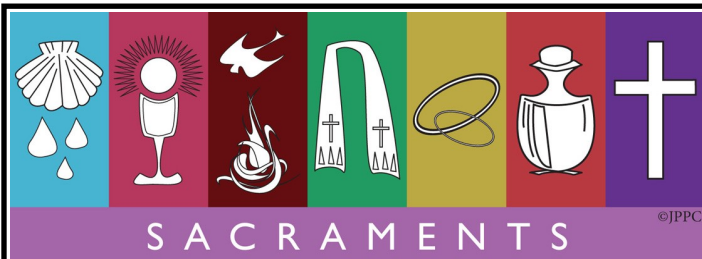

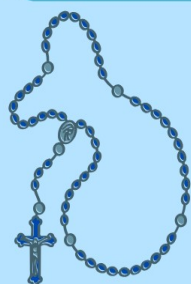

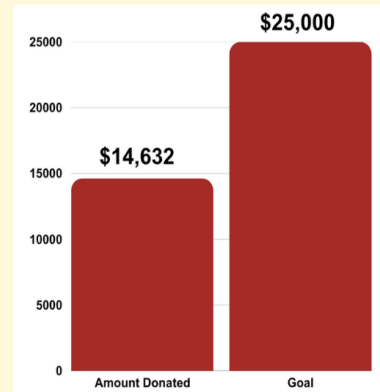

Our Promise to Protect, Our Pledge to Heal



The Diocese of Trenton is committed to the initiatives outlined in the U.S. Bishop's Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People in regard to the reporting and investigation of sexual abuse allegations involving minors. If you have been sexually abused as a minor by a member of the clergy or anyone representing the Catholic Church, or if you know of someone who was, you can report that abuse through the diocesan Abuse Hotline: **1-888-296-2965** or via email at **abuseline@dioceseoftrenton.org**. The Diocese of Trenton reports any allegations of sexual abuse to the appropriate law enforcement agencies. Anyone with an allegation is also encouraged to provide that information to local law enforcement authorities.
