Despite the beautiful fall weather we have been having, it is difficult not to acknowledge the devastation left by Hurricane Melissa, particularly in Haiti, Jamaica, and Cuba. Jamaica suffered the greatest impact when the Category 5 hurricane made landfall with 185 MPH winds. As always, Catholic Relief Services is positioned to respond, having extensive experience in emergency response efforts across the region. They already have a team of 100 staff in Haiti and local partners in Jamaica and other areas. As always, one of the most powerful ways we can send love and support to our brothers and sisters suffering through disaster is prayer. This Monday and Tuesday, our Religious Formation students will be gathering in the main church for a Rosary Rally during their regular class times. During the Rosary Rally, the students will all take turns participating in praying the Rosary, offering our prayers for special intentions as well as for all those affected by the hurricane. Parents and families are welcome to join us in the main church.

I am happy to announce that we are starting a Children's Choir for all children in **third grade or older**. It will be led by Domenica Rosati, one of our cantors. Domenica has her music degree from Rowan University and several years experience leading children's choirs. Practice with the students will begin on **Friday, November 14 at 4:30PM**. Children in the choir will be expected to attend regular practices on Fridays at 4:30PM in the Church Hall and to sing at the 9AM Mass on the fourth Sunday of the month. Their first concert will be the Christmas Concert in December. All who are interested in joining, please see the ad in this bulletin to sign up.

In addition to starting our children's choir, the month of November gives us many great feasts to look forward to. One awesome highlight is the culmination of the liturgical year on November 23, as we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Each liturgical year begins with the First Sunday of Advent, but before the new year, we go out with a major bang as we celebrate the Kingship of Christ. Kingship is a bit of a foreign concept for us as Americans who are part of a Constitutional Republic. But, not that long ago, kings and queens had a bit more emphasis, particularly in certain regions or territories. Hundreds of years ago, when the Holy Roman Empire built the West, Popes were responsible for anointing kings to rule over certain lands. To be crowned king or queen was viewed by the people to be a Divine Right, which was ritualized by the anointing given by the Pope. This was often done privately, as it was for King David in the Old Testament, but then promulgated throughout the land. Kings, particularly those anointed by the Pope, were entrusted with their office to embody the qualities of Christ the True King. Of course, as human beings, no one is perfect, and there were as many "bad" rulers as "good" ones. Nevertheless, the imagery of Christ the King carried on for centuries in many holy rulers.

These days, and in our Republic, we do not emphasize kingship with the same reverence. Lately, we have even seen people railing against the idea of kings. Truth be told, no earthly king will ever rule this land so long as the people embrace the right of self-governance, but we do well to bow to the True King in Heaven, our Lord Jesus Christ. If not for Christ, we would have no freedom from sin, which corrupts all that is good in our land. With Christ we rise above evil desires and live according to the Law of Love: To love God with our whole heart, and our neighbor as ourself.

Following the august celebration of Jesus Christ, our King, we have Thanksgiving, the quintessential American holiday. We do well to remember the Catholic roots of Thanksgiving. Over 50 years before Puritan pilgrims landed on Plymouth Rock, Spanish colonizers celebrated the Thanksgiving of 1565 in what is now St. Augustine, Florida. Of course, the Spanish colonizers who hosted it were Catholic, and they gave thanks to God, as Catholics do, for their safe passage and arrival in the New World. Not only did they celebrate with a meal of gratitude that day, but began with the celebration of Mass.

We close out the month of November with the beginning of a new liturgical year on the first Sunday of Advent. I am happy to announce that for this year's Advent Mission we will be hosting **Live Vertical**, a group of passionate Catholics, including Jeff Seidlecki from Holy Eucharist Parish. They will be speaking on the theme of the Manger and the Monstrance, helping us connect Christmas joy with the beautiful moment of the birth of our Blessed Lord. The monstrance is the ornate vessel used to display the Blessed Sacrament during Eucharistic Adoration. Jeff and his team will help us to better appreciate the lyrics we sing so often at Christmas time, "Come let us adore Him." Please see the bulletin for more information.

### Our Promise to Protect, Our Pledge to Heal



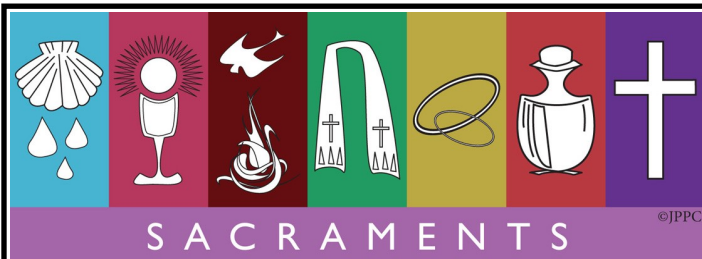
