POWERFUL PRAYER TO SAINT MICHAEL

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host - by the Divine Power of God - cast into hell, satan and all the evil spirits, who roam throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls. Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! (Eph. 4:4). This third Sunday in Advent is called *Gaudete Sunday*, which means “rejoice.” Twice a year, the Church celebrates a day of rejoicing in the midst of our penitential seasons as a reminder that we have great cause for joy. As Jesus tells the disciples of St. John the Baptist: “Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them.” Jesus quite literally healed the people, but he also cures spiritual blindness, spiritual deafness, spiritual lethargy, and spiritual poverty. He empowers his disciples to walk in his own footsteps, as he leads us closer to the Father. How is Jesus awakening us throughout our spiritual walk with the Lord?

Some of us may have noticed that the tabernacle has changed. This is only temporary. As part of the plans to transfer the tabernacle to the center of the sanctuary, we have received a very generous donation to help us refinish the tabernacle. We’re restoring it back to its original 24k bright yellow gold and bright silver panels, which were damaged by a past cleaning attempt. This work will ensure its beauty and longevity. It will also be a striking centerpiece in our sanctuary drawing us all closer to Christ. The work should take about three months to complete. I’ll keep everyone posted as we get closer to finalizing the installation.

Even though it’s Advent, and the beginning of a new liturgical year, the month of December is also a good time for us to review the last year. I’d like to highlight some of the ways in which parish contributions were used to the benefit of our buildings and grounds. Indoors, the new fire alarm system was installed along with two new valve seals for the building sprinkler system. New electronic locks were added to the parish center doors, securing our staff during the day and children in the evenings. One of the rooms in the parish center was reconfigured to make space for parish archives and additional storage. A new defibrillator was purchased for the Gathering Space. Outdoors, a new sprinkler controller was installed for the outdoor sprinkler system. All the gutters and drains in the parking lot were cleaned out and debris removed. The sidewalks, windows, and building walls were power washed to remove years of mold and grime. Several defective parking lot light heads were replaced, particularly in the rear parking lot. Most of these projects were funded by donations received through parish fundraising throughout the year, which includes Designer Bag Bingo, the Parish Raffle, capital campaigns, and one-time donations. Every year, I am amazed at the wonderful outpouring of generosity and support of the people of St. Isaac’s. Thank you for helping to keep our buildings and grounds beautiful.

As we continue to approach the celebration of Christmas, the readings focus us on the importance of faith in Jesus, whose first coming was foretold by the prophets. Jesus quotes from the prophet Isaiah to show that he is indeed the fulfillment of these prophecies. He also shows how St. John the Baptist was foretold by Isaiah, saying, “Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you.” Then he says something which should bring joy to every one of the baptized, he says, “Amen, I say to you, among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.” The *least* in the kingdom of heaven is greater. Indeed St. John had an important role in preparing the way for Jesus, but those who follow Jesus are granted access to the kingdom. Yet, we have this sense that the kingdom of God is at hand, but not yet. We acknowledge the immanence and the transcendence of the kingdom of God. It is something that is both in and outside of us. It is in us by way of the teachings of Jesus, through the Sacraments, our conscience, our faith, our prayer; it is outside of us by way of our acknowledging our neighbors, that we are not alone on this journey, that while we have a foretaste of things to come, we know they are yet to be fully revealed. And so we wait, patiently, until the time the Lord appears, whether in Sacrament (the foretaste) or in the end (when he returns). In any event, we keep our hearts and minds firmly fixed on the Lord, so that when that day comes, we are ready to *rejoice in the Lord always!*

Priest Chasuble



Chasubles are an essential part of the Catholic Church's religious vestments. They are the liturgical vestment that is worn by priests during the Eucharist. Chasubles are worn over the alb and stole and are often highly decorated with intricate embroidery, religious symbols, and designs. They have been worn for centuries as a way to distinguish the priest and other ministers from the congregation.

This design by Paula White of Atelier Liturgical is comprised of Weston purple wool adorned with Evesham Purple gold banding for the yolk and pillar. The edges are finished with violet silk and gold banding. The design perfectly complements our purple altar covering and hanging banners.

Deacon Dalmatic



The dalmatic is a liturgical vestment worn by deacons during Mass and at solemn processions and benedictions. It is characterized as a robe with wide sleeves that reaches the knees, being closed in front and open on the sides. Its distinctive ornamentation includes two vertical stripes running from the shoulder to the hem. The dalmatic is a distinctive vestment worn only by deacons. This vestment will help us build a proper set of dalmatics for our deacons.

The design by Paula White of Atelier Liturgical will be comprised of Weston purple wool adorned with Evesham purple and gold banding to match the priest chasuble. The design also perfectly complements our existing purple altar covering and hanging banners.

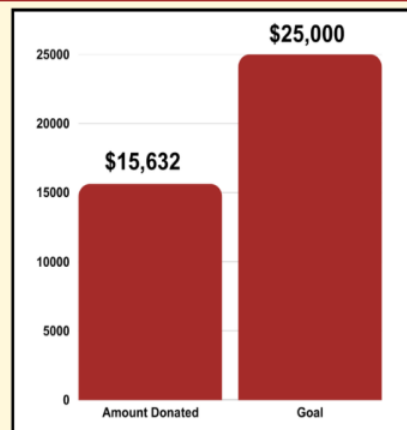
