POWERFUL PRAYER TO SAINT MICHAEL

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host - by the Divine Power of God - cast into hell, satan and all the evil spirits, who roam throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.



As we approach the joyous celebration of Christmas, today we reflect on the profound love of God, beautifully illustrated in the story of St. Joseph. In our Gospel, we hear of Joseph, facing uncertainty and a difficult decision, grappling with the immense implications of Mary's pregnancy. His initial instinct, to quietly separate himself, is a human reaction to the overwhelming nature of what's happening.

But God, in his infinite mercy and love, intervened through an angel's dream, offering Joseph courage and unwavering faith. This story reminds us that God doesn't ask us to handle everything alone. He provides us with the strength and guidance we need, even when the path ahead seems unclear.

Just as Joseph remained steadfast in his love for Mary, so too are we called to trust in God's love and to embrace the hope of the Incarnate Word – Jesus Christ. Let us reflect on this message of faith, courage, and unwavering love as we journey through these final days of Advent, anticipating the birth of our Savior.

As we hear about the beginnings of the Holy Family, we are also mindful of the importance of our own families, especially during this time of year. I hope everyone is looking forward to being with family and friends this Christmas. I also want to warmly welcome everyone to one of our Christmas Masses. Wednesday, Christmas Eve Masses will be 5PM and Midnight. Thursday, Christmas Day Masses will be 9AM and 11AM.

Last Tuesday, I had a lovely experience of my presbyteral family as I gathered together with Bishop O'Connell and my brother priests for our Advent Priestly Spirituality Day at the Church of St. Gregory the Great in Hamilton. We heard from Bishop Pedro Bismark Chau, the new auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of Newark, and enjoyed a nice luncheon together. It is always good to gather with brother priests to catch up and grow in the greatest ministry in the world.

Last Sunday was our Christmas Concert featuring our Director of Music Ministry, Greg Safko, and our parish choir. We also heard beautiful music from Alicia Melendez and her husband Vincent on classical guitar, Domenica Rosati on cello, and the debut of our new Children's Choir. Soloists included Jackie DiLouie, Frank Falcone, Naomi Lawrence, and Domenica Rosati. And Greg serenaded us with his amazing talents on the piano. It was a delightful time and we are truly blessed to have so many wonderful talents in our parish. Work continues to progress on the refinishing of our tabernacle. This project was funded by a generous donation to help us restore the tabernacle to its original 24k yellow gold and bright silver finish. The refinishing is going to be spectacular. Why might we want to do this work? The tabernacle is the dwelling place of our Blessed Lord and ought to reflect His own splendor. And with its new location in the center of the sanctuary, it is sure to shine, drawing all of us more deeply into the mystery of Jesus' Real Presence among us.

The last couple of years I have invited the parish with opportunities to donate a new set of vestments to the church sacristy. This year we are completing the color purple, which is worn during Advent and Lent. More information is available in the bulletin, including pictures. 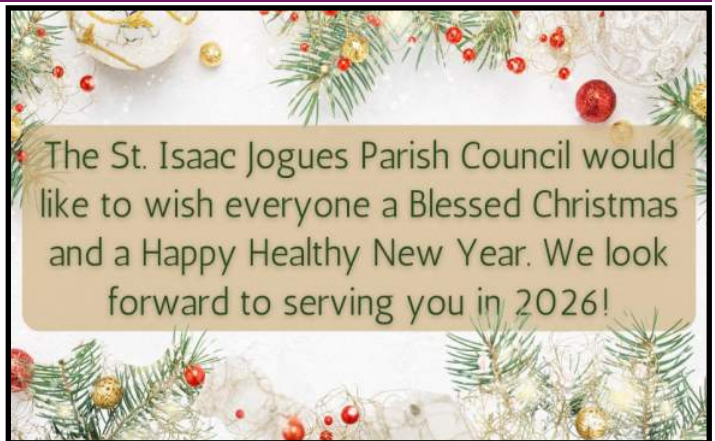

Priest Chasuble



Chasubles are an essential part of the Catholic Church's religious vestments. They are the liturgical vestment that is worn by priests during the Eucharist. Chasubles are worn over the alb and stole and are often highly decorated with intricate embroidery, religious symbols, and designs. They have been worn for centuries as a way to distinguish the priest and other ministers from the congregation.

This design by Paula White of Atelier Liturgical is comprised of Weston purple wool adorned with Evesham Purple gold banding for the yolk and pillar. The edges are finished with violet silk and gold banding. The design perfectly complements our purple altar covering and hanging banners.

Deacon Dalmatic



The dalmatic is a liturgical vestment worn by deacons during Mass and at solemn processions and benedictions. It is characterized as a robe with wide sleeves that reaches the knees, being closed in front and open on the sides. Its distinctive ornamentation includes two vertical stripes running from the shoulder to the hem. The dalmatic is a distinctive vestment worn only by deacons. This vestment will help us build a proper set of dalmatics for our deacons.

The design by Paula White of Atelier Liturgical will be comprised of Weston purple wool adorned with Evesham purple and gold banding to match the priest chasuble. The design also perfectly complements our existing purple altar covering and hanging banners.

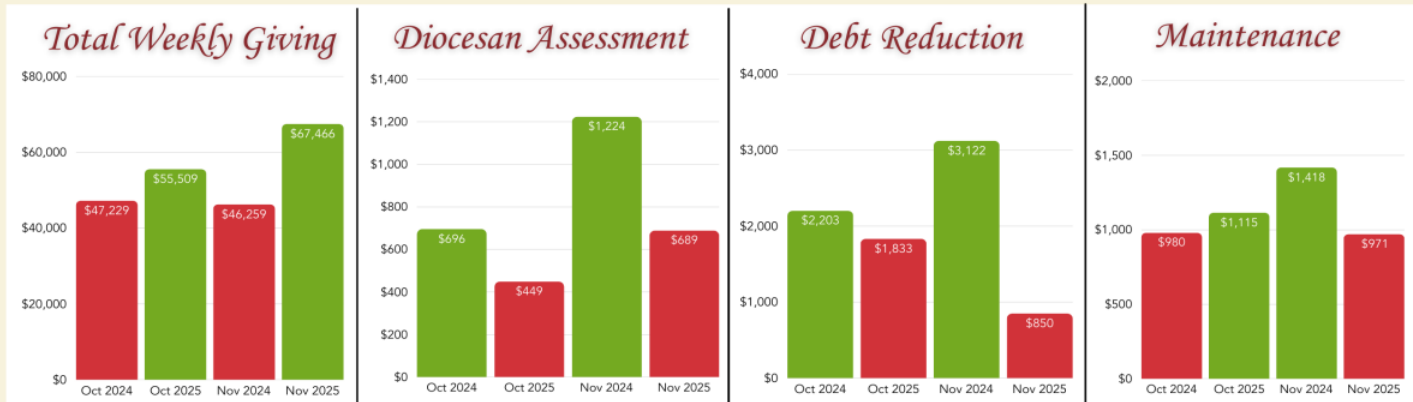

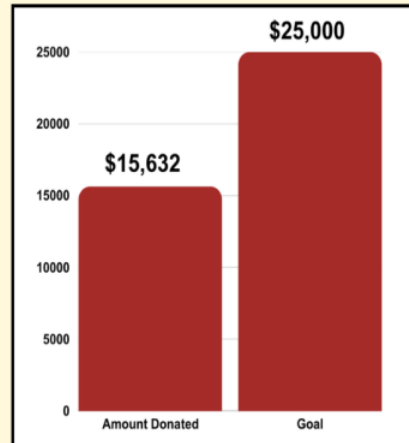
