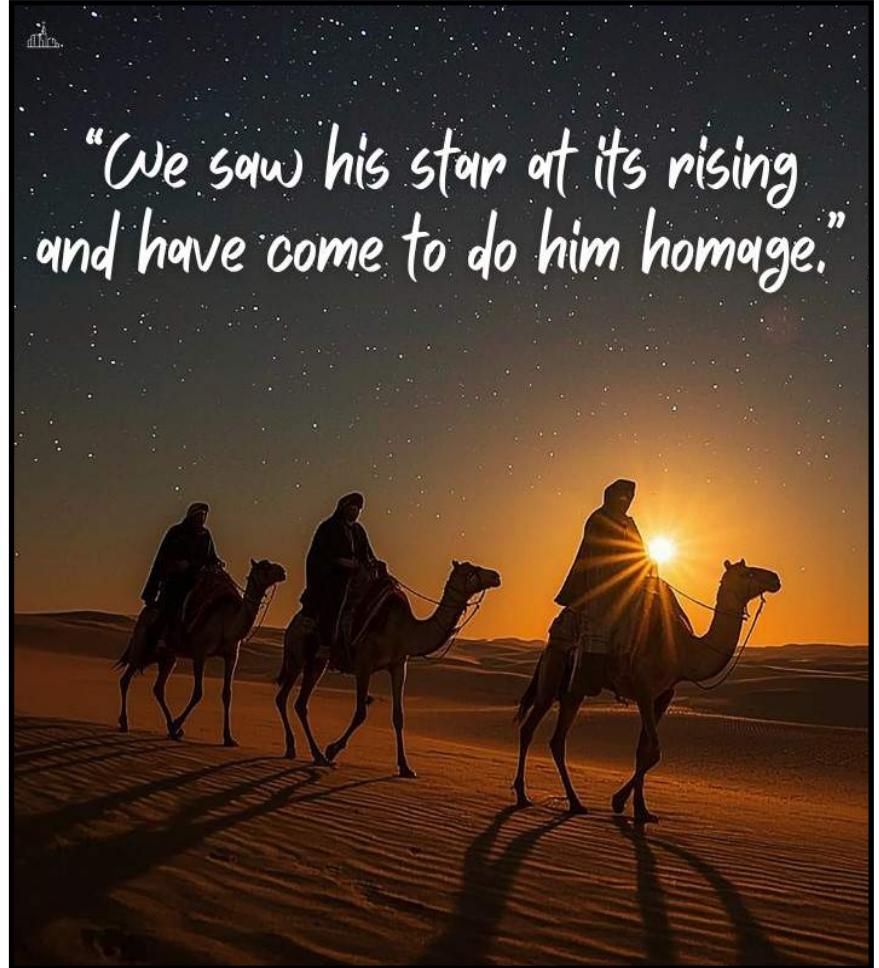

**POWERFUL PRAYER TO
SAINT MICHAEL**

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host - by the Divine Power of God - cast into hell, satan and all the evil spirits, who roam throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.



O come let us adore Him! Happy New Year and happy feast of the Epiphany. The Epiphany recounts for us the story of when the wise men from the East visit the baby Jesus, give him homage, and offer him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These gifts represent Jesus' kingship (gold), divinity (frankincense), and humanity (myrrh). While the wise men followed the star to the place where Jesus was, the gospel tells us after they encounter the Lord, they departed for their home country by another way. In other words, being in the Lord's presence left them forever changed. How has being in the Lord's presence this Christmas left us forever changed?

A beautiful tradition in the Catholic Church is the blessing of salt, water, and chalk for the Epiphany. Traditionally, the priest would visit homes on the Feast of the Epiphany to offer a prayer of blessing and inscribe the lintel of the front door for the new year. We will be offering the Epiphany blessing after the 5PM Mass this weekend. The rite of blessing, according to the Roman Ritual, includes combining blessed and exorcised salt and water. The significance of this blessed and exorcised water is that everything that is sprinkled with it is blessed and exorcised. Since I can't visit every home, and for those who would like to bless their homes this year, we are providing prayer guides, holy water, and blessed chalk. The head of the household can then lead the family in prayer, mark the lintel, and sprinkle the house with holy water.

I hope everyone had a blessed Christmas and New Year. It's hard to believe 2026 is already upon us. What will this year bring? If we continue to listen to the prompting of the Holy Spirit, it will bring each of us closer to God. Many people find themselves returning to faith. They are coming from varied backgrounds, whether Catholic or Protestant, but nevertheless find themselves exploring more deeply the teachings of the Catholic Church. We welcome them with open arms and pray that the Lord continue to guide them to the Truth, Who is Jesus Christ. One of the greatest expressions of faith we share in the Catholic Church is the Eucharist, where Jesus becomes truly present among us in the Blessed Sacrament. The next is like it—the Sacrament of Reconciliation. When Jesus appeared to his disciples in the upper room he breathed on them and said, "Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (Jn. 20:22b-23). For Catholics who have been away from the Church, there is no greater homecoming than a return to confession. The Church prescribes we go to confession at least once a year, but bishops agree that regular monthly confession is appropriate, especially if it has been a long time. How about that for a New Year's resolution? Can we attend confession more regularly?

Christmas is a joyous time, and we continue to celebrate the season of Christmas until the Baptism of the Lord next Sunday. But, we do well to remember the reason Jesus appeared to the world. The answer is in his Name, which means the *Salvation of God*. Without Christ, we would be dead in our sins, but thanks be to God he gave his only begotten son so that all who believe in him might have eternal life. This life makes us radiant, as the prophet Isaiah says in today's reading. It fulfills what the psalm says, "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." It gathers all peoples together, as St. Paul says, "the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel." And as Matthew tells us in the gospel, the magi departed for their country by another way. This "way" is the way of Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Christ. And so, as we begin this new year 2026, let us set our hearts on Christ like the magi, who followed a star and found True Light. May the light of the gospel guide us ever closer to Jesus and his Most Sacred Heart.

New Drop-Off Center

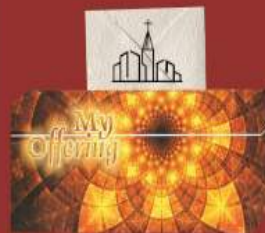

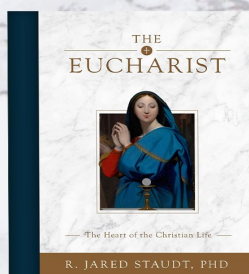

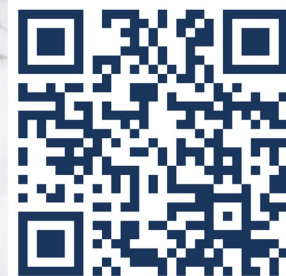

**Join us for the Epiphany
Home Blessing Ceremony!**



The Epiphany blessing of homes is a traditional Catholic practice in which a priest or deacon visits parishioners' houses on the feast of the Epiphany (January 6 or the first Sunday after Christmas). Traditionally, a priest or deacon visits families to sprinkle holy water, offer a short blessing, and pray that the house becomes a place of God's grace, peace, and guidance. This gesture celebrates the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles and reminds families of their role as "domestic churches," nurturing faith and charity within their homes.

Since Fr. Jim can't visit every home, the head of the household can celebrate this custom by:

- Gathering your family together
- Presenting the blessing prayer and reciting it with the family
- Sprinkling the house with holy water
- Using blessed chalk, inscribing the lintel above front door with the Cross of salvation (20+C+M+B+26)

Prayer guides, holy water, and blessed chalk will be provided after the Masses on Jan 3rd & 4th.

This practice fosters family unity as a "domestic church," recalls the Magi's journey to Christ, and the Lord's blessing to the world.



Priest Chasuble



Chasubles are an essential part of the Catholic Church's religious vestments. They are the liturgical vestment that is worn by priests during the Eucharist. Chasubles are worn over the alb and stole and are often highly decorated with intricate embroidery, religious designs, and other ministers from the congregation.

This design by Paula White of Atelier Liturgical is comprised of Weston purple wool adorned with Evesham purple and gold banding for the yolk and pillar. The design perfectly complements our existing purple altar covering and hanging banners.

Deacon Dalmatic



The dalmatic is a liturgical vestment worn by deacons during Mass and at solemn processions and benedictions. It is characterized as a robe with wide sleeves that reaches the knees, being closed in front and open on the sides. Its distinctive ornamentation includes two vertical stripes running from the shoulder to the hem. The dalmatic is a distinctive vestment worn only by deacons. This vestment will help us build a proper set of dalmatics for our deacons.

The design by Paula White of Atelier Liturgical will be comprised of Weston purple wool adorned with Evesham purple and gold banding to match the priest chasuble. The design also perfectly complements our existing purple altar covering and hanging banners.
