**POWERFUL PRAYER TO
SAINT MICHAEL**

Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do Thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host - by the Divine Power of God - cast into hell, satan and all the evil spirits, who roam throughout the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.



Praised be Jesus Christ! With today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we celebrate the conclusion of the Christmas Season and the beginning of Ordinary Time. The Baptism of the Lord recounts for us yet another revelation of God-with-us (Emmanuel) as the heavens are opened and the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus while a voice from heaven says, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matt. 3:17). As St. Proclus of Constantinople preached, "On the feast of the Savior's birth, the earth rejoiced because it bore the Lord in a manger; but on today's feast...it is the sea that is glad and leaps for joy; the sea is glad because it receives the blessing of holiness in the river Jordan" (Sermo 7 in Sancta Theophania). Indeed, the baptism of Jesus makes holy the waters of baptism for all who seek union with God through Christ.

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a continuation of the Epiphany, a moment of great revelation. Jesus, the humble carpenter's son, arrives at the Jordan River, not seeking baptism himself, but inviting John the Baptist to initiate the process: "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness" (Matt. 3:15). This simple act sets in motion a divine unveiling. As Jesus is immersed, the heavens open. The Spirit of God descends in the form of a dove, a tangible sign of God's presence. Simultaneously, a voice booms forth: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." It's a profound declaration – Jesus is identified as the Son of God, the Messiah promised in the Scriptures. Matthew carefully details this scene, emphasizing the urgency. Jesus' ministry isn't about fulfilling his own desires; it's about revealing God's love and justice to the world. John the Baptist, recognizing the monumental shift, simply testifies, "He must increase, I must decrease" (John 3:30). The baptism of Jesus was a cosmic event, demonstrating the Trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – united in one divine act. It's also an image of transformation – of the many new lives born from the waters of Baptism, all marked by the saving presence of God. Jesus' own baptism is a call to a life of obedience, a testament to God's unwavering love, and a promise of the transformative power available to us through faith. As St. Paul says so eloquently, "one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all" (Eph. 4:5-6).

May today's celebration of the Lord's baptism help us to appreciate our own baptism, which has delivered us from Original Sin into the kingdom of God and made us brothers and sisters with Christ, sons and daughters of the Father. Jesus through the gospel." And as Matthew tells us in the gospel, the magi departed for their country by another way. This "way" is the way of Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Christ. And so, as we begin this new year 2026, let us set our hearts on Christ like the magi, who followed a star and found True Light. May the light of the gospel guide us ever closer to Jesus and his Most Sacred Heart.

Deacon Dalmatic



The dalmatic is a liturgical vestment worn by deacons during Mass and at solemn processions and benedictions. It is characterized as a robe with wide sleeves that reaches the knees, being closed in front and open on the sides. Its distinctive ornamentation includes two vertical stripes running from the shoulder to the hem. The dalmatic is a distinctive vestment worn only by deacons. This vestment will help us build a proper set of dalmatics for our deacons.

The design by Paula White of Atelier Liturgical will be comprised of Weston purple wool adorned with Evesham purple and gold banding to match the priest chasuble. The design also perfectly complements our existing purple altar covering and hanging banners.

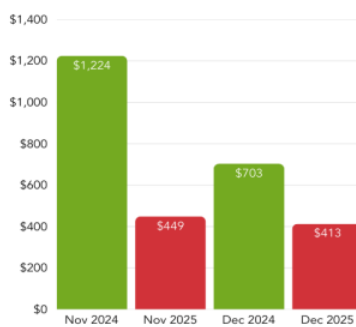

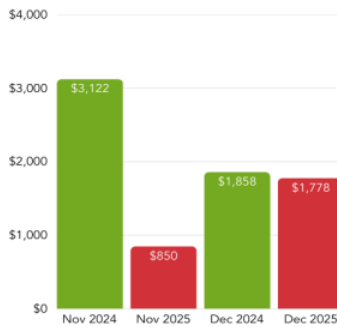

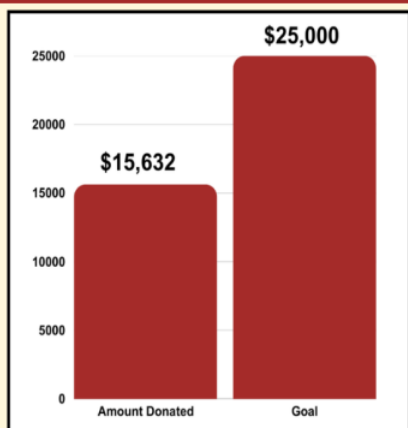
