Grace to you and peace. I want to express my sincere gratitude for the incredible generosity of our parish family during this year's Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). Your support truly makes a difference, and we're already seeing the positive impact of your giving!

A Quick Correction: Just a small note – there was a slight misunderstanding in last week's letter regarding the rebate incentives. For the 2026 Appeal, we're receiving 50% of the funds raised over our goal, and 5% of the total goal if we can increase our donor count by 10% compared to last year. That means we're aiming for 20 new donors to help us reach our full potential – and you can help make that happen! To support this vital fund for our Diocese, please visit giveaca.org to contribute.

Amazing News & a Little Challenge: It's wonderful to share that our parish received a remarkable rebate of \$25,725 from last year's ACA – a stunning testament to your generosity! A portion of this will be saved for our much-needed heating and air conditioning upgrade. We're exploring two options: a complete replacement of all units, which would involve permitting and a significant build-up of work, or a component-by-component replacement, which could be tackled more quickly. We're prioritizing getting the building comfortable, and right now, the main church unit is working well enough to get us back to temperature when it's 30 degrees. The chapel, however, is still chilly and will remain uncomfortable until addressed. We're exploring replacing the heat exchanger – but we want to ensure we make the best investment for our building's future. Let's pray for warmer weather and a solution!

Ash Wednesday & Lent Begin: This Wednesday, we begin the sacred Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. According to Church Law, we observe abstinence from meat on Fridays, and we observe fasting and abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. (See page 4 of the bulletin for Bishop O'Connell's 2026 Lenten Regulations, particularly around fasting and abstinence).

Why Fast and Abstain? The tradition of fasting and abstaining from meat on Fridays dates back to the early Church, a powerful reminder of our Lord's suffering and sacrifice. It's an act of penance and a way to cultivate holiness – reminding us to prioritize our spirits over our desires. St. Augustine beautifully describes it as "purifying the soul, elevating the mind...and enkindling the true light of chastity."

Lent: A Season of Giving Up & Growing Lent is a time of self-denial, and I encourage you to reflect on what you'll give up *and* embrace during this season. Will you give up a favorite treat? Or will you commit to something new – perhaps more prayer, daily Mass, or acts of service? I'm personally going to be cutting back on screen time and replacing it with more spiritual reading. What will you choose?

Special Lent Events:

- **Ash Wednesday Masses:** Offered at 8:30AM, 7PM, and a shortened service at 12PM.
- **Friday Evening Masses & Stations of the Cross:** Join us for special Lenten Masses at 7PM, featuring priests from across the diocese! Following each Mass, we'll walk the Stations of the Cross led by Deacon John or myself.
- **Adoration & Confession:** Tuesdays during Lent at 7PM in the chapel.
- **Fish Bakes & Soups & Stations:** Keep an eye on the calendar for Knights of Columbus events!
- **Stations of the Cross for Married Couples:** Couples are invited to join us for a special Stations of the Cross after the 5PM Mass on Saturday, March 14.

I look forward to walking alongside you throughout this holy Season of Lent. May God bless you and guide you as we journey together towards the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord.

2026 Lenten Regulations - Letter from Bishop O'Connell

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from *Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2026, until Holy Thursday morning, April 2, 2026* --- the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for “these forty days” was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE. The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.
2. Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.
3. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as noted above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.
4. The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.
5. The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called “**Easter duty**” --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 21-22, 2026, to Trinity Sunday, May 30-31, 2026**. However, the Church’s law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, to go to Confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of Penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

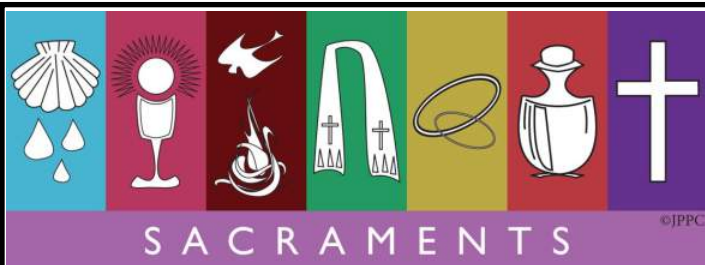
