Grace to you and peace. Now that Lent is underway, “Let us ask for the grace of a Lent that leads us to greater attentiveness to God and to the least among us. Let us ask for the strength that comes from the type of fasting that also extends to our use of language, so that hurtful words may diminish and give way to a greater space for the voice of others. Let us strive to make our communities places where the cry of those who suffer finds welcome, and listening opens paths towards liberation, making us ready and eager to contribute to building a civilization of love” (Pope Leo XIV, Message for Lent 2026).

Jesus says, “If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free” (Jn. 8:31b-32). How do we remain in Jesus’ word? By heeding the message of the Gospel; by listening to the voice of Jesus; by responding to the prompting of his Holy Spirit within us. Listening is more than just hearing. It is taking the word into our hearts and allowing it to transform us from within. We have this opportunity every time we attend Mass, every time we read Sacred Scripture, every time we are touched by the words of a thoughtful priest or deacon when they preach. When we actively listen to the Word of God, we are listening to the truth, and that truth sets us free. No longer will we be hung up on sin because Christ has helped us realize it is better for us to conform our wills after his own than follow the whims of our every desire. We learn to master the senses not to do what we want when we want, but to do the will of our heavenly Father. If I gave in to my every desire, I would be a miserable soul. But, by disciplining myself to seek virtue and avoid vice, I experience freedom that is truly divine.

Lent is a Season of sacrifice, of giving up, of letting go, of emptying out of sinful vice and embracing the life of a disciple. Discipline is the root of the word ‘disciple,’ so, we ought to focus more on disciplining our flesh for the sake of being able to more freely embrace God. Jesus himself did this when he fasted forty days in the desert. Time and again, our Blessed Lord models for us the behavior we ought to have, the disposition we need for eternal life. And like us, Jesus himself was tempted by the Devil. Part of this temptation was to manipulate nature, to turn stones into bread for his own personal gain—to use his divinity like an alchemist would to manipulate chemistry. How often are we tempted to bend nature to our own will? Though it may be a touchy subject, IVF stands as a modern day temptation of this principle. The Church’s teaching is clear on these procedures, which adulterate the conjugal act. There are Natural Procreative doctors who specialize in helping couples conceive the way God intends, and are worth looking into for those who struggle with infertility. Just because we can manipulate nature does not mean we should—Jesus teaches that we can overcome such temptations, saying, “It is written: One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.”

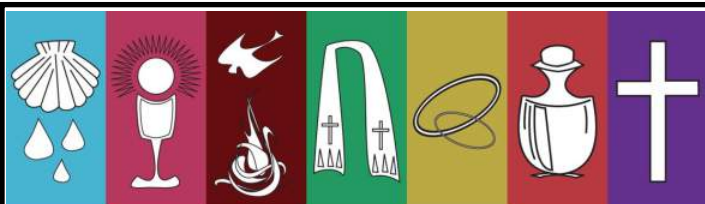

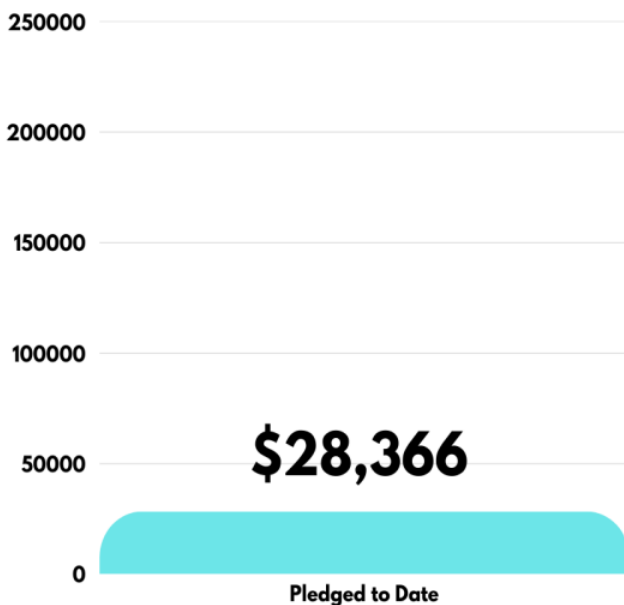

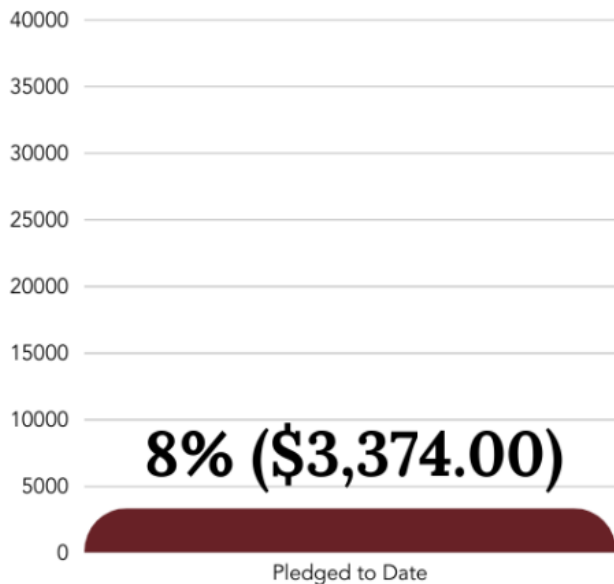
