Grace to you and peace. By now most of us have seen the beautiful statue of Our Lady of Good Remedy in the church. This statue was a generous gift from one of our parishioners who has asked to remain anonymous. The statue is Italian hand carved wood, hand painted and features glass eyes for both Our Lady and the baby Jesus. When the tabernacle is moved to its new location in the sanctuary, this statue of Our Lady will take its place, establishing a shrine to the Blessed Mother where we can venerate her image and pray our Rosaries and Novenas in a dedicated space.

Our Lady of Good Remedy is a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in honor of her intercession in the founding and mission of the Trinitarian Order. The devotion traces back to 1198, when St. John of Matha, a French priest, founded the Order of the Most Holy Trinity (commonly known as the Trinitarians) to ransom Christian captives—especially those enslaved by Muslim forces in North Africa and the Iberian Peninsula. At the time, thousands of Christians were being captured and sold into slavery, and no effective solution existed.



To fund their mission, the Trinitarians relied on donations, placing their fundraising efforts under the patronage of Mary. Their efforts were remarkably successful, with thousands of captives freed over the centuries. In gratitude for her miraculous assistance, St. John of Matha bestowed upon Mary the title “Our Lady of Good Remedy”—a name reflecting her role as the source of spiritual and material help in times of need.

The Trinitarians’ devotion to Our Lady of Good Remedy was formally recognized by the Church, and in 1688 she was declared patroness of the Order. In 1961, Pope John XXIII granted her official status in the Church through the Apostolic Letter *Sacrarium Trinitatis*. The feast day of Our Lady of Good Remedy is celebrated on October 8, and she is often depicted in art handing a bag of money to St. John of Matha, symbolizing her intercessory provision.

I can’t help but consider the French connection between Our Lady of Good Remedy and our own patron St. Isaac Jogues. St. Isaac loved the Blessed Mother, and was influenced deeply by the devotion to Our Lady of the Way, a title associated with the Jesuit tradition and the spiritual journey of missionaries. We see this reflected in the National Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs in Auriesville, NY, where a statue of Our Lady of the Way is placed along the path to the burial site of one of St. Isaac’s companions. Perhaps we can make our own pilgrimage to Auriesville later this year?

I also can’t help but appreciate the connection between the arrival of the statue of Our Lady of Good Remedy and the material needs of the parish. Perhaps it is a sign for all of us to pray to our Our Lady of Good Remedy, asking her to help us reach our financial goals? At a time when our parish buildings are in need of serious maintenance, it is hard not to see the arrival of Our Lady of Good Remedy as providential. The Lord provides for his people so that they may give back to the Lord. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the perfect means of accomplishing this holy exchange.

All are invited to pray the Novena to Our Lady of Good Remedy for help with our monthly expenses and maintenance needs. Please visit our website cosij.org to open the Novena prayer or use one of the prayer cards found within the kneeler by the statue. “O Lady of Good Remedy, source of unending help, grant that we may draw from thy treasury of graces in our time of need.”

Become an Altar Server at St. Isaac's!



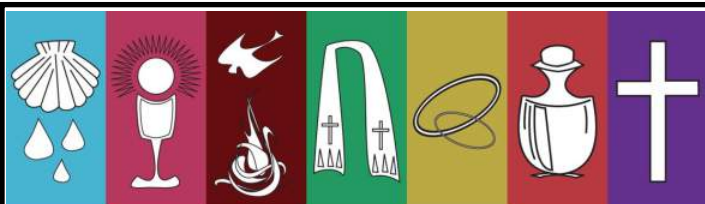
Boys and girls in fourth grade and above are invited to serve at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

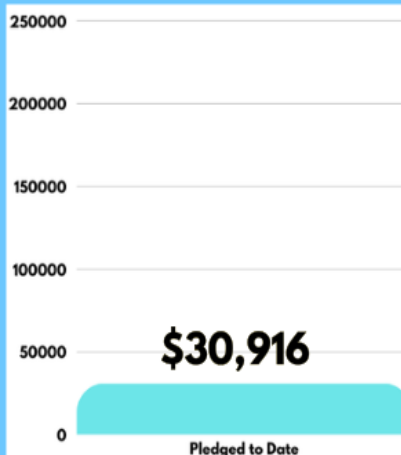

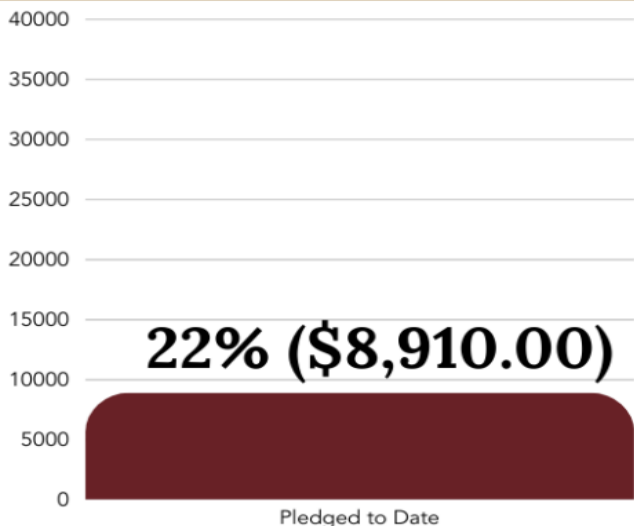
