Amen.



From The Pastor's Desk



"Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel. Hosanna in the highest!" This is the introit for Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, which highlights Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The opening Gospel tells us that Jesus made His way into the city riding on a colt, just as king Solomon did when he was first recognized as king (1 Kgs. 1:33). Jesus also fulfills the prophecy of Zechariah, who says, "Behold: your king is coming to you, a just savior is he, humble and riding on a donkey" (Zec. 9:9). The people greeted Jesus saying, "Hosanna in the highest!" The Hebrew word 'Hosanna' means 'save us!' How fitting that the people greet Jesus in this way given His own name means "God saves". Indeed, Jesus has saved us all!

This year, we read the Passion of the Lord according to Matthew. It is a detailed account of the Last Supper, the institution of the Eucharist, Jesus' agony in the garden of Gethsemane, His arrest and subsequent trials, His condemnation by Pontius Pilate, the carrying of the Cross, and His crucifixion and death. It is a tale fraught with betrayal, fear, denial, and ultimate suffering. This is the most difficult part of the Gospel to hear, but it is also the most necessary part of the Gospel. But, thanks be to God, "Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" (Phil. 2:6-8). And while today we focus intently on Jesus' suffering and death, we know that the death of Jesus was not the end. In just one week we will celebrate the awesome reality of the Resurrection of Jesus, which is the fundamental dogma of our Christian faith. As Jesus told Martha in last week's Gospel: "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die" (Jn. 11:25-26). This is fulfilled in Jesus' own resurrection and promised to we who believe.

On Monday, I will be attending the Chrism Mass with Bishop O'Connell and the priests of our diocese. At this Chrism Mass, the bishop is surrounded by his priests who renew their priestly promises, and the Holy Oils are blessed for use throughout the year. The oils include Sacred Chrism, used for baptisms, confirmations, and ordinations; Oil of the Sick, for anointing those who are sick; and the Oil of Catechumens, used for those in the process of becoming Catholic. In a sense, the Holy Oils are the "tools of the trade" for the priesthood. These oils will be processed into the church on Holy Thursday by the elect (those to be baptized this Easter). Please pray for our bishop and all the priests of the diocese as we renew our commitment to serve the people of the Church of Trenton.

Speaking of service, everyone should have received a second letter regarding our **Maintaining Our Dream Increased Offertory Appeal**. We continue to struggle to meet our monthly expenses, particularly following the freezing cold winter months. I want to thank everyone who has so generously increased their weekly offering, and invite you to please consider an extra bump to our **Debt Reduction, Extra Loan Payment, or Maintenance** funds. If you have not yet been able to increase your weekly offering, please consider increasing this week. Even a small increase makes a big difference. If you currently give \$20 per week, increasing to \$25 would be a tremendous help. If you give \$100 per week, increasing to \$125 would be truly transformative. Each increase gets us closer to meeting our monthly expenses and **Maintaining Our Dream**. To make giving easier, we have secure online giving via **ParishSoft Giving** available at givesij.org. Please consider signing up for automatic payments to ensure your donations are always delivered regularly. Of course, we continue to welcome envelopes as well, and we're happy to accommodate your preferred method of giving.

Thank you to those who have already increased their giving – your generosity is deeply appreciated! With your support, we continue to thrive as a vibrant faith family at the Church of St. Isaac Jogues. As always, if an increase is not possible at this time, please pray for the good of the parish that together we will reach our goals.

Now, as we enter into the most holy time of our year, let us focus our hearts and minds on the mystery of our redemption. Please join us for Mass of the Lord's Supper this Thursday 7PM followed by Adoration until 11PM, Good Friday confessions from 1PM to 3PM (last chance before Easter), Good Friday Communion Service at 3PM, Good Friday Solemn Stations of the Cross at 7PM, the blessing of Easter food on Holy Saturday at 10AM, Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday at 8PM, and Easter Sunday Masses at 9AM and 11AM. Please note there are no confessions on Holy Saturday at 3:30PM.

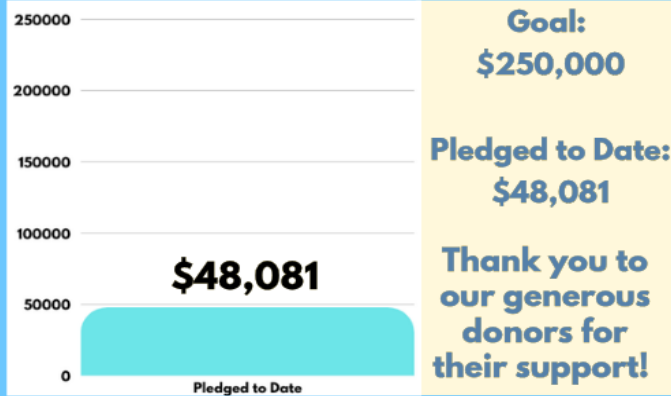

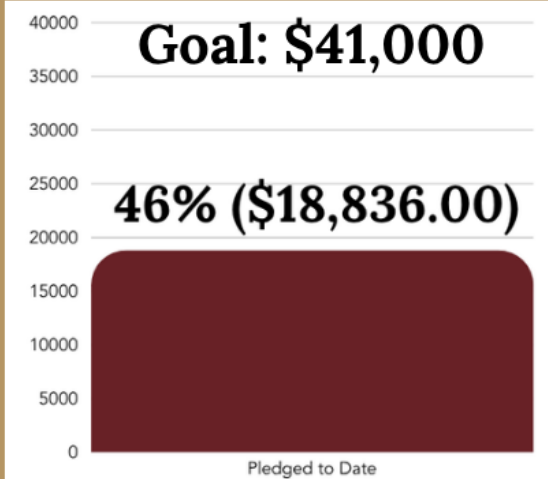

2026 Annual Catholic Appeal Progress



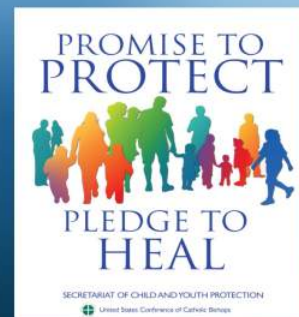

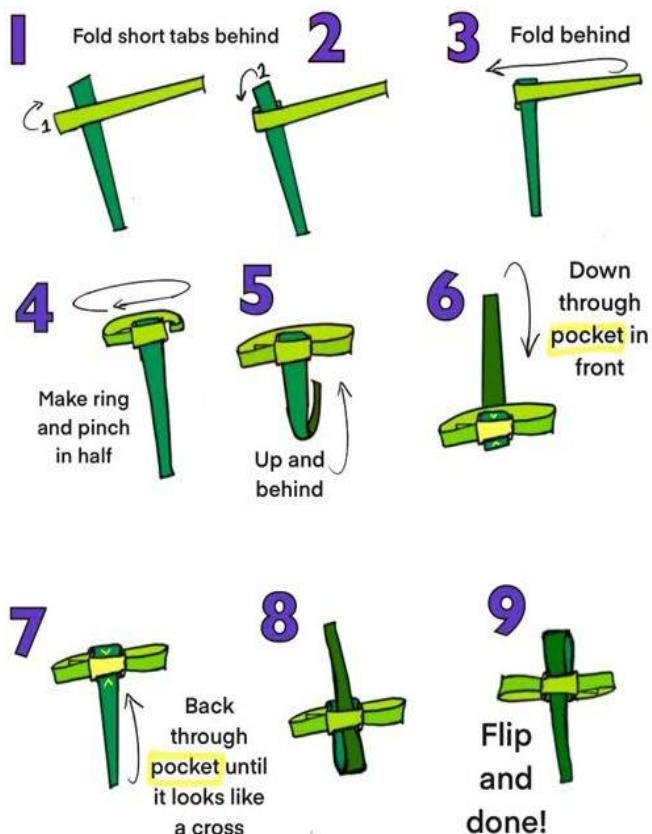
