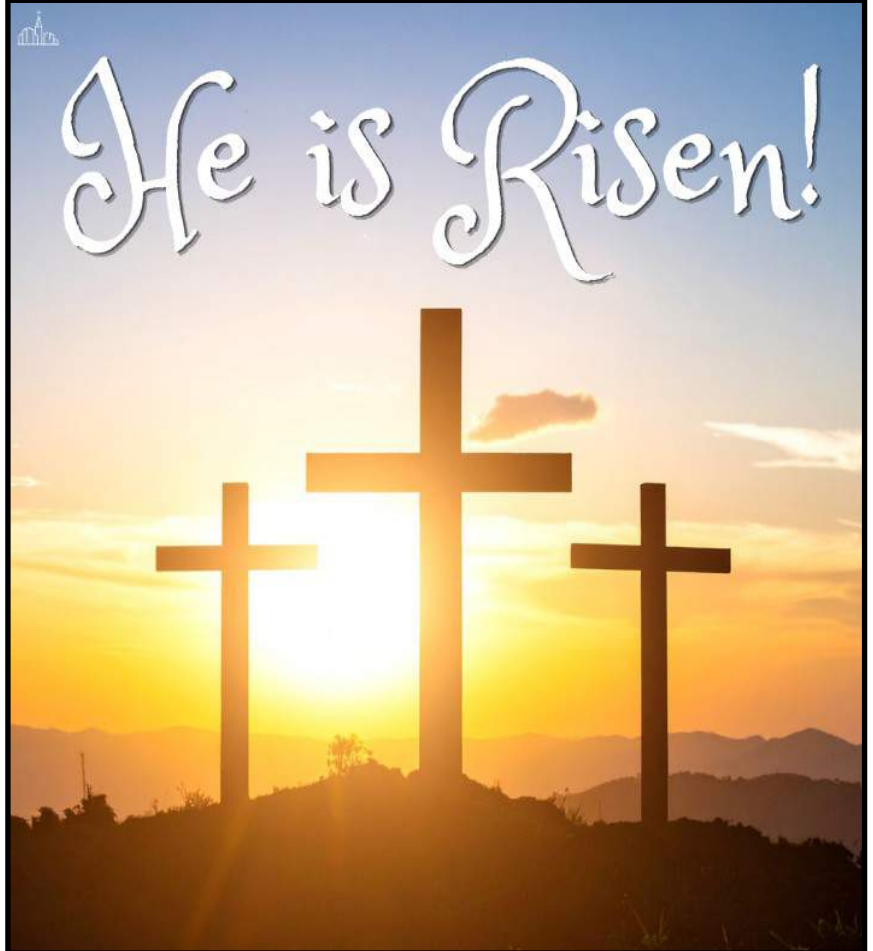

From The Pastor's Desk



He is Risen! Alleluia! Truly, He is Risen! Alleluia! Our Lenten sacrifices and the observances of Holy Week have culminated on the most important feast of the year, Easter. Easter is the English word for 'Pascha,' which is the Greek word for 'Pesach' which is the Hebrew word for Passover. We know that Jesus celebrated the Passover the night of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday before he endured his Passion. He did this to transform the annual ritual observance of the Exodus into the ongoing reality of the Passover of his own Death and Resurrection. By instituting the Eucharist the night of the Last Supper, and entrusting it to his disciples, Jesus gives all who come to the Lord's Table a share in His own redemptive Suffering, Death, and Resurrection: The Paschal Mystery. For this we say, *He is Risen! Alleluia! Truly, He is Risen! Alleluia!*

I want to welcome all our visitors this Easter. It is a wonderful time for families to reunite, especially around the Lord's Table. I also want to encourage any of those who may find themselves at a crossroads to further commit themselves to Christ. When the time came for Jesus to enter into His Passion, He did not back down, He did not give up, rather, He faced it with courage and grace, embracing His own Cross and carrying it for the sake of us all. As Jesus says the night of the Last Supper, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you" (Jn. 15:13-14). Jesus invites us into friendship with Him, if only we do what He commands, namely, to love God with our whole heart, our whole soul, and our whole strength, and to love our neighbor as ourself.

How do we love God? Do we put God first in our life, or do we put God far from our hearts and minds? We do well to remember what St. Paul says, "For you have been purchased at a price" (1 Cor. 6:20a). That price is the Blood of the spotless Lamb of God who died for our sins and the sins of the whole world. Again, St. Paul says, "Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Rm. 5:7-8). The love of God is ultimately expressed through sacrifice. When we gaze upon the Cross, we see the perfect Sacrifice as Jesus gave Himself completely and totally to the Father. But, what about us? Have we sacrificed with Christ? We have heard it said, "I don't need to go to Church to love God." This is the spirit of anti-Christ. To avoid Mass is to avoid redemption. It is to hide from our sins. So often the guilt of our past actions seems too great to overcome, when all we have to do is place our lives in the merciful hands of Jesus, who takes away our sins and nourishes our souls with His Body and Blood.

The Catholic Church has taught the importance of redemptive suffering for nearly 2,000 years, but the world seeks to dismiss it as antiquated and unimportant. We do well to consider the value of hard work—that nothing truly comes easy. If we want to grow in our field, we need to put in the time. Surgeons know well the 10,000 hour rule. How many hours have we given to Christ, the Divine Physician? How many hours have we given to the purification of our souls? As the author of the letter to the Hebrews writes, "[W]e have been consecrated through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all" (Heb. 10:10). And so, Jesus invites us all, "Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me" (Jn. 15:4).

We who gather this Easter are aware of what Jesus has done for us, we are aware of our need for His Mercy and Redemption, we know that we are merely sinners, and without the Sacrifice of Christ, we would remain in our sins (See 1 Cor. 15:16-17). But, as St. John says, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (Jn. 3:16). Let us give thanks to Almighty God for so great a gift! And let us offer ourselves in return: Our lives, our needs, our desires, our hopes, our dreams, and, yes, even our own sinfulness, asking the Father to accept it as a worthy sacrifice through our Lord, Jesus Christ, to deliver us from evil and usher us into the Kingdom of His Beloved Son.

On behalf of myself and our parish staff, may everyone have a most blessed Easter! *He is Risen! Alleluia! Truly, He is Risen! Alleluia!*
