From The Pastor's Desk



Once again, Happy Easter to you and your family. Today we celebrate the Octave of Easter also known as Sunday of Divine Mercy. The title of Divine Mercy is connected with Sr. Faustina Kowalska, whose writings focused on the mercy poured forth in Christ's death and resurrection. After Sr. Faustina's canonization in the year 2000, Pope St. John Paul II declared that the Second Sunday of Easter would be called throughout the Church "Divine Mercy Sunday." Today is a great opportunity for us to venerate the image of The Merciful Jesus next to the ambry (Holy Oils) when you first walk into our church. This image was inspired by Sr. Faustina's mystical visions of Jesus. At the prompting of her spiritual director, Sr. Faustina sought the help of painter Eugeniusz Kazimirowski to realize on canvas what the Lord Jesus revealed to her. The distinct white and red rays emanating from Jesus' heart represent the blood (red) and water (white) that poured forth from our Blessed Lord's pierced side on Calvary. The blood is an image of the Eucharist, while the water points to Baptism and the gift of the Holy Spirit. These rays help us to contemplate Christ's wounded heart as the source of mercy. The goal of the image is to give us a glimpse into Sr. Faustina's own mystical experience and to respond in the dialogue of trust: "Jesus, I trust in you!" May we all trust in the Divine Mercy of our Lord Jesus and His unending love for us.

Our Easter celebration continues this weekend with our Easter Egg hunt for all children ages 10 and younger. This is taking place immediately after the 9AM Mass. Children are invited to bring their own baskets and meet in the Parish Hall. There will be goody bags, treats, and prizes. Please e-mail david.barr@cosij.org with any questions.

While Holy Week focuses us on the Paschal Mystery of our Blessed Lord's Passion, Crucifixion, Death, the Season of Easter focuses us on life of our Lord after the Resurrection. One of the most prominent symbols of this is the Easter Egg. Have you ever wondered why we see eggs everywhere during Easter? While eggs have always been seen as the germinating life of early spring, this connection to life was "Christianized" to represent new Creation and the joy of Easter. The egg, therefore, represents the perfect cycle of life, particularly for the Christian who is baptized on Easter. They have been made a new creation in Christ. Let us pray that our newly baptized and confirmed neophytes may continue to grow in their Christian identity and in the love of Christ.

In our readings today, we see how the apostles devoted themselves to teaching, the communal life, the breaking of the bread, and prayer. This has been the model of the Church from the very beginning. Teaching is necessary, as St. Paul says, "Thus faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ" (Rm. 10:17). King David prophesied this: "A report goes forth through all the earth, their messages, to the ends of the world" (Ps. 19:5). The communal life was all about gathering together as the mystical Body of Christ. The community gathers for prayer, for fellowship, for support, and for formation in the Christian life. The breaking of the bread is an obvious Eucharistic image. Ever since Jesus broke bread on Holy Thursday and commanded His disciples, "*Do this in memory of me*," the Church has been celebrating the Eucharist. Lastly, prayer is essential for the Christian. Jesus modeled the life of prayer as he got up very early in the morning and went off to deserted places to pray. We do the same at the individual level, but then we assemble together for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, our greatest prayer.

One of my favorite epistles is the first letter of St. Peter. It is full of practical advice for the Christian, and today's passage is no exception. He says, "[A]lthough now for a little while you may have to suffer through various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith, more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire, may prove to be for praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ." These may seem like harsh words for a church undergoing persecution, but it is the only way. Our trials, even today, are often a test of faith. The default response to trial is to avoid it at all costs. No one likes to be uncomfortable. But, in order for Jesus to bring about all righteousness, He had to suffer. The Cross was a means to an end, as Jesus says about his dear friend Lazarus, when his sisters sent word that Lazarus was ill, Jesus says, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it" (Jn. 11:4). So it is with our own trials. We glorify God in the midst of our suffering and the Lord delivers us to eternal life.

Jesus knew well that we would suffer in the Church. That is why He gave us the Sacraments as a means to mitigate our struggle. In today's Gospel, Jesus institutes the Sacrament of Reconciliation, saying to His disciples, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." So often we are bombarded with physical woes. These are very real, but sometimes, underlying these physical manifestations of suffering can be a spiritual brokenness—our need for God's mercy. Sin clouds our judgment, especially compulsive sin. But, the Lord Jesus gives us a way to break the pattern by coming to Him for mercy. So, today, on Divine Mercy Sunday, let us seek the Lord's mercy all the more, asking for His forgiveness and for the grace to help us stay on the path to holiness.

How to Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet

Through reciting the Divine Mercy Chaplet, Catholics reflect on the Passion of Jesus. While the Chaplet can be prayed at any time, it is especially powerful when prayed at 3pm, or “The Hour of Great Mercy” (the hour that Jesus died on the Cross). The Chaplet should also be prayed on ordinary Rosary beads.

Opening Prayer (optional):

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty yourself out upon us.

Repeat three times:

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in you!

Recite the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Apostles' Creed.

For each of the five decades:

On each "Our Father" bead of the rosary, pray:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, soul and divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On each of the 10 "Hail Mary" beads, pray:

For the sake of his sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Conclusion (repeat three times):

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Closing Prayer (optional):

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself. Amen.

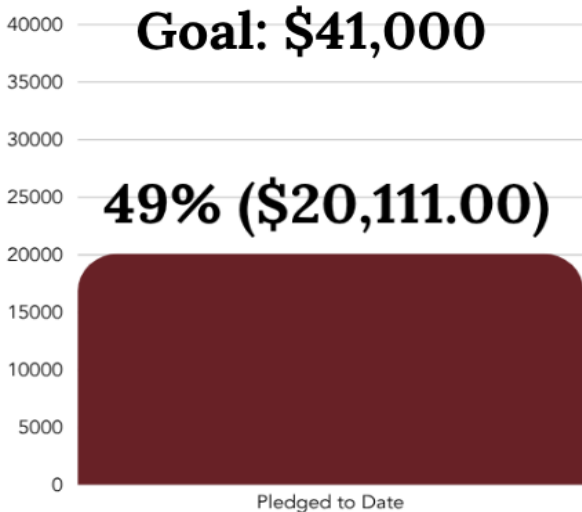

2026 Annual Catholic Appeal Progress



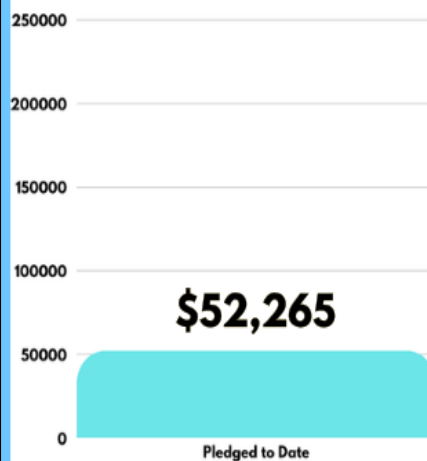
