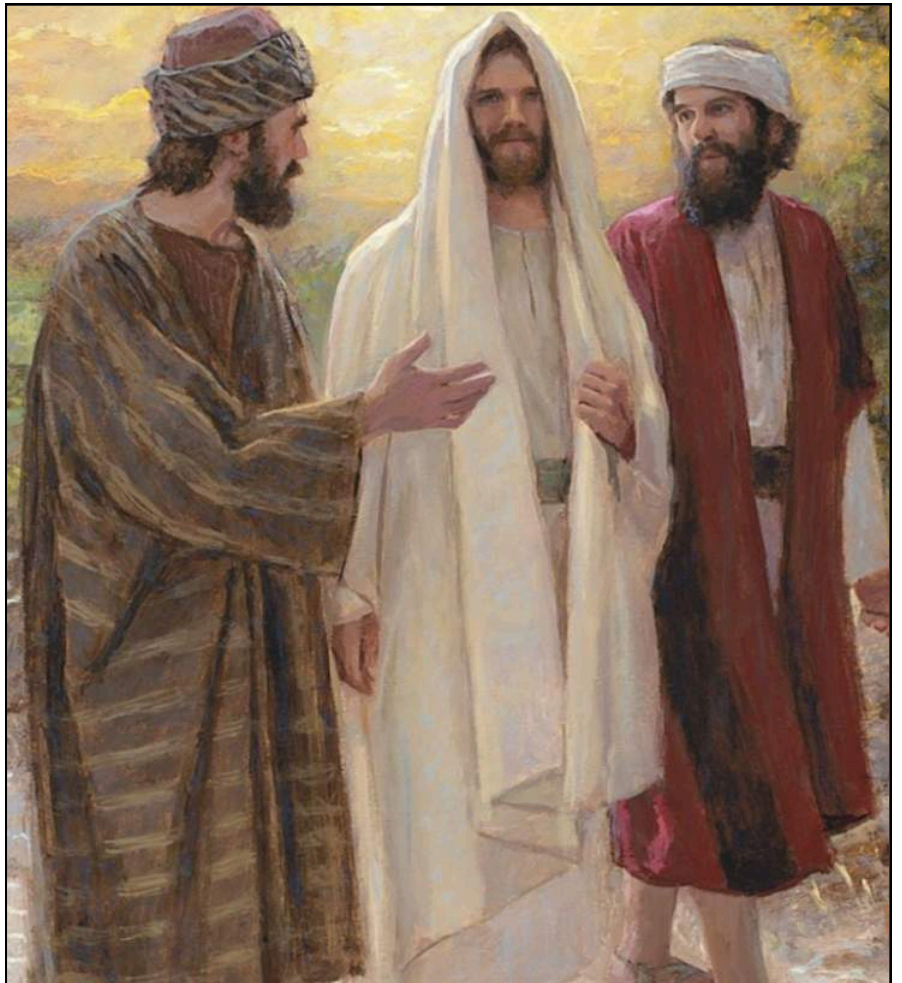

## From The Pastor's Desk



Grace and peace to you. Now that Spring is in full swing, all the trees, plants, and flowers are showing forth the beautiful array of new life all around us. Easter is all about new life in Christ. Just as Jesus was raised on the third day, our baptism raises us with Christ to new life. St. Peter emphasizes this in our readings from Acts. He says, "God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses. Exalted at the right hand of God, he received the promise of the Holy Spirit from the Father and poured him forth, as you see and hear." St. Peter was speaking to all the Jews in Jerusalem on the Feast of Pentecost, the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon all the apostles in the upper room. One of the gifts of the Holy Spirit is courage, and all the apostles took to the streets of Jerusalem to proclaim the Good News that Christ is Risen. May we follow their lead and continue to witness to the risen Lord with our lives.

This week, we have a special letter in the bulletin from Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M. inviting everyone to participate in our **Called By Name** vocations initiative. As many of you know, our former parochial vicar, Fr. Chris Colavito, is the Vocations Director for the Diocese, and he is asking every parish to prayerfully consider possible men in the congregation who may be potential candidates for the priesthood. Now is a time for prayer and discernment. Is God calling you to be a priest? Is God calling someone you know to be a priest? Ask the Holy Spirit to inspire clarity in this important area of Church life. Next week, **Called By Name** cards will be distributed in all the pews. We encourage you to fill one out, and drop it in the collection basket. We will mail your submission to the Diocese, who will then reach out to the candidate. As always, please pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into His harvest. Please join our parish Facebook page for digital content on this and many other topics.

Last week's Children's Easter Egg hunt was a blast. We had absolutely perfect weather and the children gathered up a bunch of eggs and prizes. Thank you to all who helped make the Easter Egg Hunt happen, especially our catechists and volunteers. Most of all, thank you to all the families who brought their children. A good time was had by all.

This weekend we have Fellowship Sunday after the 9AM and 11AM Masses. It is yet another opportunity for us to gather together as a parish family and share faith and fellowship. Special thanks to our wonderful volunteers who spend the extra time setting everything up.

This week's Gospel passage is known as the *Road to Emmaus*. St. Luke recounts for us the way in which Jesus appeared to a couple of His disciples when they were on the road to their home town of Emmaus. The disciples were devastated by what happened to Jesus and did not know what else to do besides return home. But, Jesus appears to them along the way. They were so depressed they did not recognize Jesus, but He explains the Scriptures to them about how it was necessary for the Christ to suffer so that He could enter into His glory. When they arrive to their destination, they invite Jesus to have supper with them. At supper, Jesus takes bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it to them. This is a very Eucharistic image, which is to say, while they did not recognize Jesus as he walked with them, they most certainly did at the breaking of the bread. At that moment their eyes were opened and they recognized Jesus, but He vanished from sight. They said, "Were not our hearts burning within us as he spoke to us along the way?" Indeed their hearts must have been burning because the source of all Truth was speaking directly to their hearts. The Scriptures, often described as God's love letters to the human race, speak this same truth. May our hearts also burn within us as we continue to reflect on the Resurrection of Jesus and His awesome presence in our midst whenever we celebrate the Eucharist.

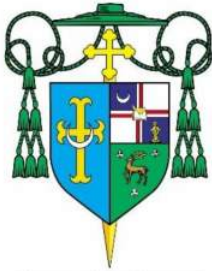

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

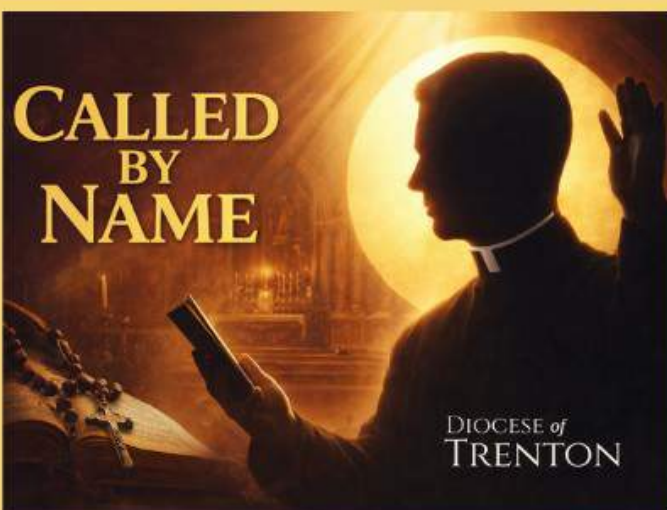
The Diocese of Trenton has been blessed with hundreds of wonderful priests throughout the last two centuries. To continue these blessings, I am announcing a **Called By Name** campaign for next weekend, **April 25 & 26**. *Fittingly, that weekend is also Good Shepherd Weekend.*

As your Bishop, I am asking you to prayerfully reflect on anyone that you may have encountered in the parish, at home, or even yourself, who you think may have a vocational call to the priesthood. Throughout the Diocese next weekend, our priests will be preaching on vocations and the call to the priesthood. Cards will be distributed throughout the pews and churches which will enable you to nominate or recommend a young man, with his contact information, whom you think might be called to the priesthood.

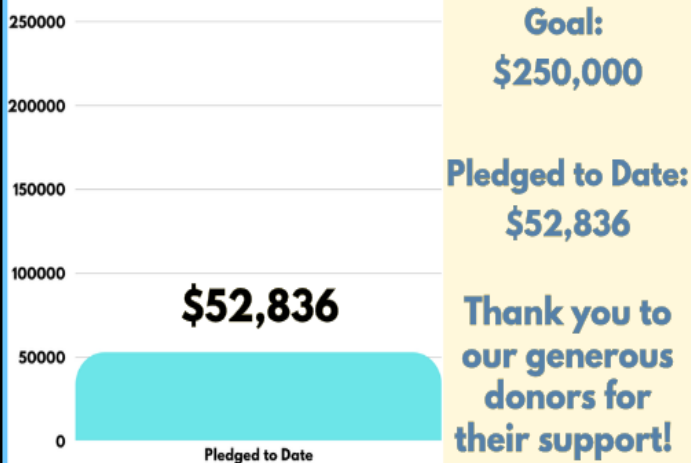

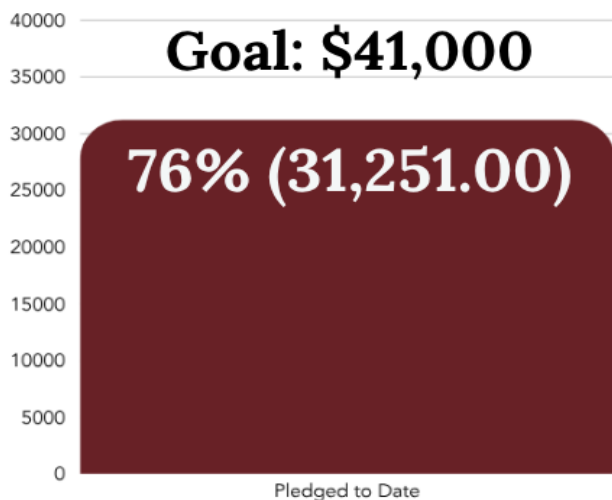

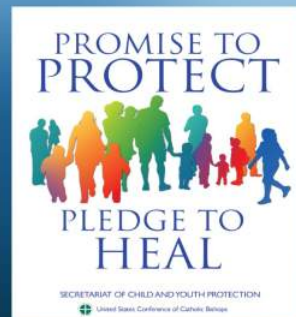

The Diocese of Trenton reports any allegations of sexual abuse to the appropriate law enforcement agencies.
