From The Pastor's Desk



May the Lord give you His peace. If there is anything Easter brings, it is hope in the Resurrection. This hope is for all who believe in Jesus. It was because of this hope that countless Christians were baptized by the blood of martyrdom. As St. Paul says, "Only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Rm. 5:7-8). In other words, no one deserves what Christ did for us, because we were all born with Original Sin. But, Christ died for us nevertheless, and opened the gates of heaven to all who believe through the sacrament of Baptism. This is the good news of the Gospel.

Hope is one of the three theological virtues of faith, hope, and love. In a sense, hope is linked with faith, which leads to love. As the author to the letter to the Hebrews says, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen" (Heb. 11:1). Our Christian journey begins with faith, continues in hope, and finds its deepest expression through love: Love of God, and love of neighbor. I sometimes feel like a broken record how often I mention this reality, but can we ever hear the words, "I love you," too much? Perhaps when dealing with a disordered love such as obsession, but when it comes to God, it is pure, unconditional love. Can we say we love God with the same kind of love God has for us? Or do we place conditions on our love for God? "Lord, if you give me X, I will love you more." Something to ponder as we find ourselves in the middle of a political, spiritual, and existential battle for our souls. Jesus says, "Blessed are the peacemakers." This is a simple teaching with profound impact. It has reverberated much in the news throughout the last week. Will we promote peace with Jesus, who said to his disciples, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me so I send you" (Jn. 20:21)? When the disciples received the Holy Spirit, they went out and boldly proclaimed the Good News. This activity continues through the successors of the apostles, the bishops, with the successor of St. Peter, at the helm. *Ave Christus Rex!*

This week, I would like to invite everyone to participate in our **Called By Name** vocations initiative. As many of you know, our former parochial vicar, Fr. Chris Colavito, is the Vocations Director for the Diocese, and he is asking every parish to prayerfully consider possible men in the congregation who may be potential candidates for the priesthood. Now is a time for prayer and discernment. Is God calling you to be a priest? Is God calling someone you know to be a priest? Ask the Holy Spirit to inspire clarity in this important area of Church life. **Called By Name** cards may be found in the pews. We encourage you to fill one out, and drop it in the collection basket. Please provide name, address, phone, and e-mail. Just names will not help us. We will mail your submission to the Diocese, who will then reach out to the candidate. As always, please pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into His harvest.

Next Friday, May 1, Very Rev. Martin O'Reilly, VF will be celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation for our religious formation students. The students have worked hard all year to prepare for their Confirmation. Please pray for these fine young men and women as they are sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit. May they continue to grow in virtue and in love of God and one another.

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday, and Jesus teaches his disciples that he is the gate for the sheep. It's a beautiful analogy between the King and His subjects. He says, "Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture." How do we enter through Christ? Baptism.

Today's passage from Acts is a lesson in boldly proclaiming baptism. St. Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, tells the people of Jerusalem that they are responsible for crucifying Christ: "Let the whole house of Israel know for certain that God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." Luke tells us they were cut to the heart and asked what they should do. St. Peter tells them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of their sins and receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. This message should resonate for all peoples, of every walk of life. Some time later, after having been arrested and thrown in prison for preaching the Name of Jesus, St. Peter is brought before the Sanhedrin, to whom he boldly proclaims: "There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved" (Acts 4:12). Thanks be to God for this glorious message of salvation. *Ave Christus Rex!*

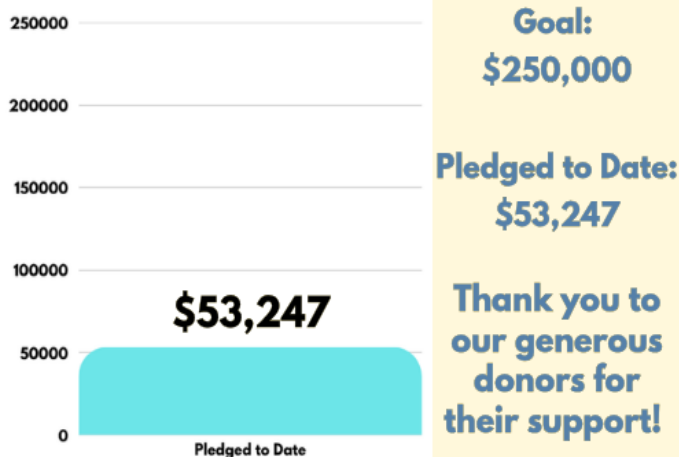

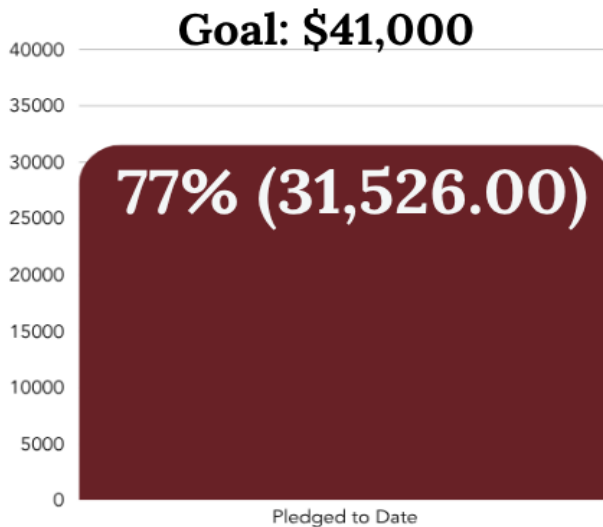

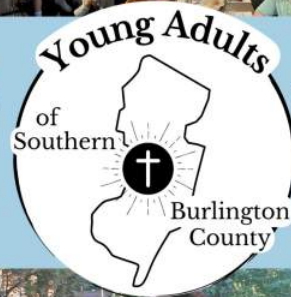
