# From The Pastor's Desk



Grace and peace to you. This is an important week in the life of the parish as we celebrate the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion for our Children's Religious Formation program. On Friday, we welcomed Very Rev. Martin O'Reilly, the Episcopal Vicar for Burlington, who administered the Sacrament of Confirmation. I have to say, every time I participate in the Rite of Confirmation, I am reminded of my own confirmation. I remember choosing my uncle to be my sponsor who fed me a steady stream of Bishop Sheen's Catholic Catechism on cassette tapes. Our Children's Religious Formation program seeks to provide the same solid foundation for our newly confirmed young men and women. As we tell each of them, this is not the end of their formation, but the true beginning. Now that they are fully initiated Catholics, they are called to practice their faith with deeper devotion to our Blessed Lord and the conviction to defend the faith at all costs.

We have two groups of children receiving their First Holy Communion on Sunday at the 11AM Mass: our second grade students, and those students participating in our catch-up class. Pictures of our students and some of their projects are on the white board in the Gathering Space. Please pray for our students as they continue to grow in their faith through the reception of Holy Communion. May they seek to conform their lives more and more after the pattern of Jesus.

Immediately following the 11AM Mass on Sunday, our First Holy Communicants will participate in the May Crowning of Our Lady of Grace statue in the Gathering Space. The month of May is dedicated to our Blessed Mother, who is the Mother of all mothers. This devotion began to take shape when Pope Clement VIII presented crowns for a Marian image at St. Mary Major in Rome. Later popes continued this practice. Outside of Rome, crownings also took place in major pilgrimage centers. The month of May is also a time when the faithful offer more fervent acts of prayer and devotion to the Blessed Mother. This ultimately led to the establishment of the Memorial of the Queenship of Mary on May 31 in 1954. After the Second Vatican Council, however, this feast was been moved to August 22, the octave day of the Solemnity of the Assumption. How might we more fervently honor Mary throughout the month of May?

Our Children's Religious Formation year has now come to a close. I want to thank Mr. David Barr, Mrs. Anna Lorang, and all of our volunteer catechists, aides, and hall monitors, who helped to make the 2025-26 year spectacular. Not only have our children grown in their faith, they learned valuable lessons through service, feeding the hungry, and praying for one another. I also want to thank all our parents for entrusting your children's religious formation to us. We have been growing our program to accommodate children with special needs, as well as those who need to catch up on years of missed classes. Our Junior OCIA group welcomes students seeking baptism or who are in need of completing their sacraments. For more information, please see our website. Registration for next year will be announced soon.

On this Fifth Sunday in Easter, we hear of the election of deacons to serve the people while the apostles devote themselves to the word of God. *Diakoni* is Greek for "servants." At the time, the apostles chose seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit of wisdom, to appoint to this task. For centuries in the Catholic Church, the Diaconate was simply a transitional state for young men on the path to priesthood, but after the Second Vatican Council, the Diaconate was restored as a proper and permanent rank of the hierarchy. Deacons serve at the altar as the minister of the Chalice. They also have faculties from the Bishop to celebrate the sacraments of Baptism, to preside at Weddings, and Funeral Services. In many ways, our deacons minister to us throughout our Christian lives, from baptism to our interment. They are with us as members of our community, as teachers, as confidants, as dads and granddads, and ultimately as servants at the Lord's Table. As we reflect on the important role of Deacons in the Church, let us pray for our own Deacon John Scanlon, that the Lord may continue to bless his ministry, and for all Deacons who serve throughout the Church.

Last week, we highlighted the **Called By Name** priestly vocations program. We invite you to place your cards in the collection basket as we can contact your candidates. At the same time, I'd like to invite any men of our congregation who may be discerning a call to the Diaconate to come talk to me or Deacon John. Is the Lord calling you to serve our parish? Let's discern it together.

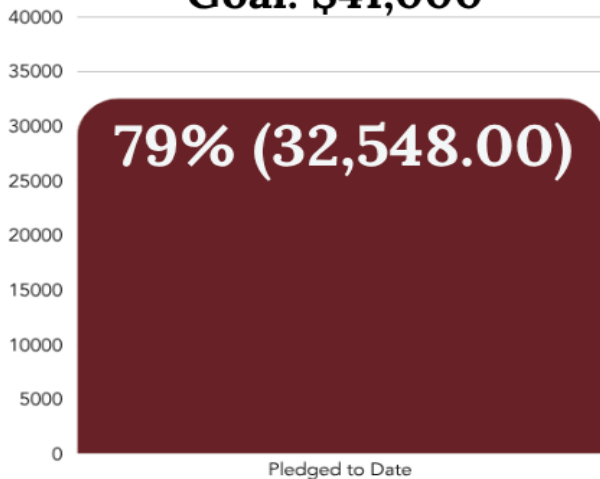

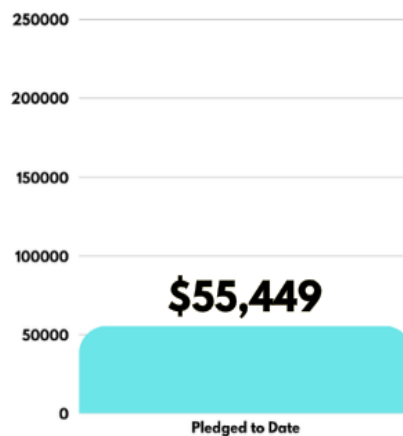
