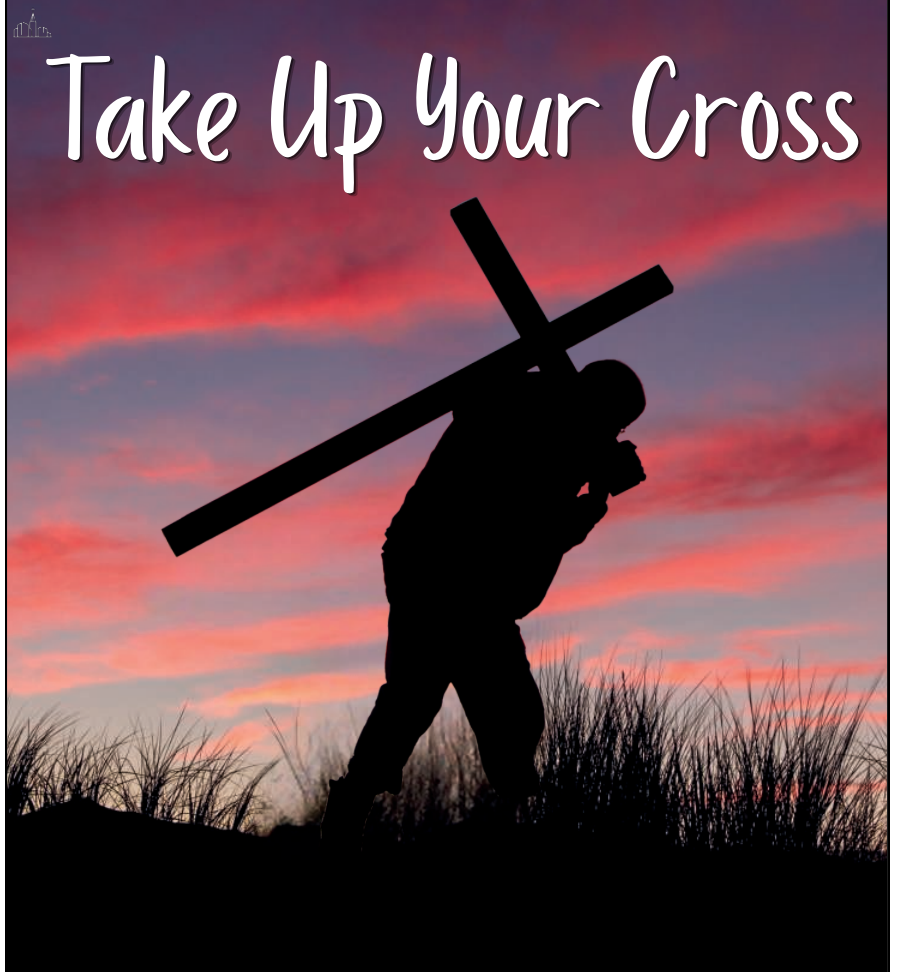

From The Pastor's Desk



May the Lord give you His peace. Now that the Summer Solstice has passed, the days are beginning to get shorter. As I mentioned in last week's letter, the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (June 24) marks the halfway point of our year, and six months until the Nativity of our Blessed Lord. The shortening of the days connects to what St. John the Baptist says about Jesus, "He must increase; I must decrease" (Jn. 3:30). St. John was indeed the voice crying out in the wilderness, making straight the way of the Lord, but also a great light pointing to Jesus. But, this light was merely the reflection of the true light that was coming into the world. So, St. John the Baptist gives way to the Lord Jesus who is Himself the revelation of God, full of grace and truth.

Next week we celebrate the Semiquincentennial (250th) Anniversary of the Declaration of the United States of America. We are offering American Flag Dedications for a donation of \$20. 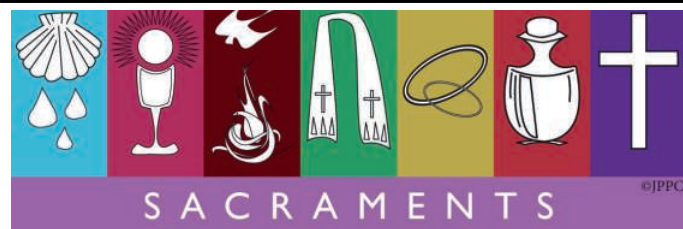
Vacation Bible School is July 20 - 24. The registration deadline is Wednesday, July 8. Please see the bulletin to sign your child(ren) up for a faith-filled week of learning and fun.

We are still hard at work behind the scenes obtaining estimates to replace the HVAC equipment. Obtaining multiple estimates takes time and persistence. I want to thank everyone who has already contributed to our Heat & Air Conditioning Fund. We have a long way to go to accomplish our goal. A little over 50 donors have pledged \$1000. We still need another 300 donors to do the same! Yes, even with grants and rebates, the equipment is expensive. But, once it is installed, we will be reducing our energy footprint, saving on monthly energy bills, and maintaining the comfort of our buildings. We need your support. To donate directly to this campaign, please visit givesij.org/heat or call the Parish Office. All \$1000 pledge donors will receive a St. Isaac's travel mug as a token of our appreciation. Lastly, installments are an option, so spreading the payments out over the next 6 months could be less than the cost of a tank of gas each week (~\$40/wk).

This weekend we celebrate the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our reading from the second book of Kings focuses on the hospitality extended to the prophet Elisha by a woman and her husband in the land of Shunem. Shunem had fertile grain fields and a natural spring, making it an ideal stop between Mt. Carmel and Samaria. For her hospitality in providing a room for Elisha, he told the woman of Shunem that she would be blessed with a child.

The theme of hospitality carries into the Gospel as Jesus says, "Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and whoever receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward." Jesus wants his disciples to know that they are to be hospitable toward one another, especially to little ones, that is, the newly baptized Christians, the neophytes. Not only is it our responsibility to ensure they are not scandalized by our own misdeeds, which should go without saying, we are to be hospitable towards them. As Jesus says, "Just so, the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mt. 20:28). This, of course, highlights St. Paul's theology in the second reading: "We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God." Through baptism, we have already died the first death, that is, death to sin, now we have new life in Christ. So, let us be hospitable to one another, encourage one another, support one another, defend one another, as we seek to follow Christ together. Our reward will be great in heaven!

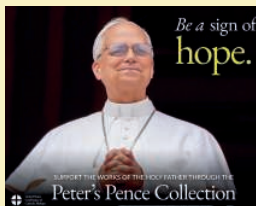

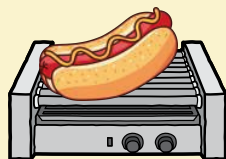
