From The Pastor's Desk



Praised be Jesus Christ! This weekend we celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. I would like to invite you to visit our website to watch a video produced by Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M. entitled *Our Shared Journey of Faith and Freedom: America at 250*. In this video, Bishop O'Connell highlights the many ways in which the Catholic Church has journeyed with the people of America throughout the years, promoting the values of life, liberty, and happiness, with faith. I know you will find our Bishop's words to be gratifying and encouraging.

Many of us remember the bicentennial celebration of our country in 1976. As a young boy, I remember collecting the "Drummer Boy" quarters, which highlighted the bicentennial year. The Bicentennial Wagon Train Pilgrimage saw Conestoga wagons from every state travel over 17,000 miles to converge at Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, where President Ford greeted participants. There was also a lot of merchandise for sale causing some to call the 200th year celebration the "buy-centennial".

In 2026, for the Semiquincentennial Anniversary, we have much of the same merchandise available, albeit through very different means. Big box stores are ubiquitous. And many items are purchased online. Of course, the prices are vastly different than they were in the 70's. The U.S. Mint is charging a fortune for Freedom Ringing Liberty Bell One-Half Ounce Silver Medals. Nevertheless, *The Unanimous Declaration of the Thirteen United States of America* (in its original printing), stands as the founding document of the American Constitutional Republic. Since then, we have sought to maintain the truths communicated so eloquently by our country's founders: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness." Of the 56 signers of the Declaration, the vast majority were Christians, save for Thomas Jefferson, Benjamin Franklin, and John Adams, who were Unitarian Universalists, often identified as Deists. Nevertheless, it would not have been possible for the above statement to have been written without the influence of Christianity or the Christian culture of Western Civilization.

There was only one Catholic who signed the Declaration of Independence, Charles Carroll of Carrollton. Born in Annapolis, Maryland, Carroll inherited vast agricultural estates and was regarded as the wealthiest man in the American colonies. In 1774, Carroll was elected to Maryland's committee of correspondence. This committee played an important role in coordinating communication and action among the colonies in response to British policies. Following his involvement in the committee, Carroll became a delegate to the Continental Congress in 1776, and continued to advocate for independence and represent Maryland's interests. While Carroll arrived too late to vote on the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, he signed the document in Philadelphia on August 2, 1776. Since he was the richest man in America, he had much to lose by identifying himself on the document. Nevertheless, he went on to become Maryland's first Senator and outlived every other signer of the Declaration, dying 56 years after its signing at the age of 95.

We have likely heard that the average empire lasts 250 years. What will the future bring for these united States of America? John Adams wrote in a letter to the Massachusetts Militia, "Because We have no Government armed with Power capable of contending with human Passions unbridled by morality and Religion. Avarice, Ambition, Revenge or Gallantry, would break the strongest Cords of our Constitution as a Whale goes through a Net. *"Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate to the government of any other"* (emphasis added). And so, in honor of the 250th Anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, let us be especially mindful of our Catholic faith, that we were not given freedom to do what we want when we want, but that our freedom has certain moral bounds that must be respected and upheld, even for the one standing on the other side of the aisle. And let us seek to uphold our God-given, unalienable rights to worship freely as the Lord has called us to do, not only on Sunday, but every day we walk in the land of the free, the home of the brave. God bless the united States of America!

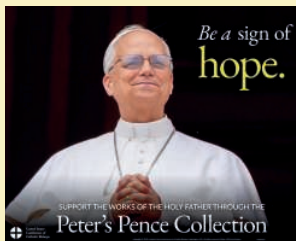

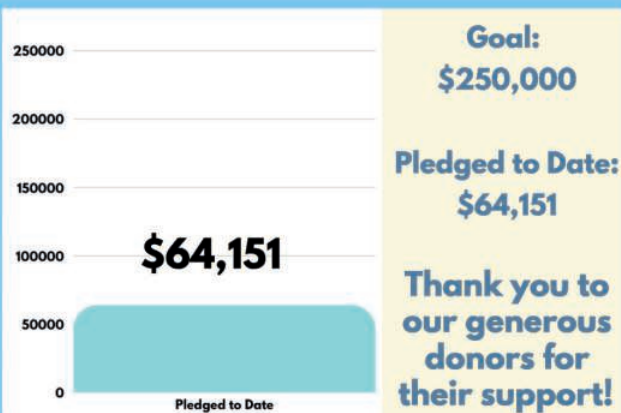
