From The Pastor's Desk



The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. It has been an awesome week of Vacation Bible School for all involved, especially our children. Each day, the children had different activities to help them grow in their faith. Among these were two liturgical high points as we all gathered together around the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration on Tuesday, and the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. In fact, culminating the week with Mass was indeed the summit of everyone's time together. The children had opportunities each day to play games outside and work on little projects. One project was to make something for someone special in their life. Another was to draw some colorful sidewalk art for our parishioners. All in all, it was a wonderful time and we look forward to the next time we can all be together. A special thank you to David Barr, Anna Lorang, and all our volunteers, including our many student volunteers. May the Lord bless you for all the good work.

This weekend we celebrate the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time. I love the passage from 1 Kings whereby the Lord appears in a dream to King Solomon, the son of David, and says, "Ask something of me and I will give it to you." And while Solomon could have asked for anything under the Sun, he instead asks for an understanding heart so that he may judge God's people and distinguish right from wrong. The Lord God grants his request, saying, "I give you a heart so wise and understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you there will come no one to equal you." If we were to reflect more deeply on Solomon's request, we would have to admit that there really is no greater gift on earth than wisdom. No one wants to be left in the dark. Ignorance is not bliss. It is a dreadful state to be in. But, as the ancient Greek philosopher Socrates once said, "I was conscious that I knew nothing at all....God only is wise" (Apology). Is it even possible for one to be truly wise? It would seem that the greatest wisdom is in admitting that we are not wise. Solomon expresses this humility, recognizing that the only way he could be truly wise is if God gives it to him. And so, the Lord blesses him with the gift of wisdom. So wise was king Solomon that the Queen of Sheba came all the way from Ethopia to Jerusalem to hear his wisdom and herself testified, "'The report I heard in my country about your deeds and your wisdom is true,' she told the king. 'I did not believe the report until I came and saw with my own eyes that not even the half of your great wisdom had been told me. You have surpassed the report I heard'" (2 Chron. 9:5-6).

The wisdom of Solomon is captured within the books of Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs. These Old Testament books are part of what scholars refer to as the Wisdom Books. The remaining books are Job, Wisdom, Sirach, and Psalms. Yes, even though it is a collection of hymns, the entire book of Psalms is considered Wisdom literature. This is significant since the book of Psalms is read almost entirely every four weeks in the Liturgy of the Hours, the official prayer of the Church. If you would like to learn more about the Liturgy of the Hours, join us for Vespers (Evening Prayer) as part of our First Friday Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus at 6PM every first Friday of the month.

In today's gospel, Jesus continues his teaching about the kingdom of heaven. Three more analogies for the kingdom of heaven are given: a buried treasure, a pearl of great price, and a net thrown into the sea. The first two show how best to respond to the proclamation of the kingdom, namely, sell everything you have to possess the kingdom. In other words, we are to go all-in on the kingdom. The third parable is not unlike last week's parable about the weeds and the wheat, only this time its fish. Good fish caught in heaven's net will be saved, while the bad fish will be thrown into the fiery furnace. Again, Jesus teaches this is how it will be at the end of the age. In other words, judgment will happen at the end of time, and those who have wicked deeds will go on to eternal punishment, while those who have done good deeds will go on to their eternal reward. May we all be caught up like a school of fish who move together as one body, the mystical Body of Christ unto eternal life.

Next weekend, Bethlehem Olive Wood Carvings will be available to purchase after all Masses. Almost every tourist hotel, restaurant, and souvenir shop in Bethlehem is closed now due to the Iran war. The Christian community represents just 1% of the West Bank Palestinian population, and continues to dwindle due to lack of jobs and opportunity. Hand carved olive wood works of art help to support the livelihood of our Catholic brothers and sisters remaining in Bethlehem in the Holy Land. They are a beautiful addition to the mantle or prayer shelf, and they make great gifts.

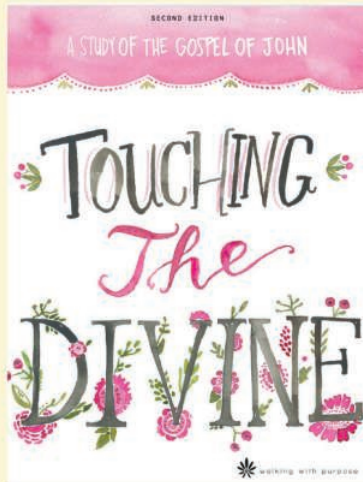

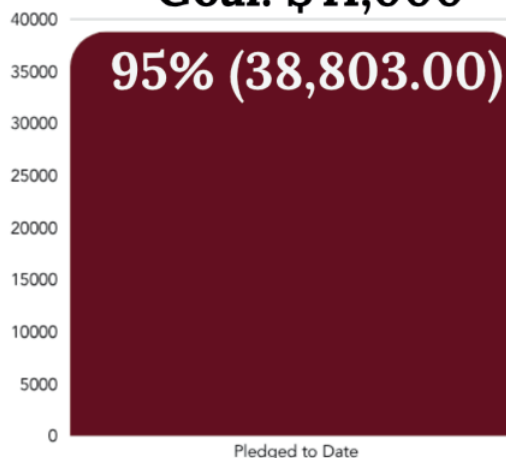

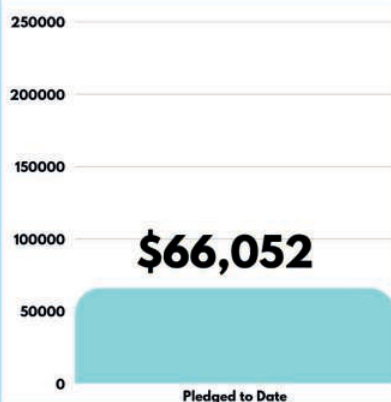
