From The Pastor's Desk



May the Lord give you His peace. The Summer truly is a glorious time of year. It's hard to imagine we were hit with a massive heat wave that burnt up all the grass. Thanks to the rain, the landscape is once again green and teeming with life. Maybe too much life—the same mosquito bit me four times on the same hand! Alas, I am reminded of my old pastor's comment about the groundhog that took a bite out of all his tomatoes, "They have to eat too." Personally, I draw the line with mosquitoes.

Of course, one of the primary sources for mosquitos is standing water, and there is lots of it around the perimeter of the property, particularly the drainage ditch running behind the priest's house to the back pond. Over the years the sides have eroded and slid down into the ditch creating high spots that prevent the water from making its way to the pond. These areas will need to be excavated so that the water can flow freely.

We continue to work on estimates for the HVAC system replacement. Once the last estimate is in, I will evaluate our options with the Finance Council before making a decision of how best to proceed. Fortunately, PSE&G offers a grant program to assist churches and businesses, which greatly reduces the total cost; however, it is already higher than my original "guesstimate". The good news is that every unit will be replaced with brand-new, more efficient models that should also reduce our monthly electric and gas bill. What is taking so long? It may come as a shock, but many companies have only one representative providing estimates for multiple vendors. The backlog is unreal. And when multiple vendors are asking for estimates on a custom unit, as is the case for our church, it adds even more time to the estimating process. I will keep everyone posted on progress as we wrap up the estimate phase.

Once again, we have another of my favorite Scripture passages in our first reading from 1 Kings. In the passage, Elijah arrives at mount Horeb (Sinai) where the Lord passes by. Elijah hears a strong wind, rocks being crushed, an earthquake, and a fire, but the Lord was not in any of these noisy things. After the fire, Elijah hears a tiny whispering sound and covers his face because he knows the Lord is present. If God is a tiny whispering sound, how are we managing the din of our everyday lives? Are we able to quiet ourselves down enough to hear the tiny whispering sound of God in our heart? Food for thought in our increasingly distracting world.

St. Paul laments how his own people, the Israelites, did not accept Christ. He says, "They are Israelites; theirs the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; theirs the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, is the Christ, who is over all, God blessed forever." St. Paul summarizes all the ways in which God was drawing them to Christ. Of course, the best part is that the invitation remains open to this day. Jesus says, "Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to me, because I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me" (Jn. 6:37-38). And in another place, "blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it" (Lk. 11:28b). This brings us right back to the quiet whispering sound of God, which brings me to an old Jewish adage: "We have two ears and one mouth so we can listen twice as much as we speak."

In the Gospel, Jesus seems to ignore a pagan woman asking for his help. The disciples even tell him to send her away. He reassures them that he was sent first to the children of the lost sheep of Israel. In other words, his primary mission was to the chosen people, the Israelites. But, what if a Gentile needs his help? Jesus qualifies that she is a woman of faith and grants her request. Once again, we have a message of persistence in prayer. A prayer is an earnest petition, and the woman makes several attempts before finally being granted her request. Is it not the same with us? Do we persist in prayer? Do we believe that Jesus can give us exactly what we need when we need it? As Jesus says to Jairus, the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid. Just have faith."

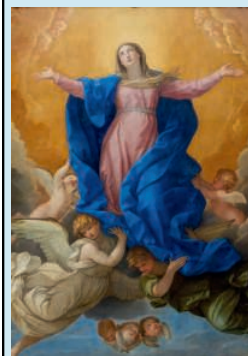

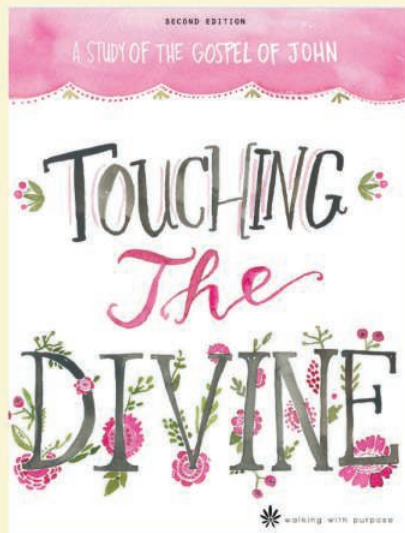

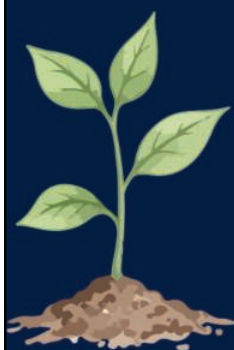
