From The Pastor's Desk



Praised be Jesus Christ! It gives me great pleasure to announce that our Tabernacle Project has been completed. As you may have already noticed, the tabernacle has a new place of prominence in the center of the sanctuary. According to the Second Vatican Council document *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, an emphasis was made regarding the nobility, placement, and safety of the tabernacle: "These laws refer especially to the worthy and well planned construction of sacred buildings, the shape and construction of altars, *the nobility, placing, and safety of the eucharistic tabernacle...*" (Par. 128). And according to the Statutes of the Fourth Synod of the Diocese of Trenton (2014), "In each parish church, the Eucharist shall be reserved in a prominent place, *preferably the center of the sanctuary*, which is conducive to both community devotion and individual prayer" (274). From a liturgical perspective, the proximity of the tabernacle to the main altar helps maintain the centrality of the Eucharist. Having the tabernacle in the center of the sanctuary conveys that Christ is the center of our church; Christ is the center of our lives. I want to thank all those who contributed to this project so that the entire parish may benefit.

A closer observation of the new altar of repose will reveal that it has the same stain as the sanctuary wood paneling. This has made for a seamless transition between the half wall and the new altar. The mensa (table top) of the altar has been finished with the same color granite as the main altar and ambo, providing continuity throughout the space. The front of the altar of repose features carved images of the Lamb of God flanked by two angels in adoration. In church architecture, the Nave of the church represents earth, while the sanctuary represents heaven. As St. John reports in his vision of heaven: "I looked again and heard the voices of many angels who surrounded the throne and the living creatures and the elders. They were countless in number, and they cried out in a loud voice: 'Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, honor and glory and blessing'" (Rev. 5:11-12). The image of the angels adoring the Lamb of God shows us the proper disposition we are to have towards Jesus, Who is truly and substantially present in the Most Blessed Sacrament. This brings me to the tabernacle.

The sharp eye will notice how the tabernacle has been completely refinished. As I mentioned in previous letters, the original finish was treated with chemicals that removed the lacquer and caused the tabernacle to tarnish, particularly the silver panels. The tabernacle was completely disassembled, with over 300 individual parts hand polished and re-plated with 24k gold. The finish looks amazing under the church lights and provides a dwelling fit for the King of the Universe.

I invite everyone to join in genuflecting to our Blessed Lord in the newly installed tabernacle. The traditional practice of genuflecting before entering and exiting the pew (or bowing for those unable to genuflect) is our own way of acknowledging the Real Presence of Jesus in the tabernacle. At a time when the world is so distracted and disjointed, God knows we need something solid in our lives. Jesus Christ is *the stone rejected by the builders, which has become the cornerstone*. As St. Peter says, "There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved" (Acts 4:12). Thanks be to God we have this wonderful dwelling of Christ at the center of our church. He is our Rock, our Foundation, the Glory of Father, as St. John puts so beautifully: "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth" (Jn. 1:14). We, too, see the glory of God, whenever we celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. So, let us join with St. Paul who exclaims: "[Christ], though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Phil. 2:6-11).

Music Notes

About Gregorian Chant:

Gregorian chant is the sacred, unaccompanied, single-voice sung prayer of the Roman Catholic Church. While legend has it that these chants were written by Pope Gregory I (hence the title, *Gregorian*), most experts agree that the chants were first developed and originally sung by Catholic Carolingian monks around 500 or 600 A.D. By 800 AD, the Frankish King Charlemagne, with the cooperation of his contemporary popes, pushed for Gregorian chant to be the standard form of musical liturgical worship in the church. It remained such for over a thousand years. While these chants originally were passed down through generations by memorized oral performance, in the 900th century, Frankish monks began developing a system to record these chants through a new written musical notation called *neumes*. These neumes served as the basis for the modern western music notation.

For 1500 years, Gregorian chant has been heard throughout the world in churches, monasteries, seminaries, and all places of worship. The predominant form of music in the Catholic church for the majority of the church's history, and still today in most countries, chant is recognized and celebrated for its deep reverence, ancient and pure origins, ability to repel evil and draw us closer to our Lord, and its unifying power throughout the Catholic Church.

The current authority of the church in both *Sacrosanctum Concilium* and *Musicam Sacram*

(Vatican II) explicitly states that Gregorian chant holds "pride of place" in the liturgy. As Pope Saint Pius X says, *"the more closely a composition for church approaches in its movement, inspiration and savor the Gregorian form, the more sacred and liturgical it becomes; and the more out of harmony it is with that supreme model, the less worthy it is of the temple."*

The translations for the chants heard in this week's masses are as follows:

Offertory:

Expectans expectavi dominum. Et respexit me et exaudivit deprecationem meam, et immisit in os meum um canticum novum, hymnum Deo nostrum.

I waited patiently for the Lord, and He turned to me and heard my supplication; and He put a new song into my mouth, a hymn to our God.

Communion:

De fructu operum tuorum, Domine, satiabitur terra: ut educas panem de terra, et vinum laetificet cor hominis: ut exhilarat faciem in oleo, et panis cor hominis confirmet.

The earth will be satisfied by the work of your hands, O Lord, as you bring forth bread from the land and wine to gladden the heart of man; oil to make his face shine, and bread to strengthen man's heart.

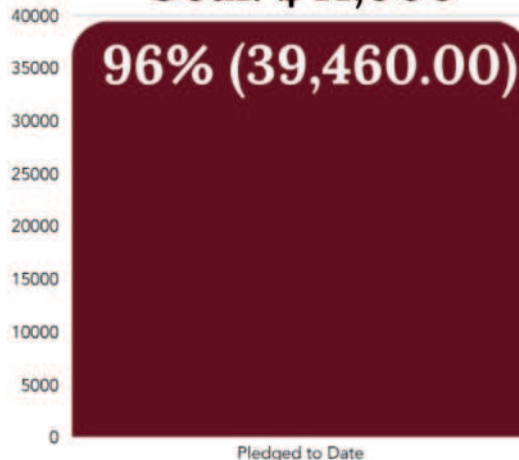

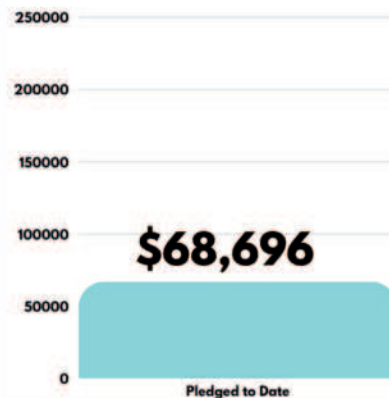

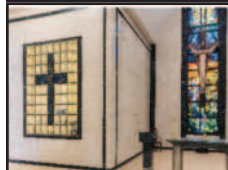
