From The Pastor's Desk



Grace to you and peace. Last week I announced the new location for our Tabernacle, which is now in the sanctuary. The new altar and the refinishing of the tabernacle was made possible by the generous donations of several of our parishioners. We are so grateful for their gifts, which have not only added to the beauty of the sanctuary, but also help to draw us more deeply into the mystery that is the Real Presence of our Blessed Lord. Now, when we enter and exit our pews, we genuflect (or bow, for those unable to genuflect) in adoration of Jesus, Who is truly and substantially present in the Tabernacle.

This week, I want to draw our attention to the previous location of the tabernacle, which has become our new Marian Shrine. The beautiful statue of Our Lady of Good Remedy was donated earlier this year and has found a new place of prominence in the center of the room, where we can venerate her image and pray our Rosaries and Novenas in a dedicated space.

Our Lady of Good Remedy was a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in honor of her intercession in the founding and mission of the Trinitarian Order in the late 12th century France. To fund their mission, the Trinitarians relied on donations, placing their fundraising efforts under the patronage of Mary. Their efforts were remarkably successful, with thousands of captives freed over the centuries. In gratitude for her miraculous assistance, St. John of Matha bestowed upon Mary the title "Our Lady of Good Remedy"—a name reflecting on her role as the source of spiritual and material help in times of need.

I can't help but consider the French connection between Our Lady of Good Remedy and our own patron St. Isaac Jogues. St. Isaac loved the Blessed Mother, and was influenced deeply by the devotion to Our Lady of the Way, a title associated with the Jesuit tradition and the spiritual journey of missionaries. May Our Lady of Good Remedy be our companion along the way of our Christian journey. May she bring us comfort and solace, may she show us the way to her Son, Jesus, and may she provide remedy for all our needs.

You may have also noticed our new candle stands in front of Our Lady of Good Remedy. No shrine is complete without candles! Why do we light candles? In most every part of Catholic celebrations and rituals, lighting of candles play a very significant role. Candles are lighted during the celebration of the Mass, in liturgical processions and evening prayer ceremonies. Candles are lit before the Tabernacle to signify the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament and to call for reverence on the part of the faithful.

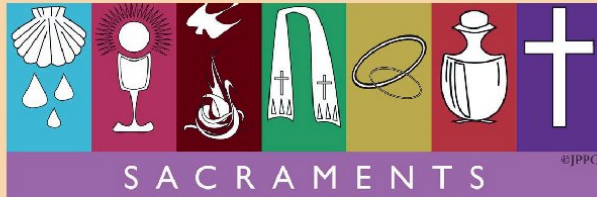
In Judaism, a perpetual light was kept burning in the Temple and the synagogues not only to insure the ability to light other candles or oil lamps in the evening but also to show the presence of God (Exodus Sanctuary Lamp 27:20-21 and Leviticus 24:2-4). Christians adapted the use of lit candles for Mass, liturgical processions, evening prayer ceremonies, funeral processions, and, again, to show reverence to the reserved Blessed Sacrament. Moreover, there is evidence that lit candles or oil lamps were burned at the tombs of saints, particularly martyrs, by the 200s, and before sacred images and relics by the 300s.

In our Catholic tradition, in early times as well as today, light has a special significance — Christ. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12) and "I came into the world as light, so that everyone who believes in me might not remain in darkness." (John 12:46). As in early Christian times, we light a candle before a statue or sacred image of our Lord or of a saint. Of course, we do not honor the statue or the image itself, but whom that statue or image represents. The light signifies our prayer offered in faith coming into the light of God— allowing us to be filled with His light. With the light of faith, we petition our Lord in prayer, or petition the saint for intercession— to pray with us and for us to the Lord. The light also shows a special reverence and our desire to remain present to the Lord in prayer even though we may depart and go about our daily business.



With the addition of the new candle stands, there are 24 spots on the upper tier for **Annual Intention Candles**. For a donation of \$300, these large candles may be reserved for the year as a memorial for a deceased loved one, or for your special intentions. That is less than \$1 a day to keep the candle burning constantly before Our Lady. These candles are available "first come, first served". To reserve one, please contact Elizabeth in the Parish Office. She may be reached at **856-797-0999 x101** or by e-mail at bulletin@cosij.org. The deadline is September 30, 2026. The annual intention candle reservation concludes October 1, 2027. At that time, it may be renewed or opened up to others. Let us continue to lift one another up in prayer.

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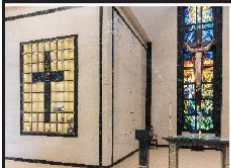
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
