The customary pre-Mass Rosary will begin a few minutes early, around 7:50 AM. We will conclude the Holy Hour with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 8:10 AM. Mass will begin at 8:30 AM as usual.

Why do Catholics ____? Your Lenten questions answered

Why don't Catholics eat meat on Fridays during lent?

Abstaining from meat on Fridays is a common practice of penance and remembrance of our Lord's death on Good Friday. This penitential practice is rooted in the Church's tradition of fasting and abstinence during the Lenten season. By giving up meat—often considered a symbol of luxury—Catholics engage in self-discipline and reflect on Christ's ultimate sacrifice.

Why don't Catholics Sing the Alleluia during Lent?

When Roman Catholics observe Lent, Catholics omit using the word "alleluia" until the Lenten fast ends and the Church celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus. "Alleluia" is a joyful expression of praise and thanksgiving. Its absence during the weeks of Lent underscores the season's somber mood, allowing for a more intentional focus on repentance, self-discipline, and spiritual contemplation. The word is reintroduced with great festivity during the Easter Vigil, celebrating the triumphant victory of Christ over sin and death.

Why do Catholics practice prayer, fasting, and almsgiving?

This period of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving fosters spiritual growth by holistically deepening our relationship with God. Through prayer, Catholics draw closer to God. By fasting, Catholics detach from worldly comforts and redirect our focus toward the Lord. Refraining from certain foods or activities as an act of penance is often associated with Jesus' 40-day fast in the wilderness. Almsgiving involves acts of charity, kindness, and generosity—particularly toward those in need—as a concrete expression of compassion. By giving to the less fortunate, Catholics participate in the mission of social justice and demonstrate a commitment to serving others, mirroring the teachings of Jesus to care for the marginalized and vulnerable.

In addition to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, there are several other ways to prioritize spiritual growth during Lent:

- Stations of the Cross: Participating in the Stations of the Cross is a traditional Lenten devotion that involves meditating on Jesus' Passion. This practice allows us to reflect deeply on the suffering of Christ.
- 2. **Bible Study:** Engaging in regular Bible study during Lent provides an opportunity to delve into Scripture, gaining insights into God's Word and his plan for salvation. Reading and meditating on passages related

- to the Passion and Resurrection can contribute significantly to spiritual growth.
- 3. Remembering Jesus: Take a few intentional moments each day for silence to reflect in gratitude on Christ's life, remembering Jesus, the significance of his sacrifice, and the redemption offered through his Resurrection.


- Gallon zip lock bags (This is what we pack the items in)
- Gloves- individually purchased or bought on Amazon in bulk.
- Hats- individually purchased or bought on Amazon in bulk.
- Hand warmers
- Socks- black athletic, men and women's, we can never have too many socks.
- Snacks- individually wrapped and non perishable
- Granola bars (not Nutrigrain, they crumble too easily)
- Squeeze pouch apple sauce
- Crackers- any kind, peanut butter, cheese, BJ's has a nice big pack.
- Fruit gummies
- Kool aid pouches or juice boxes
- Rice Krispy treats
- Small individual purse size tissues
- Gift cards to Wal-Mart and or BJ's. We do a lot of bulk shopping there.
- Amazon gift cards- this is where we get Mylar blankets, tissues, hand warmers, bulk gloves and hats.
- 30 gallon trash bags- these help to keep the homeless community's things dry. They appreciate them.

Rooted In Scripture The Catholic Faith Explained Sacred Scripture & The Catechism



[Mark 1:12-15 RSV] The Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. And he was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels ministered to him.

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel."



CCC 540: Jesus' temptation reveals the way in which the Son of God is Messiah, contrary to the way Satan proposes to him and the way men wish to attribute to him. This is why Christ vanquished the Tempter for us: "For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sinning." By the solemn forty days of Lent the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert.

All the Comforts of Home

Our society over the centuries has adapted and overcome many obstacles in our efforts to conquer the wilderness. We build homes with the ability to cook inside and deliver water without going out to the well. We carry devices that can communicate that there has been an accident or that we are lost. Even most cell phones now include the ability to use the camera flash as a light when you drop your car keys under the vehicle. When you stop to think about it we now have a dedicated industry to making the outdoors as comfortable as being indoors. We call it camping. From the day we left the garden we have been designed to seek comfort and shelter. After all, the more rested man is able to provide and live another day. My family and I are guilty of what we call "glamping" or fancy camping. We have our camper to keep us out of the elements and we drive it out into the woods on a weekend to set up camp. We bring our gas fireplace, microwave, tv, and most importantly indoor plumbing. The thought of us spending 40 days in the wilderness, doesn't seem like much of a challenge in today's context.

But what happens when we go out a little further? Beyond the nearest KOA or Yoqi Bear, what do we encounter? When we go out beyond what is comfortable and into uncharted woods, we enter into what can be a very challenging time if not properly equipped. So how do we best prepare for a challenge like this? We pack for the worst and hope for the best. But in life we know that we cannot and do not always have what we need at the ready. What is it they say about the best laid plans? Life has a way of getting us off track. Maybe it is a cancer diagnosis, or an expensive home repair, a bad relationship, or anything in between. Life happens and we think that we are all alone. That no one has faced what we are facing. In these moments Satan appears to us and is veiled in what seems like an easy solution to a difficult problem. A predatory loan, or a bargain product for a quick healing, and we are tempted most when we are isolated. We cry out to into the desert God begging for help, desperately wanting this trial to end and hoping that He hears

If God was really there he would heal my Mother. If God really cared he would give me a winning lottery ticket. If God really loved me this life wouldn't be so hard. This is the enemy talking. This is the way in which Satan approached Jesus. Our Catechism tells us that "This is why Christ vanquished the Tempter for us: "For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sinning."" Jesus has been where you are! And no matter how bleak the situation gets, just when you think it couldn't possibly get any worse—Jesus offered it all to his Father and died—so that you might live. In my own life I lose track of this. The phrase, "you can't see the forest through the trees" comes to mind.

As we enter Lent, let us clear our hearts and minds. Let us head away from what is comfortable and known. Let this be the Lent we face the wilderness and say NO to the calls of this world. We know that what is awaiting us in the next has so much more to offer us than what satisfaction we can find here. Lent is a wonderful period of practice. A time of flexing and growing our spiritual muscles, and while there are things in this world that do make life more tolerable, are we equipped to survive when we must do without? We call it practicing the faith because it is not a one time commitment but rather a discipline that must be renewed and engaged every day. Are we ready to face our temptations in the desert with courage? Do we have the faith to know that Jesus has cleared the way before us? Remember after the trial was over and he said no to sin, the angels came and refreshed him. God never leaves us alone.


