A Note From Our Pastor V. Rev. Daniel Greenleaf

Dear Parishioners,

Lent is underway, and it is always a great time of year for me to reset. It is a busy time of year for priests as the devotions and spiritual exercises increase, but it is what I consider a "good busy." So many people in our parish take this time to heart and so it really encourages me to step it up as well. Together, we help each other in the ways of faith. Christ called people together, which means together we encounter the Lord. It is my hope that they come to see the importance of community in this increasingly individualist and lonely world. I pray that the small faith sharing groups in the parish are helping with the connections on a spiritual level that is so necessary for healthy faith lives.

The tower at Holy Family is wrapped and ready for the wet and cold spring. It was a year ago when we had the terrible rainstorm and then the flash flood that caused the façade of the tower to break apart. My goal is put a plan in motion to make sure that the exterior of Holy Family Church is cared for given our Maine weather. Freezing water causes havoc on sandstone unless it is sealed on a regularly scheduled basis. We all experience the high prices of buildings so preventive maintenance has to be our plan going forward.

The Prince of Peace Adoration Chapel is coming along. I had a good dose of reality having to deal with all the building and fire codes we had to meet. This means that the chapel will be a bit smaller than we had hoped, but it will feel intimate, and it will be beautiful. This week, they removed part of the door where the steps were making access fully handicapped accessible. I am praying that everyone will love the chapel and that they will not want to leave it like Peter did not want to leave when he experienced the Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor, which happens to be next week's readings.

I hope that your Lent is off to a good start, and it will be a time of renewal in the faith.

5. Questions for discussion for all to share.

Why would Jesus reveal his glory and who he is to the three disciples?

Was there ever a time when a powerful experience left you silent?



Seminarian Reflection

A Reflection on Luke 4:1-13: 1st Sunday of Lent

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is tempted by Satan in the desert after fasting for forty days. His temptations parallel those of Eve in the Garden: lust of the flesh ("Turn these stones to bread" vs. the fruit being "good for food"), lust of the eyes (offering Jesus the world's kingdoms vs.the fruit being "pleasing to the eyes"), and pride of life (calling Jesus to prove His divinity vs. the fruit being "desirable for gaining wisdom"). Unlike Eve, Jesus resists by relying on Gods's Word.

As Lent begins, we combat these temptations through prayer (humility over Pride), fasting (self-control over fleshly desires), and almsgiving (Generosity over greed).

As the Holy Spirit helped Jesus in the desert for forty days, we also ask the Holy

Spirit to lead us how to live forty days of Lent, so that we may assure victory over the threefold concupiscence as Jesus did in this Sunday's Gospel.




