A Note From Our Pastor V. Rev. Daniel Greenleaf

Dear Parishioners,

Our Adoration Chapel is now open and ready for visits. I have so many people to thank for such a beautiful place for us to pray and spend time in the Sacramental Presence of our Lord. It is my hope that it will become the MINISTRY of our parish, prayer, and all-day long people will find it a place of quiet refuge in what can be a crazy world at times. Please consider signing up for one hour a week so that we can always have someone praying in the chapel when it is open. There is no question that God will not be outdone in generosity and for that one hour of prayer that you give to the Lord you will in return have more time available than you gave and more graces than you deserve. More to come on this ministry.

Our country is still in shock with the assassination of Charlie Kirk and there is a lot of discussion around it even as I write this note. I often watched Charlie on YouTube, and I was very impressed with his courage and willingness to take on the controversial topics in today's very volatile environment. I think he was spot on in many answers he gave. Moreover, I believe in dialogue and the freedom to express one's belief. You can love a person who has different beliefs. You can accept people without accepting their lifestyle choices. Since the assassination, there have been loud cries for the death penalty. As a Catholic, I reassert the position and believe wholeheartedly that the death penalty must be taken off the table. For sure, this was an evil act, and it is wrong to rejoice in what happened, like so many of his opponents are doing. It is a sin to rejoice over someone else's pain and loss. However, the answer is not more killings. Revenge and retribution are not Christ-like values, and we must stand for the belief that only God gives life and only God takes it.

We are moving things out of the Churches of Holy Cross and Our Lady of the Rosary. I have assembled a team of parishioners at Our Lady of the Rosary to help decide where things should go for that Church, and it is a little slower for Holy Cross since St. Dominic School is still using the Church building. From time to time, I will put in the bulletin the final decisions of where things will go for your information and to be as transparent as possible. Icon Prayer Service

On Wednesday, October 1st at 6 PM at Holy Trinity Church the Knights of Columbus Councils of the Prince of Peace Parish are hosting a Sacred Heart Holy Hour featuring an icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome. The reproduction bears the blessing of Pope Francis, through the Papal Almoner, and is one of more than 300 icons traveling across the world, from council to council, for veneration and use in prayer services.

The Sacred Heart Holy Hour includes readings from Sacred Scripture and reflections from Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart, as well as the Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayers to the Sacred Heart and time for silent prayer.


A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR FOR CATECHESIS

SACRAMENTS & FORMATION

FOR INFANTS & CHILDREN

Children under the age of seven are baptized on the faith and promises of the parents and godparents. During the baptism, parents vow to raise up their child in the faith as best they can. We have a few ways to help you in this.

BAPTISMAL PREPARTION

There are 4 easy steps to having your child baptized.

- 1) Register online and schedule a meeting with a priest.
- 2) Complete our online preparation.
- 3) Email us your forms and completion certificate.
- 4)Schedule the big day.

MAKING MUSIC PRAYING TWICE

A joyful music class for children ages 0-5.

Using the liturgical calendar as a guide, these sessions occur throughout the year on Thursday at Holy Trinity Church in Lisbon Falls, following the 8:30AM daily Mass and brunch.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Hearing the Word of God during Sunday Mass. For children ages 3-8. Sitting through Mass with little ones can be challenging, and that's okay—we are grateful your family is here. Children's Liturgy of the Word gives young children a chance to hear God's Word in a way they can understand, while you remain in the church to be nourished by the same Word. It helps them grow in faith—and gives you space to be fed, too.

BAPTISM FOR OLDER CHILDREN

Once a child reaches the age of seven, the Church considers them to have reached the age of reasonable to discern right from wrong and to begin taking responsibility for their actions. Children seeking Baptism after this age prepare through the process of Christian Initiation, which includes a period of formation and special rites celebrated during Sunday Mass throughout the year, echoing how the early Church formed new disciples. Contact us to learn more and explore what this journey could look like for your family.



As your child enters the 1st grade it is time to start preparing for them to complete their sacraments of initiation. This is a two-year program consisting of weekly lessons and two retreats per year. Our groups meet in all three churches on Sunday Mornings and are parent involved. SUNDAY SCHOOL GRADES 3-5

After children receive their First Communion and Confirmation in 2nd grade, we continue building upon that foundation using the Word of Life curriculum from the Augustine Institute. Children naturally yearn for God, and we seek to nurture that desire—guiding them through Sacred Scripture and Tradition, looking at the lives of the saints, modeling the rhythm of the liturgical calendar, and helping families celebrate a life well lived in community and the sacraments.

YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY


