### A Note From Our Pastor V. Rev. Daniel Greenleaf

Dear Parishioners,

October is the month of the Rosary, and we would like to introduce it to families as a way to pray together. After certain weekend Masses for the month of October, we will invite all the children near the Blessed Mother statue for one decade of the Rosary for the family. Please consider joining us after Mass to pray in honor of the Blessed Mother. Our goal this month is to get rosaries into as many hands as possible and to reintroduce it as a standard part of the prayer life of Catholics. Also, if you are reading this before Saturday morning, please come and join us for the Rosary Rally as we walk downtown Lisbon Falls and pray the Rosary in public.

Speaking about prayer, I hope that you got a chance to visit our Adoration Chapel. It has been so heartwarming to see people entering the chapel all day long. This is a beautiful testimony to the faith in our parish. Please consider making a commitment to go on a regular basis to the chapel to pray. Years ago, the churches were open for a quick little visit, but now, times have changed, and it is impossible to keep things unattended. Now with the generosity of adorers, two people each hour have committed to remain with the Blessed Sacrament so that anyone can come in for a short prayer on the way to and from home, from work, during a lunch break, or in the evenings. It is truly a great gift the adorers are offering our parish. Please take advantage of it and think about committing to one hour a week yourself.

Finally, we pray for members of the Church in Michigan who have experienced the shooting and fire. Whenever I hear about these tragedies, it takes me back to our own experience here in Lewiston. Moreover, it seems that there is a rise in attacks on religious groups and religious ideas. It is very sad that we are at a point where we say, "another shooting." This is the direct result of no dialogue and fostering hate. This seems to be the norm in our polarized and extremist-driven society. Now, if you listen to the media and indulge in social media pushed by algorithms, you cannot help but take on what they push by using sensationalism for profit. I wish we had a release valve on this pressure cooker society we are fostering. It feels like sooner or later the top will be blown off. If you find yourself having out-of-control and persistent anger because of what the "left" or the "right" are saying and doing, please seek spiritual and emotional help. 
#### Forming a Habit of Prayer

Praying the Rosary as a family won't always be neat and quiet — children fidget, thoughts wander, and five decades can feel long. But even in the mess, grace is flowing. What matters is that you begin, together, and let God's presence grow in your home through Mary and the life of Jesus.

#### **Getting Started:**

- Get the whole family on board both spouses must commit, or the children will sense hesitation.
- Start with one decade don't force all five at

- Pick a regular time after dinner, before bed, or even in the car.
- Create a simple prayer space a candle, crucifix, and a basket of rosaries.



### October is the Month of the Rosary



How the Blessed Mother always leads us to Jesus.

Prayer can feel intimidating. Starting out, or being asked to pray in public, is a little like asking a friend for help or finding the courage to invite someone to dance. It takes trust that the other will respond.

As we begin the Month of the Rosary, we start with Mary. The *Our Father* teaches us to ask God for what we need. The *Hail Mary* teaches us how to trust with hope. Mary said yes in humility, received God's grace, and loved her Son through joy and suffering. When we ask her to pray for us, we remember that death is only a veil, and heaven is our home.

Even the world senses this hope. In football, a "Hail Mary pass" is a last resort. For us, the Hail Mary is our first response — a prayer of hope that always leads us to Jesus.

Mary never stopped trusting Him. Each time we pray the Hail Mary, we share in that trust. In the weeks ahead, we'll look more closely at the words themselves and discover how they draw us deeper into Christ.


