A Note From Our Pastor V. Rev. Daniel Greenleaf

Dear Parishioners,

Thanksgiving is upon us, and as we take the time to give thanks to God and count our blessings, I want to thank God for my assignment here at Prince of Peace Parish. In a special way this year, I have to thank the parishioners who have been affected by the closure of Holy Cross and Our Lady of the Rosary Churches. There is no question that it was a painful and sad experience. However, the way parishioners took the time to understand and find a place within the wider parish spoke of their love for the Eucharist and the faith. I am so grateful for their understanding and their generosity during that time, because it made a very stressful situation easier to endure with the outpouring of love. I do pray that those affected feel at home and cared for as they adjust. Know that if there are still concerns, my door is always open to address them in the best way I can.

We are now looking to relocate the Sacred Heart statue that faced Lisbon Street to the Holy Family campus and have it face Sabattus Street. Below are two possible locations, and I superimposed the statue using the correct proportions. This is what it would look like 47 steps from the statue. Currently, Marc Gosselin is working with Bruce at Collette Monument to figure out what it would take to move it. The first estimate is \$15,000. I know it is a lot of money, and we are still looking to see if it will be as difficult as we first see. However, I have to believe that it will be important and beautiful to keep it as part of the parish. Unless things change, it will seem that it won't be done until spring, but there is still hope that we can do it before the ground freezes.

Advent starts next week, and it is time to pull out our wreaths and candles. The Evangelization Office is working hard to prepare materials and activities to bring faith into the home. Please consider what you might commit to as part of spiritual practices individually and as a family to prepare for Christmas. This is a beautiful time of year even as it gets colder and darker because there is something spiritual about it all as well. More to come. -- Fr. Daniel

Advent is a time to prepare.

In the rush of the world, the Church invites us into a season of waiting, watching, and readying our hearts. We are pleased to offer this small guide to help you and your family live life liturgically.

From leaving out shoes for St. Nicholas to baking special rolls for St. Lucia, these simple traditions help draw the beauty of Advent into our homes. Lighting a new Advent candle each week reminds us of the light of Christ who guides us—the same light that led the wise men—and awakens that quiet excitement that something spectacular is about to happen.

So put up the tree and gather as a family for a blessing—but hold off on decorating just yet. Let the wonder of the season prepare your home. And remember to bring your Baby Jesus to Bambinelli Sunday on December 14 for a special blessing, bringing the Church's prayer into your nativity scene at home. All of this shapes hearts ready to rejoice on Christmas Day.

This year we are also preparing something special for our children: Christmas Pageants at Holy Family and Holy Trinity, performed on Christmas Eve before the 4:00 PM Masses. We hope your family will join us in celebrating the story of Christ's birth through the voices and joy of our young parishioners.

Live Life Liturgically



A Blessing of The Manger Scene & Christmas Tree

This rite is especially appropriate for use when the blessing takes place in the home and is given by a family member.



All make the sign of the cross as the leader says: Our help is in the name of the Lord.
All reply: Who made heaven and earth.

One of those present reads scripture:

Brothers and sisters, listen to the words of the holy gospel according to Luke: In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. So all went to be enrolled, each to his own town. And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

The lay minister says the prayer with hands joined.

God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made manifest your love: when our need for a Savior was great you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary. To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love. Lord, bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise up our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Savior of all, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **R. Amen.**



All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Blessed be the name of the Lord.

All reply: Now and for ever.

One of those present reads a text of sacred Scripture:

Brothers and sisters, listen to the words of the apostle Paul to Titus (3:4-7):

But when the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life.

The leader says the prayer with hands joined.

Lord our God, we praise you for the light of creation: the sun, the moon, and the stars of the night. We praise you for the light of Israel: the Law, the prophets, and the wisdom of the Scriptures. We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son: he is Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Prince of Peace, who fills us with the wonder of your love.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we illumine this tree. May the light and cheer it gives be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts. May all who delight in this tree come to the knowledge and joy of salvation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **All: Amen**

Bring the Nativity to Life with your Children!

The Empty Manger:

Each child may have his own individual manger, or there may be one manger for the whole family. The idea is that when acts of service, sacrifice, or kindness are done in honor of Baby Jesus as a birthday present, the child receives a piece of straw to put into the manger. Then, on Christmas morning, Baby Jesus is placed in the manger. Encourage your children to make Jesus bed as comfortable as possible through their good deeds. In the process, explain Christs incomparable self-gift at Christmas that enables us to be part of Gods family.

Family: This is the event in which the entire family shares setting up the Christmas manger. Mary and Joseph should be far off traveling and their approach to Bethlehem can be adjusted daily. Older children can make life-size Nativity models, carve them, cut them out from cardboard, or set up pre-made figurines. The creative ideas are without limit. Make sure to place the Nativity scene where many

can admire the children's

efforts to give God glory.

Blessing of the Advent Wreath

All make the sign of cross as the leader says: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

All reply: Who made heaven and earth.

Leader: Listen to the words of the prophet Isaiah: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing, As they rejoice before you as at the harvest, as men make merry when dividing spoils. For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace. His dominion is vast and forever peaceful, From David's throne, and over his kingdom, which he confirms and sustains By judgment and justice, both now and forever.

The Leader says the prayer with hands joined: Lord God, your Church joyfully awaits the coming of its Savior, who enlightens our hearts and dispels the darkness of ignorance and sin. Pour forth your blessings upon us as we light the candles of this wreath; may their light reflect the splendor of Christ, who is Lord, for ever and ever.

R. Amen.

Make it Memorable

The Christ Candle

Use any large white candle and decorate it with symbols for Jesus — pieces of Christmas cards, holly, ribbon, or anything meaningful. Light it on Christmas Eve to welcome the Light of the World, and again throughout the year at Sunday dinner as a reminder of His presence in your home.

The Mary Candle

For the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, place a candle wrapped with a blue ribbon or veil near an image of Mary. Light it during meals to remember Mary's joyful "yes" and her eager expectation of Christ—and to encourage each member of the family to keep their own light of grace burning.

Advent Wreath Weekly Readings

First Week: Hope

Matthew 24:37-44 - Stay awake and be ready.

God of hope, we light this candle as we prepare for the coming of your Son. Awaken our hearts to you this Advent season, so that when Christ arrives, we are ready to receive him with all our hearts, all our minds, and all our strength. *Amen.* (Light one purple candle.)

Second Week: Peace

Matthew 3:1-12 - Prepare the way of the Lord.

God of peace, during this Advent season, keep us from getting caught up in the busyness and chaos of the world around us. Help us to slow down, so that we may find rest in the Prince of Peace, your son, Jesus Christ. As we prepare for his coming, make us instruments of your peace in our homes, in our schools, in our work and in our world. *Amen.* (Light two purple candles).

Third Week: Joy

Matthew 11:2-11 - Are you the one who is to come?

God of joy, it is in your love that we find lasting joy. Keep us from seeking happiness in things that will not last, for we brought nothing into this world and can take nothing out of it. Teach us instead to find joy in the gift of your Son, who came into this world with nothing, yet gave us everything. May his joy bubble up in our hearts and overflow to all we meet this Advent season. *Amen.* (Light two purple and one pink candle.)

Fourth Week: Love

Matthew 1:18-24 - The angel appears to Joseph.

God of love, you sent your Son, Jesus, to shine bright like the sun, lighting the way for all who walk in darkness. May the light of Christ's hope, peace, joy and love shine bright in us as we approach his coming, that we may be ready to welcome him on Christmas day and every day. *Amen.* (Light all four candles.)

1st Sunday of Advent - November 30

Bless your Advent wreath at home and light the first purple candle. This simple tradition sets the tone for the whole season and helps your family enter into Advent together.

St. Nicholas Day - December 6

On the evening of December 5, children place their shoes out and wake to small treats inside. Chocolate coins are the traditional gift. Families can also turn a chocolate Santa into St. Nicholas with simple craft supplies.

Lessons and Carols - December 7, Holy Family at 7:00 PM

A peaceful evening of Scripture and song. Nine readings trace the story of salvation, each followed by a carol. It's a beautiful way to prepare your heart for Christmas.

Immaculate Conception - December 8

A Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics. Celebrate by going to Mass and doing something joyful in honor of Our Lady, whose yes made room for Christ to enter the world.

Our Lady of Guadalupe - December 12

A wonderful day to enjoy Mexican food as a family and learn the story of St. Juan Diego. There are many short, kid-friendly videos online that bring the miracle to life.

St. Lucia Day - December 13

Families who wish can try making St. Lucia buns together. In some homes, a daughter brings breakfast wearing a simple white shirt, red sash, and a crown of battery-powered candles—a beautiful reminder of bringing light into darkness.

Bambinelli Sunday - December 14

A tradition begun by St. John Paul II. Bring the Baby Jesus from your home nativity to Mass on December 14 for a special blessing as we draw closer to Christmas.

The Great O Antiphons — December 17-23

Pray the antiphon of the day when you light your Advent wreath or gather as a family in the evening.

December 17 — O Wisdom

O Wisdom, coming forth from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from end to end and ordering all things with might and sweetness, come and teach us the way of prudence.

December 18 — O Lord of Israel

O Adonai and Leader of the house of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the flame of the burning bush and gave him the law on Sinai, come and redeem us with outstretched arm.

December 19 — O Root of Jesse

O Root of Jesse, standing as a sign among the peoples; before you kings shall shut their mouths, and to you the nations shall make their prayer. Come and deliver us, delay no longer.

December 20 — O Key of David

O Key of David and Sceptre of the house of Israel, you open and no one can shut; you shut and no one can open. Come and lead the prisoners from the prison house, those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

December 21 — O Rising Dawn

O Dayspring, Splendor of eternal light and Sun of justice, come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

December 22 — O King of the Nations

O King of the nations and their desire, the cornerstone who makes both one, come and save mankind, whom you formed from the dust.

December 23 — O Emmanuel

O Emmanuel, our King and Lawgiver, the hope of the nations and their Savior, come and save us, O Lord our God.






