A Note From Our Pastor V. Rev. Daniel Greenleaf

Dear Parishioners,

Lent is now underway, and I pray that the discipline you chose to take on for this season is opening you up to the presence of God. For many years, I chose things to do for Lent that focused on self-betterment. It was almost like a Catholic's second chance on a "New Year's resolution." Only late in my time did I understand that this season is first about our relationship with Christ. Our efforts should be to become more like Christ in the world, to remove vices that get in the way of uniting with him, and to grow in greater love for others as Jesus commanded us to do. In whatever you have chosen for Lent, may it truly help you to love God more and your neighbor as yourself.

I wanted to give you an update on the work of Fr. Gabriel and Fr. Peter at Central Maine Medical Center. The space for Pastoral Care at the hospital has shrunk, but Fr. Gabriel is still maintaining ministry there for Catholics through the Catholic Appeal. He is not an employee of the hospital, but he is funded through your annual donations to the Appeal. Even as he is allowed by the administration to be present in the hospital, he is not always aware of Catholics who are in the hospital and in need of anointing. Once he is aware of the pastoral need, he pays very close attention to them. This is why it is very important that you call the office at 777-1200, and we will connect you immediately with Fr. Gabriel. If it is after hours, there is a phone menu that will send you directly to his cell phone. Please tell your family members, especially if they are no longer practicing, that you want a priest called if you are unable to call yourself. This is a sad situation in our health care here in Lewiston, but we will do all we can to tend to your sacramental needs in the time of emergency. We are coming to finalizing the transaction that turns the cemeteries that the parish owns over to St. Peter's Cemetery. They have been managing Mount Hope and the Lisbon and Lisbon Falls Cemeteries for over five years. Starting March 1, the ownership of these cemeteries will transfer to the Diocese. I thank all the employees of St. Peter's Cemetery for the management of our properties over the last 5 years. It is my hope that they will be able to continue to give this ministry the great attention they have done in the past since the parish is not in a position to do so. — Peace, Fr. Daniel

Let Us Begin Again

Week One - Beginning Again

As we enter this Lenten season, let us take heart in the words of St. Francis, "Let us begin again..." They say it takes two weeks to form a new habit, and only a momentary lapse to revert. How important, then, is it to begin again?

So often we expect huge changes in how we eat, pray, or—ever dreaded—exercise, and become discouraged when we do not see drastic changes in ourselves. Yet for those who persevere, little by little there is a quiet growth, both in the physical and spiritual body.

I encourage you to stay close to the sacraments this Lent. Consider adding one daily Mass a week or incorporating a special devotion like the Stations of the Cross on Fridays. And should you stumble, dust yourself off and return—even when you accidentally have sausage on your Friday morning breakfast sandwich.

Lent is not a game of endurance, but a conduit to freedom: freedom from vice, freedom from sin, freedom from this world in hope of the next. So do not be afraid to begin again and again, because every step forward is a step with Christ.

Friday Abstinence from Meat— Required for Catholics 14 and older

- No meat (beef, pork, poultry)
- Fish, eggs, dairy, and plant-based foods are allowed

These rules also apply on Good Friday. All Fridays in Lent require abstinence from meat but not fasting.

- **Adoration** - Come spend time in our new adoration chapel at Holy Family. Spend an hour a week with Our Lord and sign up for a dedicated date with Jesus. Our list of open times changes daily; for an up-to-date list of openings, call Peg at 705-3750.
- **Daily Mass** - Consider adding even one daily Mass to your week. The parish offers a 5:30PM Mass Monday through Friday during Lent.
- **Confession** - Moves to 4:00 to accommodate the evening daily Mass. Or call the office for an appointment.
- **Small Faith Sharing**- Sign up online – Get connected! Read the Sunday Readings. Reflect as a group Grow. Pray. Commune. Study like the early Church & encounter the Living Word of God

Fasting

- **Pioneer Total Abstinence** - Commit to giving up alcohol for Holy Souls this Lent.
- **Fasting from Distraction** - Social Media, Netflix, Youtube, the list goes on and on.. Consider replacing with Prayer
- **Fasting from Noise** - Popular Music, podcasts, AirPods, oh my! Consider Silence this Lent and spend time listening for God!

Almsgiving

- **Giving Cross** - In each of our churches will be a giving Cross with tags. Simply purchase the items listed and help give back to our community!
- **Missionaries** - Can't travel to corners unknown to preach the good news? Consider donating to those who do!
- **Rice Bowls** - Catholic Relief Service Rice bowls will be available again for all your spare change this Lent.

Steps for Small Group

- 1) Begin with prayer and read the Sunday Gospel (Matthew 17: 1-9)
- 2) Pause for silent reflection
- 3) Share a word or phrase that struck you
- 4) Use the following questions for group discussion
- 5) Close with intercessory prayer and the *Our Father*

Opening Prayer

O God, who have commanded us to listen to your beloved Son, be pleased, we pray, to nourish us inwardly by your word, that, with spiritual sight made pure, we may rejoice to behold your glory. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Reflection & Questions

The Lord reveals His glory before chosen witnesses, and invests that bodily form, which He shares with the rest of mankind, with such splendor that His face shone like the

sun and His garments became white as snow. The principal aim of this Transfiguration was to remove the scandal of the Cross from the hearts of the disciples.”

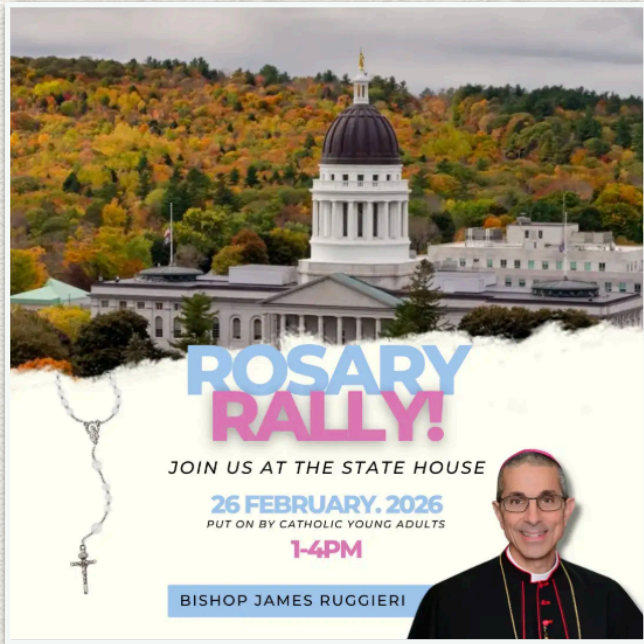
