SOCIAL ACTION OFFICE

Income Tax Help: Low-and moderate income working families may qualify for help from two federal tax benefits: Earned Income Credit (EIC) and the Child Tax Credit (CTC). This year eligible low-wage families in 2014 may be eligible for an EIC worth up to \$6,143. Workers raising children who earned less than about

\$48,000 in 2014 may be eligible for the EIC. Workers not raising children who earned less than about \$14,590 also can qualify. For more information about the Tax Credit go to www.eitcoutreach.org. Also, please encourage families to file their taxes through Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program (VITA). This offers free tax help for low-to-moderate income people who cannot prepare their own return.
