What a history we have at St. Mary Parish! The first Catholic Church in Sigourney was built in 1873 – that's 150 years ago! The second parish church was built in 1889 and was enlarged three times before it was replaced by the current church in 1953.

Our pride in what our Catholic ancestors built and left us inspires us to leave for the next generation a parish community for which they can feel equally blessed. The *Upon This Rock* Campaign gives us an avenue to honor our past while brightening the future of the parish.

Special features of the campaign will enable us to maximize the positive effects of our fundraising:

- First, we keep 20 percent of what we raise up to our goal, which is \$125,000 over the three-year pledge period.
- We will keep 80 percent of anything we raise beyond \$125,000.
- There are virtually no costs to the parish for the campaign. The Catholic Foundation for the Diocese of Davenport is paying those costs.

This is an opportunity to support our priests and seminarians while also undertaking important parish projects.


Repair or replace boiler pipe system

The increased pressure exposed the weakness of the aging boiler piping underneath the church, which has produced leaks since.
