Local Food Aid: The Federal Government shutdown continues and SNAP benefits to families living and working in poverty may not be available in November. Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a plea for lawmakers and the Administration to work in a bipartisan way to ensure funding of lifesaving programs and an end to the government shutdown. The full statement from the USCCB Office of Public Affairs can be found: here.

The impact could vary by community across our diocese. Bishop Walsh is asking our office to compile responses to the following questions: How does your parish assist with food aid in the greater community? Does the parish have a food pantry or contribute to a ministerial association pantry or other effort? Have there been community-wide conversations about additional efforts to address the potential loss of food resources for SNAP recipients? Are there specific plans your parish will undertake? Please send me your responses at ferris@davenportdiocese.org.

Monetary and food donations to local food pantries are recommended. And, as Archbishop Broglio's has modeled, write your senators and representative asking them to restore fund to SNAP food benefits. Hurricane Melissa – How You Can Help: Attached is the CRS Emergency Factsheet on Hurricane Melissa. This rare Category 5 hurricane, with sustained winds of 160 mph, heavy rainfall, and severe flooding, is expected to cause catastrophic damage in Jamaica and southern Haiti. It may be the strongest hurricane ever to strike Jamaica.

The Bishop of Mandeville and Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Montego Bay shared: "Many of the families in the Dioceses of Mandeville and Montego Bay are very poor and simply do not have the resources to build their homes to the special codes required for hurricanes and earthquakes."
