Save the Dates

At the kind invitation of Archbishop William Lori, the fifty-sixth national meeting of diocesan liturgical commissions will be held in Baltimore, Maryland from **September 30 to October 2, 2025.** The focus will be on the **Liturgy of the Hours**. Speakers will include Cardinal Arthur Roche, Prefect of the Dicastery for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments at the Vatican and Abbot Gregory Polan, OSB, who recently returned to the United States after completing his term as the tenth Abbot Primate of the Benedictine Order (2016-2024). His expertise as a Scripture scholar, linguist, and musician all contributed to his leadership of the monks of Conception Abbey and their work on The Abbey Psalm and Canticles – the psalms now approved for liturgical use in the United States.

LITURGICAL CALENDAR: NEXT MONTH

HOLY WEEK / TRIDUUM / EASTER 2025

- The Chrism Mass is scheduled for April 14, the Monday of Holy Week.
- The *Triduum* falls on Thursday, April 17 through Sunday, April 20 with the Easter Vigil falling on the night of Saturday, April 19. On that night, sunset is at ~7:45 pm. In order to insure sufficient darkness, at least 45 minutes (preferably one hour) should elapse after sunset before the Vigil may begin. Therefore, the earliest that the Vigil may begin is 8:30 pm CDT, preferably 8:45 pm.

THE MONTHS OF MAY AND JUNE

May is traditionally regarded as a Marian month. Please recall, however, that the Easter Season should remain the primary focus in both prayer and in the liturgical environment. Popular devotions are to take their life from the liturgy, not overshadow it.

Sunday, May 11, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, is also Mother's Day this year. As a secular holiday, it should in no way overshadow the primary celebration of the paschal mystery and Eastertime. The Book of Blessings (#1724ff) contains an appropriate rite for parish use. The same applies to Father's Day, June 15 (See BB #1729ff) – which is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

RITE OF ELECTION & CALL TO CONTINUING CONVERSION: MARCH 9, 2025

This year we will be celebrating the combined rites twice on the First Sunday of Lent (March 9, 2025). Bishop Walsh will preside at a bilingual (English and Spanish) liturgy at St. Mary's in Ottumwa. He has designated Fr. Thom Hennen to preside at the rites at the Cathedral. Both celebrations will begin at 2pm, and will be celebrated within Mass. We hope to be able to dismiss the catechumens (not the candidates) for a period of reflection. A reception will follow. Please don't forget that parishes ought to celebrate the Rite of Sending at Mass either Saturday evening or Sunday morning. "But in order that the liturgy may be able to produce its full effects, it is necessary that the faithful come to it with proper dispositions, that their minds should be attuned to their voices, and that they should cooperate with divine grace lest they receive it in vain. Pastors of souls must therefore realize that, when the liturgy is celebrated, something more is required than the mere observation of the laws governing valid and licit celebration; it is their duty also to ensure that the faithful take part fully aware of what they are doing, actively engaged in the rite, and enriched by its effects" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 11).

LITURGICAL CALENDAR

Optional Memorial of St. Teresa of Calcutta: September 5

On December 24, 2024, Pope Francis ordered the inscription of Saint Teresa of Calcutta, Virgin, into the General Roman Calendar. St. Teresa is celebrated each year as an Optional Memorial on September 5. The Holy See released the proper liturgical texts in Latin. Some of those texts were approved in English and Spanish by the USCCB in 2021 as a proposed inscription in the U.S. Proper Calendar, and their confirmation is still pending. Texts involving the Liturgy of the Hours must still be newly translated and approved before they can be implemented. A Recent Vatican Ruling On The Obligation To Attend Mass When A Holy Day Is Transferred

This comes to provide an update on the issue of the obligation to attend Mass when the DATE of a holyday has been transferred. You may recall that the issue arose in 2024 when the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception was transferred to Monday, December 9 because the Second Sunday of Advent (a day of higher rank) fell on December 8. Following the ruling last fall by the Dicastery for Legislative Texts, several requests for clarification were sent to the Dicastery for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments. Last week, Cardinal Arthur Roche, Prefect of the DDWDS issued a response (Prot.51/25). The full text of that response is available at:

KEY POINTS:

- The Dicastery responded to a specific question "[I]n the case of the transfer of a holyday of obligation, is one bound on the day *ad quem* to observe the obligation to attend Mass?"
- The response references the *Universal Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar* and its *Table of Liturgical Days According to Their Order of Precedence* (cf. nos. 59-60).
- Recognizing that this was a liturgical matter not expressly regulated by the Code of Canon Law (CIC), the Note
 acknowledges a "well-established practice" that the Dicastery had followed.
- The note concludes "Since this practice is not contrary to the canons of the CIC, it is to be considered liturgical law (cf. Canon 2) that in the event of the occasional transfer of a holyday of obligation, the obligation to attend Mass is not transferred to the day ad quem."

In other words, we go back to the way things used to be. When IC is transferred to December 9 (because December 8 falls on a Sunday), it is not a holy day of obligation. When December 8 falls on a Saturday or Monday, it is.
