CCHD Intern: Our 2025/2026 Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) intern is Athalia Munoz. Athalia is a student at the University of Iowa, majoring in sociology. Athalia is fluent in Spanish.

St. Vincent's Home Grants: The grant program derives from the St. Vincent Home orphanage and continues to serve children with more than an ordinary need through grants to organizations providing such services. CRS Update: House narrowly passed the first rescissions package (*H.R. 4 - Rescissions Act of 2025*) by a 214-212 vote. The bill rescinds \$1.1 billion for public broadcasting and \$8.3 billion in foreign assistance. While expected, this is still not the news we wanted to hear. The breakdown is as follows for the accounts we advocate on, with the % being the % reduced from FY25 spending bill (passed in March):

- Global Health Programs
 - o \$500M: Maternal and Child Health, HIV/AIDS, and Infectious Disease (13%)
 - o \$400M: PEPFAR (7%)
- \$800M: Migration and Refugee Assistance (25%)
- \$43M: Complex Crises Fund (78%)
- \$1.65B: Economic Support Funds (42%)
- \$2.5B Development Assistance (64%)
- \$496M: International Disaster Assistance (12%)

USCCB Justice and Peace Action Alert: Act to Support the Most Vulnerable.

In the coming weeks, the U.S. Senate will deliberate and vote on the One Big Beautiful Bill Act – the Fiscal Year 2025 reconciliation bill that will impact millions of people. As the bill currently stands, it will raise taxes on the working poor, cause millions to lose access to health care, result in families going hungry, and back out of <u>crucial investments in clean energy and jobs, air, and water</u>.

Archbishop Borys Gudziak, chairman of the USCCB Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, spoke out on the reconciliation bill in an <u>op-ed for OSV News</u>. He wrote: "As followers of Christ, we are called not only to serve the poor but to advocate for changing systems that create and perpetuate poverty. This bill, as it stands, falls significantly short in responding to the needs of our vulnerable sisters and brothers." Healthy Kids Iowa' Pilot Program: The U.S. Department of Agriculture Food and Nutrition Service has approved a demonstration project submitted by Iowa Health and Human Services for a summer food pilot program. Food banks will purchase healthy food options and deliver them to the selected sites. The program will allow eligible families to select \$40 of food each month from access points. Households with children aged 4-18 at 185% or below the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) are eligible. The program is an alternative to implementing the Summer EBT program using SNAP cards. Season of Creation: September 1 - October 4, 2025 "Peace with Creation." is the theme for this year's season of creation. This year the World Day of Migrants and Refugees will not be held on the customary last Sunday of September, but will instead be celebrated on October 4 and 5.

The 2025 CCHD Collection: will be held on November 15-16. The Catholic Campaign for Human Development is dedicated to breaking the cycle of poverty, by funding community programs. More than 46 million people in the United States live in poverty today. CCHD supports those living in poverty across the country by funding programs that empower local communities to address their challenges. The diocese retains 25% of the proceeds to fight poverty within our diocese.
