We hear in Matthew's gospel this weekend the last words Jesus gave to his disciples as he left this earth, his great commission: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until

the end of the age" (Matt 28:19-20). He was speaking to the 11 disciples. These apostles went forth to the whole world. We still have a successor of one of the Apostles in our Diocese, his name is Bishop John Folda. We are all given a great commission to share the life of Christ to the whole world. That is why we are in Grafton thousands of miles and a few thousand years from that moment in today's gospel, but we are still baptizing and teaching others to observe all that Jesus "commanded." We are still planning to give our children an opportunity to attend the Young Disciples summer camp, but the location has changed because there was a cancellation of the team that was coming to Grafton and Park River. To the parents, grandparents and families of the Class of 2017,

During the months of May and June, high school graduates are busy preparing for their new adventure in colleges or universities of their choice. They will also be facing the challenges of a new lifestyle, new friends, and budgeting their time. College life can be a precarious test to the faith of these young people. Studies have shown that a large percentage of Catholic students going away to non-Catholic colleges will no longer be practicing Catholics by the time they graduate. Also, most college/university application forms no longer allow incoming freshmen to designate their religion, which has created additional obstacles in the formation of the faith of young people attending college away from home.

However, there is something you can do to help your young graduate stay true to the faith you have so lovingly shared with them. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has been working with Serra USA, an organization that promotes and nurtures vocations to the priesthood and religious life, to help college-bound students connect with the Catholic campus ministry at the college or university they are attending. It's called The Newman Connection, designed to get incoming freshmen in contact with their local campus ministry before their lives are consumed with the many demands of college life. There is an information form on the reverse side of this letter that you can fill out and send to The Newman Connection, and they will contact your student's Catholic campus ministry, who will in turn reach out to them with an invitation to take part at Mass, religious study and social events that promote and uphold their Catholic faith. You may mail the form to the address provided, or fill out an online form found at www.newmanconnection.com.

I urge you to take the time to talk to your college-bound family members about the importance of staying connected to God and their faith, and send their contact information to The Newman Connection. With your support, and with the help of local campus ministries, we can reverse the alarming trend of our young people falling away from their faith at a time when faith should be the foundation of a successful college career. May God bless each and every one of you, and especially our young graduates.
