"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field..." Jesus tells so many of his "life lessons" in the form of a parable. Last week we heard the parable of the PASTOR sower. It seemed that we were encouraged in that parable to be good receptive soil for the Word of God so that we can produce

fruit that will last an eternity. What we did not want to be was shallow with no staying power, hard like a path so that seed does not penetrate, and be soil that had weeds in us. The weeds of greed and worldly anxiety that could be translated into a failure to trust. This week Jesus seems to put us humans into two categories at the end of the world: either wheat or weeds. because in His explanation He says, "the good seed (is) the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one." It is impossible for us to be the judges who take out the evil ones because we will invariably kill the good ones along with the evil ones. We have to allow God and his angels to do the separation at the end of time. It is good news to hear Jesus say, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man." If we never give up on our relationship with Jesus, even though we do sinful things at times, we can end up as the good seed, but it does mean repentance over and over again. There is much process to happen yet, but Jesus definitely does seem to agree that we will have what theologians say is a "fundamental option." What direction do we chose to claim in the end: facing God as God's servants or facing away, choosing not to serve, becoming "children of the evil one."
