"What should we do?"



As we heard last week in the Gospel of Luke chapter three, John was "proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." Now, as the story continues, we hear one group after another asking, "What should we do?" This could be a quick summary of conversion: opening oneself up for change and listening to another on what we should do differently, words that may come from the Holy Spirit. John is not shy in telling people what needs to happen, "Whoever

has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise" (Luke 3:11). Are you not glad he was only talking about cloaks and food and not about houses and cars? We can all breath a sigh of relief, right? This gospel makes me think about Matthew 25 when Jesus said, "whatever you do to the least of my brothers or sisters you do it for me". Saint Mother Theresa of Calcutta was known to repeat a saying, "Live simply so others can simply live." It is not that you have to go without food, shelter, clothing, but how much is necessary. We all have to listen to the Holy Spirit in this struggle. John promised that Jesus was going to anoint us with the Holy Spirit and fire. If we have the Holy Spirit, then we should open ourselves to that Spirit's guidance. Oh Holy Spirit what should I do? Should I go to Haiti? Should I teach religion? Should I volunteer at the Food Pantry? Should I go to the Chris Stefanick talk on March 20th? Should I go to Mass every Sunday even if I have to miss sporting events? Should I help after the Christmas Eve dinner cleanup since St. Johns is always so short on that end after a great meal and everybody just wants to leave? What should I do, Holy Spirit? If we accept it, we are also baptized with fire. Fire changes things radically, meaning baptized with passionate drive and not lukewarm and indifferent attitudes.
