Last week, I briefly discussed the first element of creating a covenant, which was the swearing of the Oath, which involved invoking God as witness and uttering the blessing and curse. Once again, a covenant is the permanent bonding of two persons in a relationship of love that forms an indissoluble (it cannot be dissolved or broken) unity or

oneness. Four specific things present in creating a covenant as revealed in Scripture are Oath, Exchange, Blood Sacrifice and Meal.

The second element is the Exchange. After swearing the oath, the fathers of the families would exchange something that expresses their unity and equality. Most of the time, covenants were made between families of higher social or economic standing with those of a lower standing or vice versa. Through the covenantal bonding, the families would be united and thus, become equal.

The item normally exchanged was a belt, as it was a symbol of social status as well as the sign of the ability to make war. It is also an item that encompasses the person wearing it. Often we hear in Scripture, particularly in the Old Testament through some of the utterances of the Prophets and repeated in the Psalms, God would tell a person to "gird their loins." This was an action in preparation for battle. The soldier would take a cloth that acts as an undergarment and basically wrap things up so he could have greater freedom of movement while wearing a sword. The last thing worn in "girding" oneself was the belt around the waist that held everything together.

In offering the belt to each other, the fathers on behalf of their families were not only forming a bond of peace but that of equality. Essentially, they were saying, "what is yours is mine and what is mine is yours. We belong to one another and are at peace." Hence, the belt signifies visually the bond of peace and equality formed by the covenant.

We find this covenantal belt spoken of by Isaiah in reference to Jesus the Redeemer: "righteousness will be the belt about his loins, and faithfulness the belt about his waist" (11:5). This spiritual belt that clothes Christ is given to us in the New and Eternal Covenant through the action of the Holy Spirit, Who according to Jesus in the Gospel of John is the Spirit of Truth and Peace. Also, we find St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians encouraging us when preparing to do battle with the forces of evil to "gird your loins with truth" (6:14).

The Truth is not a concept, but a Divine Person: Jesus Christ. Jesus speaks to this reality when He says, "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (Jn 14:6), and when confronted by Pontius Pilate, He states, "For this I have been born, and for this I have come into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice" (Jn 18:37). We who live in the new covenant must live in the truth.

When a couple gets married in the Church, their exchange of rings is the symbolic belt of their covenant, which testifies to the faithfulness of their oath and the truth that they are bonded to each other. More next week.
