A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

The covenant is the most prominent theme of Lent as God the Father accomplishes His greatest act of love for us in the sacrifice of His Son, Jesus Christ. We have briefly discussed the first two elements of covenant making: Oath and Exchange. Now we approach the

third, which is Blood Sacrifice.

According to God, blood is the sign of life. He says to Noah in the book of Genesis, "For your own lifeblood, too, I will demand an accounting: from every animal I will demand it, and from man in regard to his fellow man I will demand an accounting for human life" (9:5). Blood is not only the actual gift of life (if we have no blood then we die) but it is also the symbol of a person's life. All life is consecrated to God, Who is the author of life. Hence, the blood of a person is the physical sign of the life given to them by God.

After the exchange of belts, the animal for sacrifice would be prepared for slaughter. The fathers of the two families making the covenant would take a bull, goat, lamb or birds and split them in two. The blood would be offered to God and the two men together would walk through the animal halves swearing the oath and uttering the blessing and curse. When God makes a covenant with Abraham, we find Him doing this. "He (Abraham) brought him all these, split them in two, and placed each half opposite the other...As the sun was about to set, a trance fell upon Abram, and a deep, terrifying darkness enveloped him... When the sun had set there appeared a smoking brazier (a bowl used to burn incense) and a flaming torch, which passed between those pieces. It was on that occasion that the Lord made a covenant with Abram..." (Gn 15:10,12,17-18).

The offering of lifeblood takes place through death. This is because death entered into the world through the sin of our first parents. The first blood sacrifice as a deliberate act of worship was made by Adam and Eve's son Abel, who was a shepherd. Abel gave God the best of his flock and hence, the lamb's blood signified Abel's genuine love for God. Cain's sacrifice was not accepted since he did not offer the best of his produce. Cain then decided to sacrifice his brother in a fit of rage. We find God speaking to Cain after murdering Abel: "Your brother's blood cries out to me from the soil!" (Gn 4:10). Even blood spilled through sin has attached to it the covenantal symbol of life. Blood sacrifice is either offered to God in worship or to the devil through sin.

We see this in a particular sense in the covenant between husband and wife. Blood is spilled through the consummation of the marital act. This is why God wants men and women to be virgins before they get married, because their sexual union is the blood sacrifice of their covenant. The man is covered in the blood of his wife when the two become one flesh. I will continue on the topic of Blood Sacrifice next week.
